





When Were You Last Amazed!?

"IT'S GOOD TO SEE YOU!" I believe that this was the attitude, if not the actual words, so often used by Jesus or experienced by those who encountered him. And, by the grace of the Holy Spirit, these words - such an attitude - have been characteristic of every evangelizing person or community of believers since Jesus. Jesus made it his mission to see the good in every person, to be amazed by this goodness, and then to bring it out to its greatest possible fulfillment. This is what it means to be redeemed!

During his Mass of Installation as Servant Leader of our Church, Pope Francis said that **"we must not be afraid of goodness or even tenderness!"** When I first read this I knew he was trying **to call out the best in us all**, the redeeming power of Christ that is alive today in our world. But later I thought that he might also have meant that we must not be afraid **to be on the receiving end of redemptive love**. As Christ did once and for all, we must

I pray that our Easter will be marked by the lasting joy and happiness that always comes with seeing the good in one another and being together. **"Amazement"** confirms that we believe in something more than an empty tomb - the real presence of Jesus Christ. Passing on the faith always begins with a sense of wonder and wanting more for ourselves and each other.

COLORECTAL CANCER AWARENESS:

PART 2—RISK FACTORS

Let's review what a risk factor is: A risk factor is anything that affects your chance of getting a disease such as cancer. Different cancers have different risk factors. Risk factors don't tell us everything. Having a risk factor, or even several risk factors, does not mean that you will get the disease. Some people who get a disease may not have any known risk factors. Even if a person with colorectal cancer has a risk factor, it is often hard to know how much that risk factor may have contributed to the cancer.

Researchers have found several risk factors that may increase a person's chance of developing colorectal polyps or colorectal cancer.

RISK FACTORS YOU CANNOT CHANGE:

- AGE
- PERSONAL HISTORY OF COLORECTAL POLYPS OR CANCER
- PERSONAL HISTORY OF INFLAMMATORY BOWEL DISEASE
- FAMILY HISTORY OF COLORECTAL CANCER
- INHERITED SYNDROMES
- RACIAL AND ETHNIC BACKGROUND

LIFESTYLE-RELATED FACTORS:

These are factors that you can do something about.

- CERTAIN TYPES OF DIET
- PHYSICAL INACTIVITY
- OBESITY
- SMOKING
- HEAVY ALCOHOL USE
- TYPE 2 DIABETES

FACTORS WITH UNCERTAIN, CONTROVERSIAL, OR UNPROVEN EFFECTS ON COLORECTAL CANCER:

- NIGHT SHIFT WORK
- PREVIOUS TREATMENT FOR CERTAIN CANCERS



TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Over the centuries, the Church has demonstrated a wonderful ability to adopt a culture's favorite symbols and customs and assign them new meaning. Easter eggs have a very ancient pedigree: nature's perfect package, emblem of new life, dyed and decorated and given as gifts in ancient Egypt, Rome, China, and Persia. Just as the long hard winter is over, the egg bursts with promise of life and nourishment. Long ago, Christians came to see the egg not as a symbol of spring's rebirth, but of ours, and as a sign of Christ's tomb. A Polish legend says that Mary, in compassion for the soldiers at the cross, gave them eggs, but that her tears stained their shells with brilliant color. Legends have their origin in tales told around a hearth, but they often contain a profound truth. The idea of Mary, the first Christian, engaged in a merciful act of forgiveness and tenderness even in the shadow of the cross, describes the age-old wish that Christ "Easter in us."

Retrouvaille is a program designed to provide help and support to married couples who are undergoing difficulties in their relationship, for those who are hurting in brokenness and loneliness. It has also proven helpful to couples who are separated and divorced. Although Retrouvaille is Catholic in origin, couples from all or no faith traditions are welcome to attend. MARCH/APRIL CHALLENGE TO FEED THE HUNGRY!

The 16th Annual Feinstein Challenge has a \$1million fund available to help feed the Hungry. Agencies that collect cash, checks or food items (valued at \$1 per item) through April 30th will receive a minimum of \$250.00 based on what is collected as a direct result of this challenge.
