

ALL PARISH LEADERS AND **ORGANIZATION** should add this event to their calendars, avoid scheduling other activities during this week, and do all they can to encourage the attendance and participation of their members in the most important event in the faith life of our community. Celebrating Our Catholic Contemplative Tradition

The Eucharist: Our Time for "Mystical Thinking" IT IS NOT UNCOMMON THESE DAYS - at concerts, before a class or public meeting begins, even at church - for those who have come together to be instructed to "silence" or "turn off" their cell phone and other electronic devices. Even without being told we know this is the courteous thing to do, respectful of others and of the gathering's intended purpose. I hope we've all experienced the richness and satisfaction of "disconnecting" for the sake of giving our undivided, undistracted attention to an activity or person of value or importance to us.

Today this is a **critically important instruction** as John the Evangelist takes us deeper into the meaning of the Eucharist. He writes of Jesus addressing every believer, if you want to "have life" and "live forever", then "eat my flesh" and "drink my blood" and "feed on me". To get what he wants us to know we must move away from "literal thinking" to "mystical thinking".

Making this transition requires that we "disconnect" as much as possible from our everyday world of activities and responsibilities. I even know people who don't wear watches to church or put them in their pocket or purse. At Mass, time is suppose to "stand still". Caught up in the Eucharist we can even "loose track of time". Mass requires "mystical thinking", a "contemplative attitude".

"O God, blessed is your Son, present in our midst when we are **gathered** by his love, and when, as once for the disciples, so now for us, he opens the scriptures and breaks the bread.' Eucharistic Prayer: The Church on the Path of Unity

Try to cultivate the habit of "disconnecting" even before you leave home. And teach it to your children, family, and friends. Once at church, sit for a moment and make yourself comfortable. Quiet your mind from distractions and your heart from its troubles. Pay attention only to your breathing slowly, calmly. Desire and speak only the name "Jesus". Let yourself be overcome by God's love for you.

These are not complicated things to do. They are, however, the best and possibly the only way to prepare yourself for Mass. If you do - and some already know this - you will have no trouble understanding that Jesus is the "Bread of Life." In words from the Book of Proverbs today, "Let whoever is simple turn in here".

"Holy Father, grant by the power of the Spirit of your love that we may be **counted** now and until the day of eternity among the members of your Son, in whose body and blood we have **communion**." Eucharistic Prayer: The Church on the Path of Unity

Today I encourage you to read the article in today's bulletin on how we as Catholics can most effectively participate in the political process of our nation. Exercising our political freedoms is an important way for us to evangelize our culture and to share our values within American society. Please also note and share with others the Guidelines on the Distribution of Political *Literature and Materials* published as a part of this article. As we move toward our general elections these *Guidelines* should clarify any confusion or misunderstanding about what is permitted or not on church property.





TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

This week we observe another Marian celebration, the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Its Original date was May 31, when it was instituted by Pius XII in 1954, but it was eventually moved to August 22 so that its close relationship with the Assumption might be made clear. Mary's queenship is multi-dimensional: she reigns gloriously in heaven as queen and mother; she is the queen who intercedes; she is the sign of the Church in its future glory. Of course, the traditions surrounding the Blessed Mother's queenship extend much further back than the establishment of this feast. In the eighth century St. John Damascene could write. "When she became Mother of the Creator, she truly became Oueen of every creature." According to Jewish tradition, the mother of the king was accorded a seat of honor at the right of the king. With Jesus' royal heritage as a descendant and member of the house of David, Mary quite naturally takes her proper place as the queen mother. Pius XII simply recalled these traditions and gave us a day to remind us of how we can direct our prayers to Mary, our Queen.

POLITICS AND OUR PARISH

I most certainly would encourage our parish members to be active in this year's political process by becoming informed concerning the issues, by considering prayerfully your choices – ones that will not only benefit you personally but also support the common good – and by responsibly exercising your right to vote in this year's election.

All political activity on parish property must conform with these "Guidelines on the Distribution of Political Literature and Materials". These guidelines respect the clear and specific Federal restrictions governing the participation of religious and non-profit organizations in the political process. Furthermore, they both invite and challenge candidates and political organizations to engage our parish members in conversation and open debate of the issues in a way that is civil and informative for all concerned.

The "leafleting" of cars or the use of lawn signs does not actively engage our community in the political process, and often are a nuisance or an offense to parish members. **EVERY PARISH MEMBER SHOULD KNOW THAT PERMISSION IS NEVER GIVEN FOR ANY OF THE ABOVE ACTIVITIES**. When these things do occur we will notify such persons or groups of our policy. Every parish member should do the same.

You may want to save the following "Guidelines" for your future reference or to pass them on to candidates or political groups for their information.

Guidelines on the Distribution of Political Literature and Materials

The First Amendment to the United States Constitution guarantees the right of all citizens to be involved in the political processes of our nation. Furthermore, it is a moral obligation of all persons – individuals and communities – to be attentive to how their decisions affect other people. We have the right and responsibility to be involved in the political conversations and elections that determine our forms of government and system of laws.

Historically the Catholic Church in the United States has conscientiously refused to participate in partisan politics, particularly the endorsement of individual political parties or candidates. At the same time, the Church has felt a keen responsibility to educate its members as well as the larger community regarding the moral and ethical dimensions of public policy.

Therefore —

Permission will not be given to any individual or group to distribute or place partisan political literature and/or materials on our church property, in particular, it is not permitted to place leaflets on vehicles or lawn signs on parish property which is considered only a "quasi-public area". Since our parish Community Center is a polling place these activities may take place only on election day near the entrances of the polling station.

Individuals and groups wishing to publicly state their positions on particular issues, and engage the members of our community in discussing such issues, may be invited to do so according to the interest of the parish and the availability of time and space. Organizations and/or individuals should contact our pastor, Father Mike Henning, to request consideration.






