

### **Characters Welcome! - Sinners and Saints Alike**

THERE IS A COMMON HUMAN TENDENCY - more or less in all of us - to put someone "in the middle", that is, to be quick to condemn the actions of others. We know how easy it is to focus on the weaknesses and failures of others, while at the same time failing to see our own shortcomings. Truth be told, such rough edges and unfinished surfaces - our own as well as those of someone else - are real opportunities for growing in our relationship with God and others.

Concerning today's Gospel story of the adulterous woman ask yourself the question, *Whose the only one who doesn't walk away from Jesus?* The scribes and Pharisees chose not to remain. They couldn't let go of their ill will towards Jesus. Only the woman - a real character of our Gospel story - chooses not to leave.

"Remember not the events of the past, the things of long ago consider not; See, **I am doing something new!** In the desert I make a way, in the wasteland, rivers." Book of the Prophet Isaiah 43:18-20

Jesus **does not condemn her** for her sinfulness but **calls her** to continue her journey of remaining with him and choosing life. So often in Gospel stories Jesus helped all sorts of "characters" to recognize their own sinfulness. He does the same with use today, often with the help of others.

At times the unacceptable behavior of others might speak to us of our own sinfulness. Or it might be the truthfulness of what someone says to us in anger that finally hits home about how we must change. As painful as these admissions may well be, they are exactly what can strengthen us in our choice not to walk away from Jesus, our decision to remain in his love.

"God has gathered together as one all those who believe in Jesus and look on him as the author of salvation and the source of unity and peace.

God has established them as **the Church** so that for each and all, the Church may be **the visible sign of that saving unity**."

### FOR THE PAST FEW WEEKS - AND A FEW TO COME - our

Catholic Church has and will be getting a lot of media attention that we need to take the fullest advantage of now. This past week we prayed for the election of a new Pope using readings from St. Paul who has given us a most powerful image for the Church - the "Body of Christ". It made me think that our Church will have the best Pope possible, if each and everyone of us are the best Catholic Christians we can be. We are one Body, many members. That day we heard St. Paul (Ephesians 4:15) say that we are called to "live the truth in love" and to "grow into Christ". Today's Gospel pictures for us Jesus "living the truth in love" - accepting the woman as she is, walking step by step with her as she grows to love as she has been loved. As we prayed for a new Pope, Jesus (John 15:13) also taught that, "There is no greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends." In the love of Christ she is no longer a slave to her sin, but a friend in Christ. Our Pope needs to have great love and will have it - if each of us strives to be great in love ourselves.

### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Next weekend, many churches provide palms to be carried in the opening moments of the liturgy, as we gratefully recall Jesus' entry into the holy city of Jerusalem. The children who greeted him on that day used what was both handy and traditional, since palms were carried to inaugurate the joyful harvest feast of Succoth. To this day, faithful Jews are directed to take a beautiful palm branch, green and straight as possible, called a *lulav*, and bind it with three myrtle branches fifteen inches long, and two longer willow branches. At the end of the temple service, everyone carries the *lulav*, circling the sanctuary in a dance called the *Hoshanot*, singing hymns of joy.

In other climates, Jews and Christians alike have had to make accommodations over the years. In Italy, everyone carries olive branches today, often brought from their own garden. In England, forsythia branches are preferred, a relative of the olive, sign of peace. Germans prefer pussywillows, and others look for flowering spring branches. In our part of the world, what do you think would be the best choice to express joy and welcome, and to remind us of the joy of Christ's victory even as we prepare to commemorate his passion?

## COLORECTAL CANCER AWARENESS

Over the past few decades, more people have been surviving colon cancer and fewer people have been dying from it. This is due to improvements in colon cancer screening and treatment. Screening finds polyps, growths that can turn into cancer, and removes them. This helps the doctors detect the disease earlier and is likely easier to treat.

There are **5 common myths** that keep people from getting screened for colon cancer, knowing these are just myths will help you lower your chances of developing colon cancer.

- Colorectal cancer is a man's disease.
- Colorectal cancer cannot be prevented.
- African Americans are not at risk for colorectal cancer.
- Age doesn't matter when it comes to getting colorectal cancer.
- It's better not to get tested for colorectal cancer because it's deadly anyway.

All these are MYTHS, do not let these keep you from receiving early detection of colorectal cancer.

Most people diagnosed with colon cancer are over the age of 50, but some people have **risk factors** that make them more likely to develop it at an earlier age. Knowing the risk factors and getting screened earlier and having the test more often will aid in detecting the cancer earlier and allow for immediate treatment.

What is a risk factor? A risk factor is any-thing that affects your chance of getting a disease such as cancer. Different cancers have different risk factors. Remember, risk factors don't tell us everything. Having a risk factor or several risk factors doesn't mean you will get the disease. And some who get the disease had no risk factors.

If there was someone in your family that had colon cancer, tell your doctor. Ask your doctor what you should look for as early signs of colon cancer.
