



To the extent that we do, we know what Luke means when he tells us to "stand erect". We know that the "power and great glory of God" is with us, that our redemption is at hand.

This is how we know and proclaim to others that the "Reign of God" is now - and forever.



NORTHEAST DEANERY CATHOLIC ELEMENTARY SCHOOL ENROLLMENT INCREASES FOR SECOND YEAR

Enrollment Data Demonstrates Stability and Diversity

According to the Archdiocese Office of Pastoral Planning, elementary school enrollment has risen in the Northeast Deanery for the second year, the only area in the Archdiocese to experience an enrollment increase for two years in a row. The eight schools that belong to the Federation of Catholic Schools have a combined total enrollment of 2,064 for the 2012-13 school year, compared with 2,051 in 2011-12, and 2,036 in 2010-11. Kindergarten enrollment is at 252, up from 236 last year. This is the first time since the 2005 reorganization of the Northeast Deanery that the number of students enrolled in Kindergarten (252) is greater than the number of 8th grade students set to graduate this year (241).

Preschool enrollment is also on the rise, with nearly 350 3- and 4-year olds receiving their first school experience at a Federation Catholic school. This number is more than double than the 150 preschoolers who were enrolled at a deanery school in 2005-06.

The Federation has been proactive in maintaining alignment with the Archbishop's Mission Advancement initiative for Catholic education. The Alive in Christ Scholarship program provided assistance for 95 new students in Kindergarten through 4th grade to enroll in a Federation school. In addition, 93 current students in the deanery remained enrolled thanks to the additional financial help from the program.

"These are all positive signs for Catholic education in our community, and evidence that our commitment to working together, which has been a priority since 2005, is producing good results," said Father Mike Henning, pastor of Holy Name of Jesus parish and pastoral representative for the Federation. "We will continue to build on this success by focusing on more opportunities to collectively grow not only enrollment, but also Catholic identity and academic excellence while embracing diversity and sharing resources."

LEARNING ABOUT THE SAINTS

November began with the celebration of All Saints Day, and students throughout the deanery spent time focused on learning more about the lives of the Saints in some creative ways.

Several classes, including the 5th grade students at St. Rose Philippine Duchesne and Blessed Teresa of Calcutta, researched and studied about the history of their favorite Saints and then brought them to "life" in a "Saints Wax Museum," where students dressed as their chosen Saint and shared a little about his/her life and importance to the Church with their classmates and others in attendance.

At St. Angela Merici, students decorated bowling pins as favorite Saints and placed them in the parish for the enjoyment of parishioners and visitors. Below are a few photos of the bowling pin saints:





ALIVE in CHRIST! MISSION MOMENTS:

The 4th and 5th Grade students at Sacred Heart School have completed their Cans for Christ Project. For the past four weeks, the students have been earning food items by doing extra chores around their homes or neighborhoods. Our goal was to send 335 items to TEAM to help feed our hungry brothers and sisters in North County. We happily exceeded our goal! Monsignor Mark Ullrich recently blessed 467 items before they were sent to the food pantry. All of the food needed to be a gift from the students themselves, not from their parents. Raking leaves, cleaning the garage, and extra babysitting became labors of love and care for others, as students were paid with cans of soup or boxes of macaroni. Living the Gospel message to feed the hungry and care for the poor became a reality for these young Christians.

AVOID DECORATION DISASTERS

A beautifully decorated tree or glowing candles certainly give a warm holiday feeling inside. But if left unguarded, either can turn into a holiday disaster. Keep your holidays festive and safe by following this advice.

TREES: When purchasing an artificial tree, look for the label "Fire Resistant." When purchasing a live tree, check for freshness.

LIGHTS: Use only lights that have been tested for safety.

Check each set of lights, new or old, for broken or cracked sockets, frayed or bare wires, and throw out damaged sets.

Turn off all indoor holiday lights before you go to bed or leave home.

DECORATIONS: Use only noncombustible materials to trim a tree. In homes with small children, take care to avoid decorations that are sharp or breakable, keep trimmings out of the reach of children.

CANDLES: Extinguish candles before you leave the room or go to sleep at night. Burn candles inside a 1 foot circle of safety, away from anything that can burn.

Above all, we need never forget the reason for all of the festivitiesso be sure to take a few minutes each day....To joyfully wait for Christ's coming.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Occasionally, someone raises a surprised complaint that while Christmas arrives on Santa's sleigh at the Macy's parade on Thanksgiving Day, the Church doesn't catch on too fast. They may even say that Advent is a new-fangled idea. Not so. To trace its beginnings, we have to go back to the fourth or fifth century in France (then Gaul), when Epiphany was the favored day, next to Easter, for baptism. The old pagan structures of Rome were collapsing then, and many people sought to be baptized. Since adults always prepared for baptism by fasting, folks counted back a few weeks for a kind of retreat. Before too long, bishops were advising everyone to attend church frequently beginning on December 17. Soon, artists were imagining ways of expressing the Advent mystery, and in Italy this gave rise to beautiful mosaics of empty thrones awaiting the arrival of the Lord of all creation.

Advent as we know it develops on two separate tracks: the first having to do with our spiritual preparation for celebrating the Christmas feast, and the second having to do with the way this is organized and expressed in the liturgical readings and prayers every day of the season.

Don't forget to pick up a container for our Soup Stew and Chili ministry. Containers are located at the entrances of the church. Frozen containers are to be returned on the weekend of December 15-16!

Winter Outreach is an organization that provides shelter to homeless men and women on evenings where the temperature drops to 20 degrees or less. Outreach teams search areas that homeless individuals are known to frequent and offer blankets, coffee and snacks and offer to shuttle them to shelters.

The shelter sites are a network of churches and other organizations that provide a warm hospitable environment including a warm meal and a cot with blankets. They rise in the morning at 6 or 7 am and given a bus ticket for transportation to the location of their choosing. I have personally tried to find shelter for folks at risk and there are folks who have died as result of exposure to the elements. I know you will agree that even one is too much, No matter what the circumstances or reasons no one should have to end their days alone and freezing on the streets, The Outreach Team and shelters are in need of stocking caps, warm gloves, socks and blankets primarily large and extra large in size. If you have any items you would like to donate there are receptacles at each of the entrances to church where you can drop these items. Monetary donations are most welcome for purchasing bus tickets. This effort was started to save lives of those vulnerable to exposure from extreme temperatures in winter weather and operate from December 1st through February 28th. 


