

Faith Making A Difference

THE "WEDDING AT CANA" GOSPEL STORY is quite familiar to most Christians. A story many can tell by heart! And I must confess that I have my own helpful and comfortable interpretations of Jesus' first miracle (changing water into wine) according to John the Evangelist. Again this week, however, I was reminded of things I've forgotten or never knew. In preparing for this weekend's homily I re-discovered a warning from one of my teachers not to make too much of Mary's participation in this miracle.

She seems to misunderstand her son's ministry, believing his special powers are to be used for the benefit of his family. John's Jesus tells her, "My hour has not yet come." For John, Jesus' "hour" - his dying and rising - is at the heart of his ministry, the theme running through every scene and story he writes. He's not on Earth to provide advantages for family members.

After the Cana story the character of Mary does not reappear until the crucifixion of Jesus. Over the years experiencing a conversion, Mary is now a model of faith, an example for all Christians. She changes from looking at Jesus as someone who can provide us with what we want, to someone who helps us experience the dying and rising of Jesus in our own lives.

In each of us and in our communities can be found the power and the joy of salvation. Last year the priests and deacons of our Deanery began talking about the issues of "diversity" and "inclusion" in North County.

"Are you better off with your faith in the risen Jesus than you were without that faith?"

Christian faith affirms the goodness of all people and that a community thrives when there is respect for the dignity of each person. As pastoral leaders I believe that **we are building a consensus** that improving **diversity awareness** and **promoting inclusiveness** in our neighborhoods is crucial to encouraging harmony among neighbors and to providing a welcoming and productive environment within which residents can learn, recreate, and grow.

The following questions invite us all to explore our need for conversion. Every growing thing changes. I know that as we pray with these questions and talk about them together we will experience even more the "dying and rising" of Christ. For a while now our "hour" has come.

- Describe (be specific) the changes in your neighborhood demographics over the past 3 years.
 - What reasons do new families share for wanting to live in your neighborhood? Do these reasons differ among your neighbors?
 - What various ways do you have for welcoming new neighbors?
 How do you decide what to do?
 - How does your neighborhood engage new residents in the life of your neighborhood?
 - How has your neighborhood benefited from having a greater diversity among residents?

- How do you help your family and friends strengthen their awareness and knowledge of the diversity in your neighborhood?
- What challenges are you experiencing with your neighbors and a more diverse neighborhood?
- What help or support do you need as a parish member undergoing changes in your neighborhood?
- How can your neighborhood attract new residents?
- How can neighborhoods help each other benefit from the changes taking place in our community?



TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The cause of church unity is commended to Christians for prayer and action every year around this time. This week is not so much to focus on the many divisions within the Christian family, but on bonds of faith and mission. Even though Christians have always shown an inclination to fracture, spin off, and mutate into new expressions, recent history shows some new points of convergence and agreement. Catholics are more firmly rooted in the word of God, for example, and many Protestants are more likely to celebrate Communion than in years past. Some denominations are merging and pooling resources, and people from various traditions are collaborating on projects.

The call of this week is to be mindful of the diversity of our traditions and customs while treasuring what we hold in common. The old advice to "lighten up" is good medicine, because sometimes our differences are delightful and amusing. If someone says, "Let us pray," a Catholic might close the eyes, bow the head and fold hands; a Protestant reach out and clasp hands with the person in the next chair; and someone belonging to an Orthodox tradition might stand up with eyes wide open. Each has taken a different path, but the goal is always the same. This is a week not for focusing on the well-worn paths of divergence, but for mutual delight in a common goal.
