

WORDS MOTIVATE US TO ACT. Sometimes when the speaker is a beloved figure whom we trust. At other times when someone's words align with our own dreams and expectations. Or when the words are new and promising. In the spirit of the Gospel readings over these past few weeks here's a good spiritual exercise: Ask yourself and think about your life or our parish as a whole - When do the words of Jesus motivate us to act?

In the Nazareth synagogue people at first responded positively to Jesus' "gracious words". Later came their rage at him and their vengeance. What triggered this change? Are such forces at work among us?

Prophetic words are not just nice sayings. Often Jesus challenges his listeners to change how they think, how they relate, how they live. As human beings we resist such challenges that get to the core of who we are and how we live. What motivates us to hear Jesus' prophetic words? Only one thing - growing with each other's help to be more sure that we can trust him, the one who fulfills the dreams and hopes of our community. What do you think Jesus is saying to us today? How are we being called to respond?

A Time for Resting in the Sureness of the Love of God

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION might just be the time and place for you to pray about these questions. Such prayer promises God's powerful partnership in facing the challenges of each day life. It's also a graceful support for the work of our parish in the communities we are called to serve.

On March 1st we will decide whether or not we can continue to have two days of adoration in our parish. We have fewer volunteers. Meeting the scheduling needs of a two day commitment is becoming increasingly difficult. About a year ago we decided to work toward the goal of having at least two people present for each hour of adoration. We have not succeeded in achieving this goal. It's an important goal for our volunteers' sense of security, especially through the later evening hours. It's also a practical goal for managing the schedule of volunteers. If one person is sick, on vacation or cannot be there for any reason, the other person will cover the hour of prayer.

We now have a wonderful group of volunteers dedicated to the ministry of prayer - some for many years. If you know someone who has been a part of this ministry, ask them about the benefit it's had in their life and the blessing they believe it's been for our parish.

Currently the hours of adoration begin after the 6:30am Mass on Tuesday and continue until 10:30pm on Wednesday night. Visitors are welcome at any hour to spend as much time in prayer as you have - even if less than one hour. If you think you might be interest, come for a visit once or twice this month. I am most grateful to Linda Schneider (314-868-2374) who coordinates this ministry. If you have any questions or just want to talk more about this, call Linda or talk with Father Mike anytime after Mass or through the week. Daily prayer is important. This just might be your chance to re-connect or strengthen your connection with God in your life.



TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The song of the angels, "Holy, Holy, Holy," resounds from our lips at every Mass. There was a widespread belief in the first religions of the world that God stirred creation into being by a word, a song, a musical note. Music and a sense of God's presence have always been inseparable. In the liturgy, your voice is invited into this song as the priest names the reasons for our praise. "Heaven and earth are full of your glory," and we are not passive onlookers, but participants in this glory. Catholic prayer no longer assigns this angelic hymn to a choir, but gives it to you to sing. Even if your voice is thought to be suitable only for a well-insulated shower stall, you are called into this song.

We are born to sing—just listen to a baby testing the full range of newly-discovered vocal abilities. Soon we get shushed and hushed into quiet, and given lots of messages that our voices are unwanted, and that we need to raise our hands in order to be heard. All of that is overturned in liturgy, the place where God waits to hear us come alive in the song of all creation. In heaven, everyone's in the choir; why not start practicing now?


