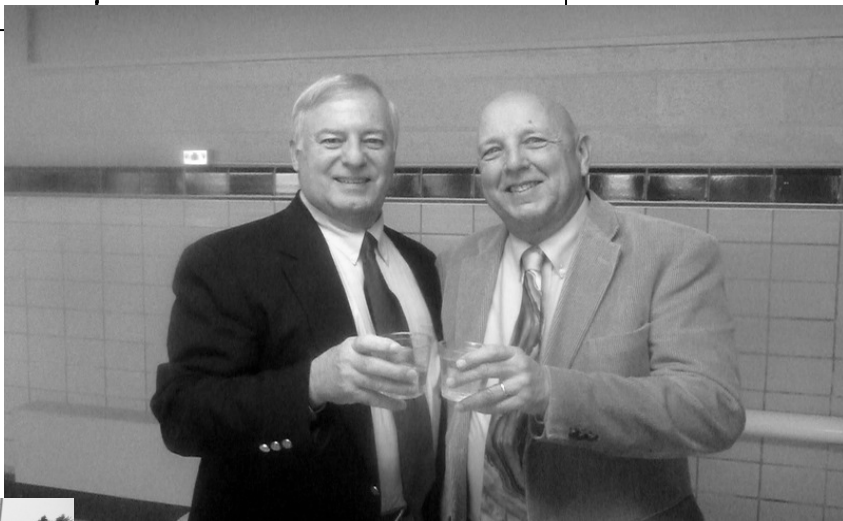

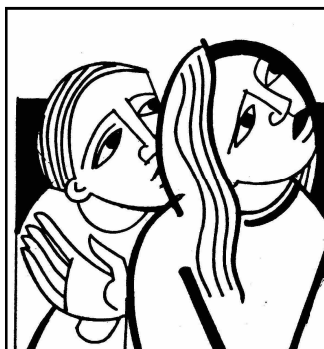

with the help of God,

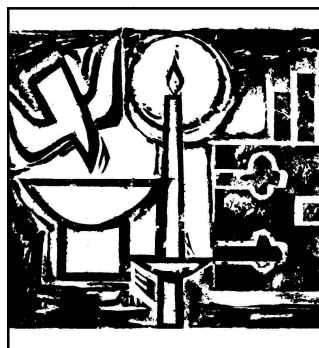

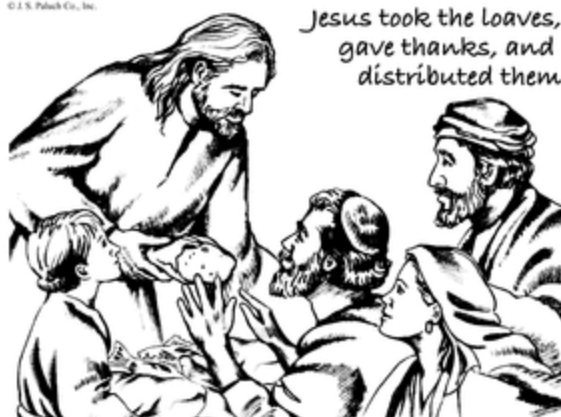

### **TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**

The feeding of the five thousand (and more) by the seaside is certainly the most famous of picnics. The miracle of the loaves reminds us of the earlier miracle of the wine at Cana. Like the Cana miracle, this one begins with human initiative as the small child responds to the hunger of the crowd by offering a seemingly meager gift. What could be more appropriate for deep summer than a Gospel account of a joyful picnic with Jesus and the generosity of a child at the center? The coming month of August has always been a time for delight in the bounty of the earth, for picnics by the sea, dinner under the stars, for porch and rooftop, for parks and beaches, and enjoying the best of local crops. August’s festivals of Transfiguration and Assumption have long given Christians the best of excuses for feasting on the abundance of summer: corn, tomatoes, pesto, bowls of fresh fruit. Picnics are a sign of the welcome table of God: always room for one more, always plenty to share, always a place of laughter and story-telling and always speaking to us of our deepest longings. For others, it’s because their relatives are scattered coast to coast, from New York to Los Angeles. Some have family who are unable to travel. And hardest of all, some have family who don’t want to see them because the ravages of time and memory impairments have changed their relationship.

It is tragic that folks who are alone, homebound, or in care centers are forsaken in their later years and ignored by family and friends.

This might be a wake-up call for us. If you have a few extra minutes in your week, or if you are looking for something beneficial to do with your children, grandchildren, nieces or nephews consider visiting this group of people.

You don’t need to study visiting; you need to do visiting. It is the gift that gives back.

This collection supports the presence of our 5 Saint Louis Priest Missionaries in Bolivia. Bolivia continues to suffer from a severe shortage of native Priests. In St. Louis we have roughly 1 Priest for each 2,000 Catholics. In Bolivia, the ration is 1 Priest for each 25,000 Catholics. Our Priest Missionaries are helping to train native Priests in Bolivia. In addition, they proclaim the Gospel, celebrate the sacraments, and offer pastoral care to their parishioners. Due to great poverty in Bolivia, many people are living in conditions we can barely imagine—without access to clean water or sanitation or food.

Our Missionaries can only do what we make possible through our prayers and sacrifices. Please be generous in the collection for the Latin America Apostolate of the Archdiocese of Saint Louis on Sunday, August 5, 2012.
