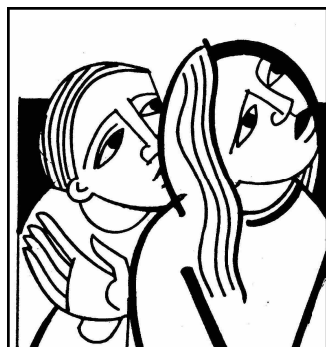

with the help of God,

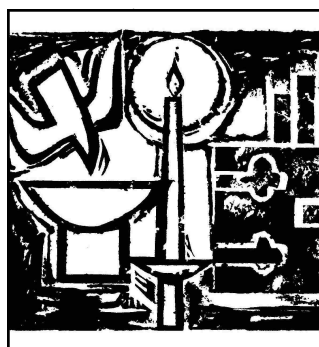

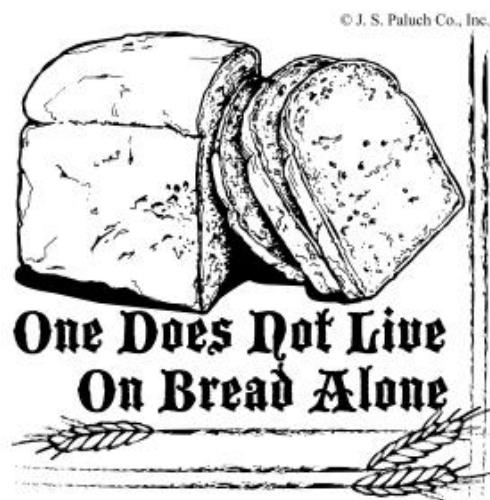

REDUCING FATS FOR A HEALTHIER HEART

There are many things that can put a person at a greater risk for heart disease and stroke. Choosing foods low in saturated fat and cholesterol and high in omega-3 fatty acids and soluble fiber will help keep that risk level low. People with **NO** risk factors for heart disease or stroke should also follow these guidelines.

BUY HEART HEALTHY FOOD: Keep your pantry and fridge stocked with these so they'll be readily available for use.....

- Skim milk and low fat cheeses
- Lean meats such as chicken and turkey
- Foods that contain soluble fiber
- Fish high in omega-3 fatty acids such as **fresh** tuna, herring, sardines, mackerel and salmon
- Use monounsaturated fats such as olive oil, canola oil and peanut oil

GET RID OF EXTRA FAT WHEN YOU PREPARE MEALS OR RECIPES....

- Trim fat off meat before you cook it
- Remove skin from chicken and turkey
- Drain fat from cooked meats
- Remove fat from soups and stews after they have cooled

USE LESS FAT WHEN PREPARING FOODS....

- Instead of frying food, bake, grill, broil, or boil when possible
- Use cooking oil spray instead of oil
- Cook rice, pasta and vegetables with less oil or butter
- Use onions, garlic, peppers, and seasonings to flavor food without using fats

LIMIT INTAKE OF FATTY FOODS.....

- Remove from diet or eat rarely—— whole milk and cream, high fat cheeses, egg yolks (no more than 3 per week), butter or shortening, organ meats such as liver and/or kidney, processed snacks and commercial baked goods.

As we nourish our bodies with good, healthy food; let's also nourish our souls this Lenten season.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Often, when a family keeps vigil around a person who is preparing for death, they may notice three interwoven activities. First, the dying person may become more prayerful and reflective than ever before, reviewing life's journey in gratitude to God, or seeking forgiveness and making amends for wrongs. Second, as death approaches, the need to eat and drink is lessened until even an ice cube brushed against the lips is satisfying. Third, persons who are dying often make plans to give their possessions away, making bequests, handing treasures down, providing for favorite charities.

Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving: with these three "pillars" of Lent, we rehearse our death every year in this season, and anticipate the final work we will do in this life. And every year, at the end of our journey, is the joy of Easter and the experience of the victory of Christ over death's darkness and power. Annually, we remind ourselves that the Christian experiences the same power and presence at the end of life's journey: Christ to the rescue and the lasting joy of heaven.

Catholic Families Tuition Assistance Endowment Fund

Any **Catholic** family wishing to apply for tuition assistance through the Archdiocese for the 2013-2014 school year must obtain a "FACTS" application from the school office. Students must attend an Archdiocesan or Parochial Elementary School or an Archdiocesan or Parochial High School to be eligible.
