



is composed of people like me.


I help make it what it is.

Celebrating All That Is Good In Our Culture**Wear Your Beauty Brilliantly**

GOD'S ATTITUDE ABOUT CHRISTMAS might be described this way: "*I can't wait to get to Earth!*" Some days I spend a lot of time trying to appreciate God's great desire to become human and to be a part of our human histories. This is especially true on those days when life is difficult or messy, when the changes and challenges of life seem impossible. What a mystery! Who would want to be a part of all this! It makes me wonder, what am I missing? What does God see that I'm not aware of?

When I think and pray about all this I keep coming to the same conclusion. There must be more goodness, more beauty in my life and our world than I'm ordinarily able to see. Truly my imperfections and the unredeemed parts of our world deserve attention, at times even serious undivided effort. But, from God the Creator's point of view there is an "original goodness" to every thing and every person. In an effort to describe God's excitement about our world and being here with us, the prophet Isaiah recently proclaimed us to be "delightful" and "beloved" in the eyes of God!

Therefore, I would propose that among other things Christmas invites us to consider an attitude adjustment concerning our culture. There is more goodness in our lives and our world than often meets the eye.

The Littlest Angel Christmas story captures this quite well. This four year old cherub is "*most miserable, thoroughly unhappy, and utterly dejected*" in heaven! It's not where he wants to be and he's finding all the expected adjustments quite difficult. Then he's befriended by the Understanding Angel who listens well to his complaints and arguments on how heaven might be improved! "*There's a box. I left it under my bed back home. If only I could have that?*" "*You shall have it*", promises the Understanding Angel.

To the shock of more heavenly angels and near shame of the Littlest Angel, this small, rough, unsightly box is chosen by God as the gift that "*pleases Me most*". Of this odd collection of butterfly wings and robin's eggs, river rocks and the leather strap of a favorite dog's collar, God says, "*These are the things My Son too will know and love and cherish, and then, regretful, will leave behind Him when his task is done.*" The story ends reminding us all that this extraordinary collection of Earthly things can and does and will always lead our human family closer to God - present in every person, place, and event of our lives.





TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Today's feast is new as feasts go, and it sets us this year in a very modern crisis. Amid conflicting schedules and commitments, a young man, testing the limits, has strayed from his parents and gone off to the big city. Mary and Joseph search frantically, only to find the child Jesus in the temple, conversing with the elders and scholars of the law, who are amazed at his wisdom.

In the time of Jesus, the temple was the religious center of Jewish ritual. Outside of Jerusalem, people gathered in the synagogues, centers of learning, for daily prayer and study. Still, everyone longed to journey to the temple to participate in the offerings, and to fulfill certain obligations of the law that could only be done there. On this feast, we catch a glimpse of the family of Jesus: parents dealing with the normal stresses of raising a child, and yet completely grounded in the ways of faith and tradition.

There has always been an appreciation in Christianity for the value of pilgrimage—the journey to holy places that is a symbol of our life's journey to God, and a sense of connection to important events in our family history. During the Christmas season, many of us undertake pilgrimages to the family homestead for festival meals, to the parishes where we were formed in the faith, or perhaps even to a beautiful manger scene or festival of lights. There are few better days than this in our calendar for spending time with the family, especially on a short pilgrimage to a favorite place. Just make sure that no one gets left behind!
