

Celebrating God's Call to Grow in Holiness

Faithful Christian Journeying

TO WHAT ENDS DO WE GO when we really want something? We might refinance our home to help pay college tuition. We might stick to a rigorous diet and exercise program to reach an ideal weight. The magi travels a great distance, an unmarked road, to find a newborn King. How far do we go to find him?

Over the past few weeks the issue of personal and public security has once again been dominant in our national news. The debate of public leaders and within may communities has focused on profiles and patterns of behavior; on prevention, rights, and responsibilities. Through it all once again something simple and obvious caught my attention. A role we are all capable of playing that has as much to do with "sanctity" as it does with "security".

"If you see something, say something."

Officially this is the slogan or key directive of the Department of Homeland Security. However, it might also be a principle for every believer and faith community. A discipline that not only keeps us safe, but brings us closer to God - sooner than later. Too often it seems when we see something unusual or out of the ordinary, we say nothing to anyone. Whether it's our personal well-being; the welfare of friends, neighbors, or community; or a matter of national security, we say nothing! Our silence may then be followed by regret that we had not said something sooner or changed our course.

The unusual may at times be a threat, but more often I think it's a sign of the mystery of God's goodness, beauty, and truth. Faithful Christians know they are immersed in a world of mystery. When they "see" it, they must "say something". A discipline of proclaiming that "God is with us", sanctifies us. It gives birth to the charity of helping and healing, the hope courage and vision, and the faith that can be our deepest security. Let's pray for the daily desire to be on this journey of faith together.

What's Your Next Step

GROWING IN HOLINESS is all about becoming a well integrated person, a whole person - mind, heart, body, and soul. You can be sure that any positive change in one or several of these areas of your life will bring you closer to God. Along the way someone is going to follow you - whether you intend it or not, whether you know it or not.

Use the following **questions** to think about the **positive growth** you might need or want to cultivate in your life this year. In fairness to yourself and to God, before you consider these questions keep these **two principles** in mind.

Pay Attention - What's really going on in your life is where you will find God, and God calling you to grow.

Be Non-Judgmental - Stay focused on your goodness and God's promising love for you, not your limitations, failures, or weaknesses.

Am I a hopeful person? Do I have a daily awareness of the beauty of the world around me and the goodness of the people I'm with?

How does the life, death, and rising of Jesus continue to change my life?

What greater love am I to have for others?

How do I publicly share my faith with others? Do I let the Spirit of Christ use me to make our Church a powerful instrument of God's love?

Are Gospel values more evident in my life, my family, my parish than they were last year?

Am I using my brain for a change? What have I learned this year that has changed my life? The lives of others around me?



Meet the Candidates for School Superintendent

Community members of the Riverview Gardens School District are invited to participate in a community forum with the district's top two candidates for superintendent of schools on **Wednesday, Jan. 9, 2013, 6:00 PM, at Westview Middle School, 1950 Nemrich Dr.**

Much of the education energy in our Catholic community should and does go to parochial schools. But the health of our parish is closely tied to the vigor of our **public** schools. Riverview Gardens schools serve the largest group of residents of our parish. The district educates many of our children and employs many of our adult parishioners. Our member Dr. Mark Tranel serves on the district's state-appointed interim board of education.

The two finalists for the position of superintendent are Shelley Mills-Walker, Ed.D., assistant superintendent of student services in the Ritenour School District, and Scott Spurgeon, Ed.D., former superintendent of schools in the Belleville Township High School District #201.

Dr. Brent Underwood, a consultant with the Missouri School Boards Association (MSBA) Superintendent Search Services, will moderate the community forum. **Members of the public will have the opportunity to ask questions** by signing up when they arrive, and will be called upon in their order on the sign-in sheet.

The district hired MSBA to conduct the superintendent search, which began this fall. In October, Riverview Gardens' staff, parents and community members participated in focus groups to define the attributes they wanted in a future superintendent. Sixteen candidates applied for the position. Riverview Gardens' Special Administrative Board plans to make its final decision by the end of January. The new superintendent will start work on July 1, 2013.

PAIN.....EVERYBODY GETS IT, NO-BODY LIKES IT

10 WAYS TO HELP YOU DESCRIBE PAIN

Many times when we are in pain, it can be difficult to talk about and not easy to describe. If we are caring for a loved one or an elderly neighbor, it is even more difficult for them to talk about pain. "It really hurts" usually isn't enough for the doctor to figure out what is happening. Pain is subjective. Some people feel it more intensely or in different ways than others. Many elderly believe they are always suppose to have some sort of pain, so many don't complain. To help communicate our pain or our loved ones pain more effectively to the doctor, use this check list to keep a record of the reported pain or discomfort. Recording the answers to each of the questions will help the doctor or medical professional treat the pain more successfully.

1. Where is the pain located? (Have them point to the exact spot if possible.)
2. Can you describe the pain? Is it a sharp stab? A dull ache? Does it feel more like the cramp of a stomachache or the throb of a headache?
3. How would you rate the intensity of the pain on a scale of 1 (least) to 10 (most)?
4. What makes the pain feel better?
5. What makes the pain feel worse?
6. How quickly or slowly does the pain come on? Is it sudden or gradual?
7. How long does the pain last? Does it stay until you take medication, or does it go away on its own, even for a short while?
8. If the pain is intermittent, how often does it occur? (If necessary, clock it or help your loved one clock it. Write down the time it starts and when it stops.)
9. In what ways does the pain interfere with normal daily activities? Can you sleep? Can you eat? Can you walk?
10. Can you describe exactly how well your medication works? How quickly does it relieve the pain? Does it make the pain go away entirely, or just partially? How long does it last?

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Monday of this week is Christmas Day in Russia and in much of the Orthodox world. This curious difference in schedule has a lot to do with how calendars have been developed and changed over the years. In the year 45 B.C. Julius Ceasar gave the empire his Julian Calendar, with the winter solstice on January 6. This put an end to a system in which officials called “pontiffs” were able to tweak the calendar by adding extra days in as needed. He invented two new months at that time, December and January; and in order to correct the mess the pontiffs had made, forced a year of 445 days on the empire in what he named “The Last Year of Confusion.” The new months varied in number of days according to a complex schedule, but the calendar was still off by nearly twelve minutes a year, and lost a full day every 130 years.

Pope Gregory XIII reformed the calendar in 1583, but not everyone appreciated his efforts. England held out for two hundred years. The year 1700 was a leap year in England, but not in France; they were eleven days apart! George Washington was really born on February 11; when the Gregorian calendar was finally adopted in the English colonies shortly before the Revolution, he had to move his birthday to February 22. Now the calendars are thirteen days apart, which accounts for Russia’s Julian calendar Christmas. And Caesar thought he had brought confusion to an end!
