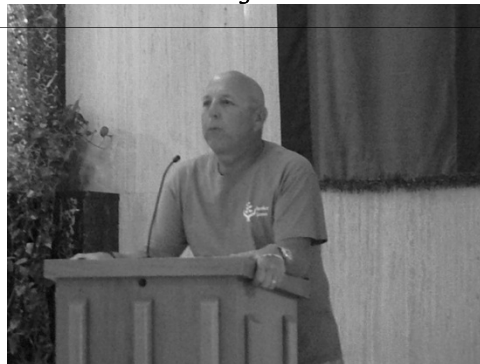

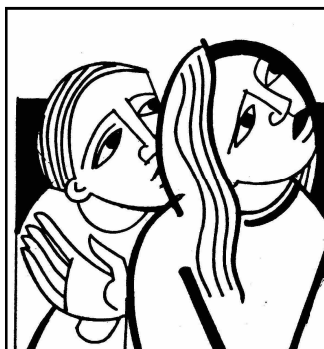

with the help of God,

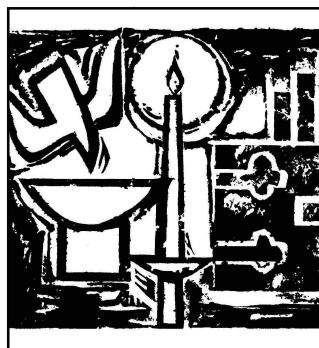

TODAY'S GOSPEL PROCLAIMS THROUGH JESUS that our bodies are **sacraments** and human touch can be an occasion of **healing grace** for the hope and holiness of people everywhere. Salvation has come to us in this way and is our daily ministry. This is the most fundamental belief of Christians. The **incarnation** - that Jesus, Son of God, is fully and completely human. And, the **involvement** of God in human history, every aspect of human life. What better way to encounter Christ than in our own humanity and daily human activities! In doing so, we make Christ "**believable**" and each of our own days can be filled with "**astonishment**".

Today's Gospel suggests one way of remembering and cultivating this. Jesus took the man "**away from the crowd**" to heal him. Many times what keeps us from encountering Jesus is the "crowd" - our overly busy lives or being too caught up in what everyone else is saying or doing. Television, advertising and shopping, cell phones and computers, empty conversations fill our days and occupy our attention. St. Mark urges us to become more aware of whatever keeps us from encountering Jesus - our own deafness or speech impediments. A time or place away from others each day helps us to experience our own "**being opened**" and uninhibited about sharing our faith with others. It also sets free the **sacramental power** of our lives which is always good news for others.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Turning the calendar page to September marks a new beginning in the lives of many who live by the academic year. Traditionally the start of the school year in the United States, this month can bring to mind the many calendars by which we live. There are fiscal years, academic years, television seasons, sports seasons—the list seems endless. Added to all of these is, of course, the liturgical year. A Christian of the first century or so would have been hard-pressed to understand what we mean by a feast day or holy day. That person would have understood Sunday as the primary feast day, and Easter as the primary Sunday. It was only over time that the Church began to set aside particular days and seasons to commemorate certain events or highlight selected mysteries of the faith. What has evolved over the centuries is a "map" of our faith, written on the days and seasons of the year. Some have observed that one will absorb all the major teachings of the Church in the course of a single year of Sundays if one is attentive. What a wonderful way to get Christianity "into our bones!" And best of all, there are no grades!

WHAT'S YOUR RISK FOR GALLSTONES?

HAVING GALLSTONE IS A VERY COMMON PROBLEM. It is more common in women and in people over 40 years of age. After meals, the gallbladder contracts to release bile into the intestines to help in the digestive process. Gallstones occur when one of the substances that make up the bile becomes too concentrated and forms hard stones. If the stone blocks the exit from the gallbladder the organ will become inflamed. This is the problem. Risk factors include:

- Family history of gallstones
- Taking medications to lower cholesterol levels
- Having diabetes
- Rapid, large loss of weight
- Being overweight
- Eating a diet rich in fat and cholesterol without enough fiber.

Symptoms may be:

- Abdominal pain at night in the upper part of the abdomen
- Back pain, particularly between the shoulders
- Pain beneath the right shoulder blade
- Fever and chills
- Vomiting and nausea
- Yellowing of the skin and whites of eyes
- Bowel movements the color of clay
- Pain that strikes after eating a fatty meal
- Indigestion, bloating and gas

If you have any of these symptoms it is possible that gallstones are to blame. It is important to see your doctor for an exam and start treatment.

POLITICS AND OUR PARISH

I most certainly would encourage our parish members to **be active in this year's political process** by **becoming informed** concerning the issues, by **considering prayerfully your choices** – ones that will not only benefit you personally but also support the common good – and by **responsibly exercising your right to vote** in this year's election.

All political activity on parish property must conform with these **“Guidelines on the Distribution of Political Literature and Materials”**. These guidelines respect the clear and specific Federal restrictions governing the participation of religious and non-profit organizations in the political process. Furthermore, they both **invite and challenge candidates and political organizations to engage our parish members in conversation and open debate of the issues** in a way that is civil and informative for all concerned.

The “leafleting” of cars or the use of lawn signs does not actively engage our community in the political process, and often are a nuisance or an offense to parish members. **EVERY PARISH MEMBER SHOULD KNOW THAT PERMISSION IS NEVER GIVEN FOR ANY OF THE ABOVE ACTIVITIES.** When these things do occur we will notify such persons or groups of our policy. Every parish member should do the same.

You may want to save the following **“Guidelines”** for your future reference or to pass them on to candidates or political groups for their information.

Guidelines on the Distribution of Political Literature and Materials

The First Amendment to the United States Constitution guarantees the right of all citizens to be involved in the political processes of our nation. Furthermore, it is a moral obligation of all persons – individuals and communities – to be attentive to how their decisions affect other people. We have the right and responsibility to be involved in the political conversations and elections that determine our forms of government and system of laws.

Historically the Catholic Church in the United States has conscientiously refused to participate in partisan politics, particularly the endorsement of individual political parties or candidates. At the same time, the Church has felt a keen responsibility to educate its members as well as the larger community regarding the moral and ethical dimensions of public policy.

Therefore —

Permission will not be given to any individual or group to distribute or place partisan political literature and/or materials on our church property, in particular, it is not permitted to place leaflets on vehicles or lawn signs on parish property which is considered only a “quasi-public area”. *Since our parish Community Center is a polling place these activities may take place only on election day near the entrances of the polling station.*

Individuals and groups wishing to publicly state their positions on particular issues, and engage the members of our community in discussing such issues, may be invited to do so according to the interest of the parish and the availability of time and space. Organizations and/or individuals should contact our pastor, Father Mike Henning, to request consideration.
