

ONE OF THE HARDEST THINGS for us as Americans to give up is the curious distinction we've invented between the "deserving" and the "undeserving" poor. We hear in today's Gospel, "I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how <u>all</u> will know that your are my disciples, if you have love for one another." (Gospel of John 13:34-35)

There are many kinds of **self-sacrificing love**. There is **honest love**, where someone finds a briefcase of money and turns it in to the authorities rather than keeping it. There is **caring love**, where a stranger helps someone who trips and falls. There is **tough love**, where parents hold the line in the face of a youth's destructive behavior. There is also **compassion love**, **forgiving love**, **healing love**, **tender love**, **just love**. Any and all forms of self-sacrificing love give glory to God.

Somehow most of us learn during our lifetimes that **no one is "undeserving" of love**. Before my father died he made clear to each of his seven children that we should "never forget the poor of India". After living with them for four years during World War II, experiencing their lives and how much they wanted to come home with the American troops, these "outsiders" had made their way "inside" his mind and heart.

After that, even if he wanted to forget, he could not. And through all of our growing up as well as at the time of his death, he made sure that we clearly and carefully learned that the "Human family" was always more important than the "Henning family".



TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Frequent fliers today have many ways to accrue air miles, so one doesn't always have to endure long hours in cramped seats to earn free hours in cramped seats. In St. Paul's day, there were no such perks, nor would there have been any legal system for him to protest the shipwrecks he endured. He had other rewards in mind. The churches that he established in the catalogue of cities from today's first reading must have been very different from one another. Language, culture, customs, religious history, obstacles to community, social challenges, the places where they met, their clothing, their bread and wine, all distinct, particular to the area.

There were social customs as well: in a Christian household, the only place where a slave would be able to stand legally as an equal with the master would be at the table of the Lord, because at that table a new world of reconciliation was imaged. While Paul revered local customs, he was relentless about challenging the ways that people lived their Christian lives and how their worship reflected them. It is much the same today, as a global Catholic Church seeks to respect local customs and culture, allowing for differences in many things, yet always giving expression to the underlying presence of Christ, who binds us all together into his body.

Most of the time when I sit at my computer to write my weekend's bulletin article, I have no idea what to write about. I'll look at recent medical articles and decide what may interest or be beneficial to the parishioners. Sometimes it takes awhile and sometimes the idea comes right away. For this weeks article, it took opening an email from Mississippi Valley Regional Blood Center, asking for an urgent need for O-negative blood in Boston. From the tornado 2 weeks ago, to the Boston bombing, to the tragic fertilizer plant explosion in Texas, to a horrific accident of a runner from St. Louis being hit by a car while on her morning run in LA and now she lays in a coma with only half of her family at her bedside.

Our first response when we hear of these things or someone shares that a personal friend or family member was involved in one of these traumatic situations is to say we will pray for them. And that is all good and powerful and comforting and it heals souls, but sometimes we have a need to do a little more. Sometimes we have to step away from our comfort zone and sacrifice a little. After all, when it comes to clinging to life in the hospital, or losing a limb because of evil in the mind of someone, can we really say it is a big sacrifice?

Do something good! Step out of your comfort zone and make a difference. Make a sacrifice that you never thought you would make. Please see the bulletin regarding Holy Name of Jesus' blood drive on May 18th.
