



with the help of God,



Baptismal Identity - An Ambassador for the Reign of God

DURING THE RITE OF BAPTISM you were anointed for the first time with the Oil of Chrism. The prayer for this anointing reads: *"As Christ was anointed priest, prophet, and king so may you live always as a member of Christ's Body, sharing everlasting life."* This anointing honors and strengthens every baptized person for **the three most essential roles** they will play in the life and mission of the Church.

Every baptized person is called to be holy and to make the world holy. This **priestly role** focuses on developing a relationship with God and with Jesus Christ. This relationship is more communal than individual. It's all about helping each other experience the reign of God now - and forever.

The **prophetic role** is fundamentally about honesty - seeing things as they really are. We must not be afraid to think about - and talk with each other about - how we can be better or different in our daily lives. Real honesty is built on and inspired by hope - the God-like attitude of not giving up on the world. Prophets are devoted to bringing the best out of every person and every situation.

Wisdom, good judgment, and courage are characteristic of the **kingly role** played by every baptized person. Individually and as a faith community we must know how blessed and gifted we are and we must decide how to live. Our choices reveal our willingness to let God direct our lives as well as our courage which inspires others to seek the reign of God with us.

Every baptized person is anointed to be priest, prophet, and king. It's a responsibility we have concerning ourselves and towards each other.

This week we more actively begin to prepare for our Parish Mission - a time for renewing our faith and our baptismal identity. If a member of our Mission Committee asks for your help, I encourage you to say "Yes" in every way possible. Our goal is to make sure every Catholic living in our parish knows about our Mission and is invited at least 6 times to attend. This will only happen if you are a part of making it come true.

Join me in prayer that no worry or hurt, no anger or fear, will keep anyone away. May God help us all to know that faith makes a difference. And may God help us to help each other grow in faith. Our Church will always be a "community under construction". The mystery of imperfect people chosen by God to be the saving sign of Christ's love!

TRY THESE PICK-UP, CLEAN-UP WORKOUTS

With so much to do both at home and for your health, it seems you must double up just to keep up. But daily exercise and home chores are perfect examples of repetitive tasks that can be joined together to benefit your health.

HERE'S HOW:

Break a task down into its physical moves and think of ways to add to them. Try raising and lowering the laundry basket as you carry it upstairs...becoming mindful of keeping housework motions uniform and controlled as you develop a rhythm...stepping in time to upbeat music or dance tunes.

- Loading/unloading dishwasher; wiping counters. Step in pace, alternate in a series of eight back kicks, leg lifts and ankle flexes; hold stretches of calf muscles.
- Picking up, tidying up. Try controlled knee bends and raises with each object; alternate with arm extensions and toe touches.
- Mopping, sweeping, vacuuming. Watch posture, switch hand positions and shift leg weight after several sts of repetition; move in a methodical pattern.

These ideas will get you started and help you come up with your own healthy combinations. Burning more calories helps you feel extra-energized as the chores get done.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Merry Christmas! Share that cheerful greeting with some folks today. They may wonder if you have had any Elvis sightings lately, attended Star Trekkie conventions, or were Cleopatra in a previous life-time. Despite the skeptics, today is solidly within the Christmas season. In fact, in some strands of the Christian tradition it represents the clearest manifestation of the mystery of the Incarnation. On Christmas Day, for example, the Gospel reading is the Prologue of John's Gospel, which reveals the glory of Christ shining through our humanity precisely in his baptism.

At any rate, this is an ancient feast, celebrated first in Egypt sixteen centuries ago. More than most other ancient people, the Egyptians understood the life-giving properties of water. On this day, they drew water from the Nile, so central in the history of their people, and reserved it in honor. Many other places copied the custom, so that St. John Chrysostom wrote of people in Antioch gathering at midnight to collect flowing water into vessels they brought from home since "today there is a blessing on the water." At home for dinner tonight, decorate the table with beautiful bowls of water and white candles, toast one another with goblets of sparkling water, and light a Christmas candle in the window one last time.
