

The feeding of the five thousand (and more) by the seaside is certainly the most famous of picnics. The miracle of the loaves reminds us of the earlier miracle of the wine at Cana. It is tragic that folks who are alone, homebound, or in care centers are forsaken in their later years and ignored by family and friends.

This might be a wake-up call for us. If you have a few extra minutes in your week, or if you are looking for something beneficial to do with your children, grandchildren, nieces or nephews consider visiting this group of people.

You don't need to study visiting; you need to do visiting. It is the gift that gives back.






