is composed of people like me.


I help make it what it is.

Welcome To My World

HOW DO YOU TELL THE DIFFERENCE between a “fanatic” and a “mystic”? Between a person possessed by extreme zeal for a course of action by any means and a person who inspires a sense of mystery and wonder because they “know” something you have yet to discover. It’s a haunting, promising silence Peter, James, and John experience with Jesus. God asking them to reconsider the and purpose of their lives, “*Listen to him.*”

*“Jesus revealed to us that ‘God is love’
 and at the same time taught us that the new command of love
 was the basic law of human perfection and hence
 of the world’s transformation*

*Undergoing death itself for all of us sinners,
 he taught us by example that we too must shoulder that cross
 which the world and the flesh inflict upon those
 who search after peace and justice.”*

Gaudium et Spes, Joy and Hope, 38

The October 18th, 1999 Sports Illustrated cover pictured Ram’s quarterback Kurt Warner with the two-inch headline question, “**Who is this guy?**” Most people didn’t see him coming and couldn’t imagine the outcome of his being here. Warner often commented, “*People are looking for the secret to my success.*” There must be something behind this, a way of figuring it out and keeping it alive. “*I tell them its my faith in Jesus Christ, and they don’t want to hear that. So they ask me the same questions again and again, even though they’ve already gotten the answer. The Lord has something special in mind for this team, and I’m really excited to be a part of it.*”

I think we may have here a **good transfiguration question** for the disciples’ experience of Jesus as one who “mystically” could put their minds at ease, providing enlightenment and guidance for their daily lives. Yes, Kurt Warner worked hard at being a great quarterback, but clearly there was something more to his happiness and the Rams surprising success than hard work alone. I encourage you to **explore the mystery of Jesus Christ in your life** by participating in **our Parish Mission** this week. You will be surprised and deeply satisfied!

EUCARISTIC ADORATION MIGHT BE the time and place for you to discover and rest in the sureness of the love of God and the promise of God to be with you in the challenges of your everyday life.

At the end of this week we will decide whether or not to continue to have two days of adoration in our parish. We have **fewer volunteers** and more difficulty meeting the **scheduling needs of a two day commitment**. We need at least two people for each hour of adoration and have not achieved this goal - necessary for our volunteers’ sense of security and important for managing the schedule of volunteers.

We have a wonderful group of volunteers dedicated to this ministry of prayer - some for many years! If you know someone who has been a part of this ministry, ask them about the benefit it’s had in their life and the blessing they believe it’s been for our parish. Or if you have an interest or questions you can talk with Father Mike or with Linda Schneider (314-868-2374).

Currently the **hours of adoration begin after the 6:30am Mass on Tuesday and continue until 10:30pm on Wednesday night**. Daily prayer is important. This just might be your chance to re-connect or strengthen your connection with God in your life.

SIGNS OF HEART ATTACK FOR WOMEN

Heart attacks and heart disease are more often viewed as a man's problem than a woman's. However, More women die of heart disease each in the U.S. Unfortunately heart attack symptoms often go unnoticed in women, resulting in sometimes adverse consequences.

Women are more likely to have symptoms that include heartburn or burning in the upper abdomen, fatigue, difficulty breathing, even nausea. Unfortunately, there are a lot of people who don't have any symptoms before their first attack.

Women tend to develop heart disease about 10 years later than men. When symptoms occur, women tend to ignore them and think that the discomfort is due to something else.

It is important to know blood pressure, heart rate and cholesterol levels. If numbers are high, start working on lowering them and get them into a normal range by exercising and proper diet.

It is important to know other risk factors to heart disease. These include age and family history.

What all this means is, that if you are having symptoms do not ignore them. A visit to a Doctor could save your life.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

By now, many may have failed in Lenten discipline to some measure or another: the daily doughnut is simply too alluring, or a furtive puff on a cigarette irresistible. There is meaning even in the failure, though, a kind of reminder that we cannot save ourselves. Part of the power of Lent is that we do it together, and although individuals decide on different ways to keep it, it is fundamentally the same journey. We fall, we get up, we keep moving. The desire to "give something up" for Lent is an age-old impulse in the Christian heart. We get better at it over the years, and move more deeply into the meaning and message of acts of sacrifice; so there is no shame in stumbling, as long as we are not discouraged by the failure and give up. We are clearing space in our lives, after all, and some of the things we desire to give up are worth rooting out completely anyway.




