


It will be friendly, if I am. Its pews will be filled. if I help fill them. It will do great work, Permanent Deacon It will make generous gifts to causes.

THIS YEAR OF FAITH calls each of us to a personal encounter with Jesus Christ. Do you want a deeper faith? Greater confidence in the Gospel message? If this is what you want, come and celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation with others who want this too! Our Advent Penance Service will take place on Tuesday, December 4th, 7:00pm at Our Lady of the Rosary Parish. This evening a small group of our children will make their First Confession. I promise you that you will be encouraged by their faith and the faith of their families. You will also be a great support for them as they see you practicing your faith and using this sacrament as a way to grow in faith and become more like Christ. Everyone is welcome and encouraged to attend. Even if it has been many years. There's no wrong way to go to confession. The peace you will find is priceless!

AS YOU CONSIDER THE QUESTIONS BELOW remember that your faith is not merely a private act. Reintroducing the Church to those who are not actively involved and may have forgotten their faith requires that we work together as one body. In the United States inactive Catholics comprise the second largest group of Christians! "Evangelization" means helping other people come to know Jesus Christ and His Church, or to come back to Jesus and the Church.

The reasons for us to embrace **our call to evangelization** are many. **Jesus has commanded us to proclaim the Gospel** and he is living within us, desiring to reach out through us. *Many have drifted away because no one cared enough to encourage them back.* If we're going to have parishes, schools, and vocations in the future, evangelization is a must. But the **most important reason** of all is that through us God offers our family and friends, neighbors and co-workers a means of salvation.

All of us are **Christians under construction**. Within the fragile, imperfect "earthen vessel" of our lives we hold a treasure. So, it is absolutely important that we look for opportunities to invite others to join or re-join us in a Church that is under construction. 

HOW IS YOUR BALANCE?

Can you guess what the most frequent cause of falls is among older people? Surprising, it is not slips or trips. It is incorrect weight shifting (imbalance), which causes one to fall down. Injuries and hospitalizations caused from falling down account for 90% of hip and wrist fractures in those 65 years of age and older.

In one study that was conducted over the course of 3 years, researchers found that 41% of the time, people were unable to get in a stable, final position while rising or couldn't stop their forward momentum after taking a misstep. The other surprising factor is that falls were just as likely to occur when someone was lowering themselves into a seated position or while standing (either due to being bumped or losing balance while initiating an activity such as turning or reaching) - even though previous studies have suggested most falls occur only while people are walking.

Research has found that slips are very rare, when it comes to older adults falling. Trips, on the other hand, are the second most common cause of a fall. Most often, people simply stumbled or one foot collided with the other, especially when turning. Sometimes, the obstacle is a chair leg or table leg.

To decrease the risk of falls, one must take precautions to lower that risk. For instance, a number of people who fall are regular users of assist devices, they just did not have it near them at the time of the fall. Many older adults have arthritis of the lower joints in which the pain and discomfort cause an unsteady gait. Improving your balance, flexibility and strength can occur though resistance-training exercises.

Be environmentally safe as well. Have proper lighting and sturdy handrails. Have handrails where ever there are stairs in your home. Avoid throw rugs.

Three essential abilities related to falls are:

- Have the ability to safely move about without losing your balance.
- Have the ability to recover balance by taking a step or grasping a nearby object.
- Have the ability to protect yourself and land safely.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Despite the fact that the feast of Christ the King was established less than a century ago, it has already undergone a shift in focus. When Pope Pius XI established this feast in 1925, nationalism and Fascism were on the rise. The pope intended that it be a "vehicle for spiritual teaching," one that would recognize the ultimate authority of Christ over all political and social scheming. The last Sunday of October was chosen as the date for the feast because of its proximity to the feast of All Saints, those men and women who bore witness to Christ's reign in so many different ways. The calendar reforms of 1969 moved the feast to the last Sunday of the liturgical year. There, in the context of November's focus on the end times, Christ's second coming at the end of all time is highlighted. The threefold cycle of readings also expands our imaginations in regard to this feast. In this year's Gospel, Christ stands before Pilate, whose own power blinds him to the truth of the Lord's kingdom. In a world where oppression still holds sway over too many people, this feast is somehow still as timely as when Pope Pius XI first established it.


