

is composed of people like me.



The Landscape of Salvation

WHEN IT COMES TO PERSONAL WEAKNESS or corporate failure our human tendency is to live in denial or with the assumption that it's someone else's responsibility. "Straightening" things out can be hard work and often takes time and energy that we would rather spend doing other things with other people. The two great saints of Advent - John the Baptist and Mary, Mother of Jesus - remind us that we are all called to move in the direction of "right relationships" with God and one another. They show us that staying focused on how the Word of God dwells among us and forms us will always lead us someplace good - to personal happiness and to joyful hope as a community.

We've all heard or used expressions such as: "set the record straight", "get this straight", or "look me straight in the eye". Each phrase essentially has something to do with being direct, correct, truthful, upright or emphatic. Backed up by the promise of God's faithful and generous love, John clearly reminds us of the importance of dealing with "unevenness" in our lives. Individually and together we must address our moodiness, dishonesty, haughtiness, self-deception, and vulgarities. John's repentance challenges us to remember our human dignity. We are created in the image and likeness of God. All our behaviors, all our relationships - with God, self, and others - can easily reflect (or not) the much desired presence and power of God in our world. Our genuine commitment to building "right relationships" enables us to "see the salvation of God", to recreate the "landscape" of salvation.

In all human suffering we are joined by one who experiences and carries that suffering with us; hence 'con-solatio' is present in all suffering, the consolation of God's compassionate love

THROUGH YOUR GENEROSITY - and that of many others across the Archdiocese - several years ago we conducted a very successful capital campaign for the needs of Kenrick-Glennon Seminary. This campaign addressed the significant needs of repairing and updating the seminary building's infrastructure; expanding the administrative, academic, and recreational facilities; making the campus more accessible and secure; reducing on-going operational expenses; and building an endowment to insure continued resources for future generations. All this work is now nearing completion.

Archbishop Carlson has asked me to express his gratitude to you for your pledged support of this campaign, for your continuing prayers for our seminarians and priests, and for your commitment to the work of the Church in St. Louis. An open house is being planned at the seminary early next year on March 2nd and March 16th to which everyone will be invited.

Currently there are 108 students enrolled in our 8 year seminary program which can now accommodate up to 141 students. Next weekend one of the seminarians will be with us to briefly talk more about all this and to personally express the gratitude of the seminary community for our support.



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In a decree made public on October 5, 2012 our Holy Father, Pope Benedict XVI, announced that he would grant to the faithful Plenary Indulgence throughout this Year of Faith. The Year of Faith began on October 11, 2012 and will conclude on the Feast of Christ the King, November 24, 2013.

The decree states: "During the Year of Faith Plenary Indulgence for the temporal punishment of sins, imparted by the mercy of God and applicable also to the souls of deceased faithful, may be obtained by all faithful who, truly penitent, take Sacramental Confession and the Eucharist and pray in accordance with the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff."

Here in the Archdiocese of St. Louis I am happy to announce that the attached list includes sites where one may visit and obtain a Plenary Indulgence:

For your further reflection I would ask you to consider the following general remarks on Indulgences from *Gift of the Indulgence* which summarizes the usual conditions given in the Church's law:

- 1) To gain Indulgences, whether Plenary or Partial, it is necessary that the faithful be in the state of grace at least at the time the Indulgence work is completed.
- 2) A Plenary Indulgence can be gained only once a day. In order to obtain it, the faithful must, in addition to being in the state of grace:
 - a) have the interior disposition of complete detachment from sin, even venial sin;
 - b) have sacramentally confessed their sins;
 - c) receive the Holy Eucharist (it is certainly better to receive it while participating in Holy Mass, but for the Indulgence only Holy Communion is required);
 - d) pray for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff.
- 3) Indulgences can always be applied either to oneself or to the souls of the deceased, but they cannot be applied to other persons living on earth.

The intention of this Year of Faith is for the faithful to grow spiritually in their faith and to seriously recommit themselves to living wholly the life of grace gifted to us through our Lord's passion, death and resurrection.

I encourage all the faithful not to let this opportunity be in vain to experience anew the boundless love of God. I also, encourage all parishes to assist their parishioners throughout the course of this coming Year of Faith by offering opportunities for the Eucharist, Sacrament of Penance, missions, workshops on the documents of Vatican II and the Catechism, and pilgrimages to the above designated sites to name just a few.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Look around most Catholic churches, and you will discover an image of John the Baptist, often in the old baptistery, or in a window near where the font is or was located. He has two feast days in the calendar: one commemorating his birth, and the other his death. There are only three nativities in our calendar: for Jesus, for Mary, and for the Baptist. John's birthday is reckoned according to the schedule given in Luke's Gospel of the angel's announcement to Mary. The angel tells her that her cousin Elizabeth is in the sixth month of pregnancy, and so Mary hastens to help her. Reckoning Christmas as December 25, we count backwards nine months to March 25 for the Feast of the Annunciation. Then we count forward three months to June 24 for John the Baptist's birth. Halfway to Christmas, his nativity gives ample reason for rejoicing in the summer, and his symbols of fire and water are used playfully in bonfires and dives into the sea. Even at the polar opposite of Christmas in the calendar, the energy of Christ's birth in the Incarnation provides cause for rejoicing.

Winter Outreach is an organization that provides shelter to homeless men and women on evenings where the temperature drops to 20 degrees or less. Outreach teams search areas that homeless individuals are known to frequent and offer blankets, coffee and snacks and offer to shuttle them to shelters.

The shelter sites are a network of churches and other organizations that provide a warm hospitable environment including a warm meal and a cot with blankets. They rise in the morning at 6 or 7 am and given a bus ticket for transportation to the location of their choosing. I have personally tried to find shelter for folks at risk and there are folks who have died as result of exposure to the elements. I know you will agree that even one is too much, No matter what the circumstances or reasons no one should have to end their days alone and freezing on the streets, The Outreach Team and shelters are in need of stocking caps, warm gloves, socks and blankets primarily large and extra large in size. If you have any items you would like to donate there are receptacles at each of the entrances to church where you can drop these items. Monetary donations are most welcome for purchasing bus tickets. This effort was started to save lives of those vulnerable to exposure from extreme temperatures in winter weather and operate from December 1st through February 28th. If you have an interest in volunteering time or have any questions please contact Bill Krenn at 314-574-8946. An annual event is held commemorating those who have died due to exposure. It is held on December 23rd at 4 pm at Centenary Church at 16th and Olive in downtown Saint Louis, It is an experience that you cannot forget. There are typically 15-20 people remembered in this event that we knew or could count. There are more.
