

#### Called to be Light of the World

**LAST FEBRUARY ARCHBISHOP CARLSON** - after a year of Consultation - announced **ten priorities** for the advancement of the mission of the Archdiocese of St. Louis. A priority that he is taking personal responsibility for is to -

facilitate proactive Deanery-based planning to encourage strategic plans and collaboration among parishes and schools.

Since our pastoral reorganization in 2005 the pastors and parishes of our Deanery have been giving regular attention to the **significant pastoral priorities** identified at that time. These are also important concerns of the Archbishop.

We are called to be a strong presence in our local community by -

- Foster the life of Christ for adults and families
- through education in faith, celebrating the sacraments, and ministry to others
  - Assisting the elderly to remain active members of our parish
  - **Preparing our children and youth** through Catholic education to be members of the Church and good citizens
    - *Educating parish members* about the evil of racism and by eliminating every expression and form of racism
  - **Recommitting ourselves to remaining** in our local community and making it strong
- Cultivating a preferential love of the poor with new enthusiasm and energy

This week the Archbishop will meet with the priests and deacons of our Deanery - the first of ten meetings he will have through May of next year. He's asked us to consider these **questions** - questions that we will be using to **evaluate** the mission and priorities of our Deanery over the past seven years:

- How can pastors/parish leaders work together more effectively to achieve growth and vitality in the pastoral/educational mission we all share?
- How can the Archbishop and Archdiocese assist your Deanery in meeting it planning needs?
- How have previous planning efforts in your Deanery been successful or unsuccessful?
- What are the most significant planning issues facing parishes and schools in your Deanery?
- What can the Archbishop/Archdiocese do to help you address the specific challenges/opportunities facing parishes and schools in your Deanery?
- What questions or concerns do you have regarding Deanery planning specifically and the Alive in Christ! Initiative in general?

Last spring we began to identify **issues and ideas** that we wanted to talk about with the Archbishop and could use in the on-going discussion within and among the parishes concerning the future of our Deanery.

- How will the shortage of priests and the on-going demographic changes affect staffing our parishes and parish ministry?
- Can we utilize priests and parish ministers across parish boundaries?
- How can we effectively engage parish leaders and parishioners in the process of identifying needs and goals as well as achieve greater unity among parishes?

I believe that the work of the past tem years gives us much to be thankful for and good reason for hope. The Sprit of Christ is truly alive in North County!



#### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The roots of this week's feast of the Assumption can be traced back at least to the fifth century, when it is noted in the Armenian lectionary. Celebrated in Jerusalem, the feast in honor of the *Theotokos*, the Mother of God, became the principal feast of Mary throughout the Christian world. The place of Celebration was at the tomb of Mary in Gethsemane and was therefore known as the "Dormition of Mary." In some cultures this feast is celebrated today with a resting statue of Mary, much like a wake service of modern times. The liturgy of this feast provides images of "the place of your rest" in Psalm 132, and reverence for the Ark of the Covenant that held the signs of the Promise. Like that Ark, Mary is for us the ark of the Savior, the one who bore the Son of God. When the doctrine of the Assumption was defined in 1950 the Gospel reading for the feast was changed to include the verses of Mary's song, the Magnificat. The scripture readings for both the vigil Mass and the Mass of the day speak to us of life after death as well as the path to be followed in order to reach it. The key to this promised immortality is found as we take to heart the words of the vigil's Gospel, "Blessed are those who hear the word of God and observe it."

CARE in Our Community is a free medical outreach program through the Washington University School of Medicine. Our program focuses on the bone health of individuals 65 and older. We have a portable bone x-ray machine that scans your forearm to see if you are at risk for osteoporosis (weak bones). You will get your results the same day. The x-ray strength is equal to about 10 minutes in the sun so no protective gear is necessary. Bone scans take 10 minutes per person and a CARE team member will be with you throughout the test. APPOINTMENTS ARE RECOMMENDED. Please call Joan at 741-1271 or Janice a 314-660-7334 to make an appointment. **Men and women are invited**.


