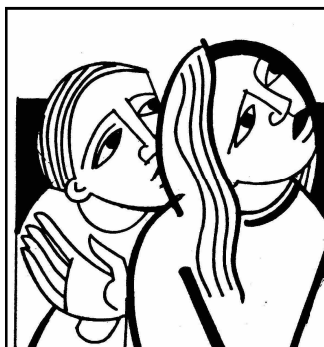

with the help of God,

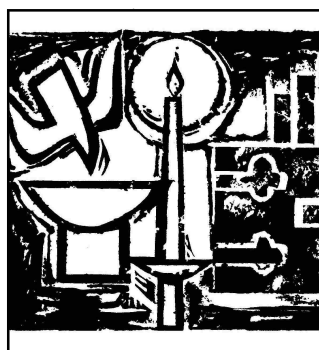

THE GREATEST SPIRITUAL BENEFITS of our Parish Mission in February - for you and for our parish - depend on your **prayers** now, your **participation** as we prepare, and your **presence** (February 23rd - 28th). Catholicism is the largest Christian denomination in the United States. Inactive Catholic comprise the second largest group of Christians! We are now being called by our Church to evangelize our fellow Catholics so that our Church might be the most effective sign of the love of Christ in our world today. From experience we know that inactive Catholics are most likely to come to a Mission if they are **personally invited** by a friend or acquaintance they know. **Friends bring friends back to Church!** We will be working very closely with Our Lady of the Rosary Parish in the planning and organization of this Mission. By working together and by the grace of God I know that our Catholic presence in this part of North County will be alive and long lasting.

BISHOP EDWARD RICE WILL CELEBRATE Mass with us on Sunday, **November 11th at 10:30am**. During Mass we will also celebrate the **Sacrament of Confirmation** for the children from our school and from other religious education programs serving our parish families. Continue to pray for these children and their families during these final weeks of preparation for this sacrament. For this celebration we will be welcoming a number of visiting relatives and friends of our own parish members as well as parishioners from Our Lady of the Rosary Parish. Please do all that you can to receive them warmly and be as helpful as possible. May our good spirit of hospitality and active participation in the Mass strengthen and enrich our faith. May we go forth from this celebration all the more sure of the blessing we are in the lives of so many others - whether we know it or not!

PASTORAL LEADERSHIP IS A KEY ELEMENT to the future of our parish. This past week our Pastoral Council Core Team met with 17 men and women who were invited to consider serving on our Parish Pastoral Council. This Council is being established in order to -

- ▶ keep our parish vibrant, and
- ▶ promote human development as a work of evangelization.

This Council will share my authority for assessing and responding to the pastoral needs of our community. Their responsibilities will include -

- ▶ forging new partnerships with other organizations sharing our mission,
- ▶ making appropriate policies for our parish, and
- ▶ overseeing parish ministries.

During the next few weeks please pray for each of these candidates as they continue to discern what God may be asking them to do. From among those who are willing to serve as parish leaders on this Council, the Core Team will select the 8 members of our Pastoral Council. Pray also for our Core Team to be guided by the Spirit. They will meet for this selection process on Monday, October 29th.

EVERY VOCATION IS A CALL TO BECOME HOLY in a particular state of life. God's plan for our lives is not forced upon us. It's an invitation, a calling to which we have the freedom to respond. Most young men and women enter the priesthood or religious life because someone they know invited them to consider the possibility of doing so. Who do you know that might be a good priest or vowed religious sister/brother? When have you or will you deliver the invitation? Our Church depends on your doing so!

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

In the eyes of many, the papacy is a peculiar institution. Still bedecked with some of the regalia of medieval princes, contemporary popes have worked to define their role in ways that give them influence over the world both within and outside the Church. The trappings of royalty, never really a good fit for the successors of Peter, could render a pope distant and irrelevant. On the other hand, the tendency of many to think of the pope as if he were the CEO of a modern corporation is also inaccurate. St. Gregory the Great, himself a pope, first called the pope “the servant of the servants of God.” He is “first among equals” among other bishops, who by tradition exercise significant authority within their own dioceses, not depending on the pope’s authority. This arrangement often puzzles those accustomed to a top-to-bottom “chain of command.” History has seen popes of many styles, but most strive to live up to Gregory’s definition. Perhaps today’s Gospel puts it all into the best perspective: “Whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all.” Pray for the pope this week.

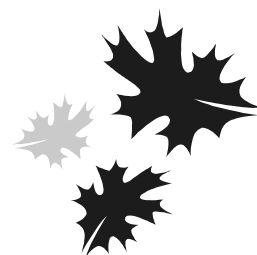

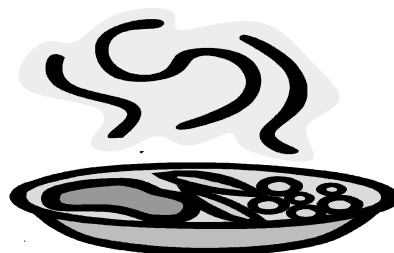
