

In Over Our Heads

MOST OF US KNOW WHEN WE'RE IN DEEP WATER,

usually meaning deep trouble. When we're facing some kind of difficulty or challenge for which we feel unprepared or helpless. These tend to be situations where giving of our selves is not an option. We either sink or swim! Yet, the **easy human tendency** when we're "in over our heads" is to **"hold back"**. We're not quite sure we want to trust others, or ourselves. We hesitate about outcomes. We're don't want to be hurt again. We "hold back" when we don't have all the facts, and frankly when we're too selfish to care. **"Holding back"** is a **symptom of our forgetfulness about God**.

When human beings are "in over their heads" and start "holding back" they also tend toward "idolatry" - even though we may want to think that this is more a part of some ancient or primitive world other than our own. A class of 6th graders once taught me something very important on the subject of idolatry.

"Hope is not the conviction that something will turn out well, but the certainty that something makes sense regardless of how it turns out." Vaclav Haval, Poet Former President of the Czech Republic

"An 'idol'," they said, "was when you make something more important than God or put something ahead of God." I was amazed, but even more so with how easily they already could recognize how often they were "creating" and "worshiping" idols themselves. The "otherness" of God always tempts us to believe that God is "not with us", that God is "holding back".

"The task of a missioner is to go to a place here he is not wanted but needed, and to remain until he is not needed but wanted."

As we celebrate the Feast of the Trinity today we might want to do so by focusing our attention on our conviction that God holds back nothing from us and cannot be held back. God chooses to be "in over our heads" with us. Knowing this empowers us as disciples of Christ to hold nothing back ourselves.

A faithful disciple trusts more freely and lives more boldly, always certain that something is "forthcoming", like a baby is a forthcoming event quiet evident in a pregnant mother.



TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Today's feast, extending a dimension of Easter joy into Ordinary Time, reminds us that every aspect of worship centers on the mystery of God in three persons. At baptism, we are initiated into Christ and the Spirit. The Creed we recite at Mass every Sunday has its roots in the ancient celebration of baptism, when a new believer was questioned at the edge of the waters of the font with three questions: Do you believe in God, the Father, the Son, the Holy Spirit? Three questions, three affirmations, three immersions into the saving waters. Because every liturgy abounds with references to the Trinity, not only in words but in blessings by the sign of the cross, this feast was not easily accepted into the calendar. Pope Alexander in the eleventh century remarked that the liturgy is so laden with praise of the Trinity that there was no need for a special feast. Two hundred years later, while in exile in France. Pope John XXII proclaimed the feast, but it was not until 1911 that Pope St. Pius X gave it status as a solemnity.

A favorite image in art for today is the Icon of the Trinity, showing three glorious winged men seated at a table laden with bread and a cup of wine. It recalls Abraham's hospitality to angels and gives expression to the inner life of God, a life lived in relationship, a life poured out in abundance whenever Christians gather at the table of the Eucharist to give praise to the Father, in Christ, in the embrace of the Spirit.

DEPRESSION VS SADNESS When is blue too blue?

It's normal to feel sadness or grief when a loved one dies or you go through a divorce, an economic setback, or even the death of a pet. Even our own declining health or that of a loved one can cause sadness and grief. One way we often describe this feeling is we say we are feeling "blue."

But when an occasional bad day stretches into two weeks or longer, however, clinical depression may be the cause. Unlike grief, which can be healing, depression is destructive. So, what is **depression**?

Major depression is a serious medical illness that affects approximately 5-8% of the adult population in a given year. Unlike normal emotional experiences of sadness, loss or passing mood states, major depression is persistent and can significantly interfere with an individual's thoughts, behavior, mood, activity and physical health. Among all medical illnesses, major depression is the leading cause of disability in the United States and many other developed countries.

Depression occurs twice as frequently in women as in men, for reasons that are not fully understood. More than one-half of those who experience a single episode of depression will continue to have episodes that occur as frequently as once or even twice a year. The frequency of depressive illness as well as the severity of symptoms tends to increase over time. Depression can interfere with day-to-day living and can include lack of energy, problems in thinking and an overall feeling of despair and hopelessness. When symptoms of depression are severe and ongoing, see your doctor and talk with them regarding treatment.

Blessed is she who believed that the Lord's word to her would be fulfilled: come, let us praise God, alleluia!

Support Our Parish by Making a Planned Gift This Year Use Your IRA to Make a Gift & Save Taxes

IF YOU'RE OVER THE AGE OF 701/2, tax laws now allow you to make charitable gifts through your traditional or Roth IRA, through the end of 2013. Gifts must be made by the IRA custodian directly to the charity and may not exceed \$100,000.

Although no charitable deduction is allowed, you can avoid the tax you would otherwise pay on required distributions. Giving from your IRA, rather than from others assets, may be especially appropriate if you use the standard deduction rather than itemizing your deductions. It might also be a good choice if you don't need all of your required minimum distribution or you wouldn't be able to deduct all of your charitable contributions because of deduction limitations. Here are some opportunities for giving to support our parish that this legislation now makes possible.

Increase Your Annual Giving IRA funds are heavily taxed whenever you draw them out, at rates as high as 35%. You can divert the tax collector's "take" from your IRA to Holy Name of Jesus Parish..

For example, suppose you're in a 25% tax bracket and normally give \$1,000 each year in support of our parish. Instead of writing a check each week or month or once a year, you could instruct your IRA trustee to send us \$1,333 from your account, the tax would have been \$333 in a 25% bracket. That \$333 now can be used to assist parish ministries and programs - all paid for by the IRS.

Annual Distribution Gifts Under these rules, IRA gifts will count toward mandatory annual distributions required of individuals over the age of 701/2. That means IRA gifts can reduce your taxes for 2013.

For example, Charlie must withdraw at least \$20,000 from his IRA this year, even though he doesn't need the money for living expenses.

Charlie can now direct that the \$20,000 be paid to Holy Name of Jesus Parish from his IRA prior to taking any distribution and reduce his federal taxes by \$5,600 in his 28% tax bracket.

Major Gifts If you are intending to make a planned major gift to our parish after you die, you may want to consider making such a gift during your lifetime and enjoying the benefit it will have for our parish now.

Bernice planned to leave a gift of \$25,000 to our parish in her will. Now she can direct that gift be made from her IRA this year.

STUDENTS COLLECT SHOES FOR KIDS IN KENYA

St. Norbert third-grade student Dennis Muigai visited Kenya last summer on a Mission trip where he had the opportunity to meet some new friends at a school and orphanage. Many of these children had no shoes to wear. Through the Federation of Catholic Schools, Muigai asked his fellow Catholic school students in North St. Louis County to join him in this service project by collecting shoes, which he plans to deliver to Kenya during a Medical Mission planned for this summer. Since the shipment will take two months to arrive in Africa, the mission team will also carry some of the shoes with them as they travel to deliver as soon as they arrive.

"Service to others is central to our mission of Catholic education, so we are grateful for this opportunity to partner with Vitendo4Africa and help them in this small way on their Medical Mission as they serve the children and families of Kenya," said Cara Koen, Director of Advancement for the Federation of Catholic Schools.
