

Compassion Leads to Action

WHICH "DEAD" PERSON IN TODAY'S GOSPEL has been restored to life? This key question invites us to consider the widowed mother as the main character - and focus of Jesus' attention - rather than the deceased son. Of course the son is dead. But so too is his mother. In their 1st century world without any significant male in her life to take care of her, this woman was as good as dead in her society. Though she still possesses physical life, it is bereft of meaning. Jesus is moved to compassion that leads to action.

The world of Jesus understood healing as the restoration of meaning to life. So we must ask, "In this story whose life has had greater meaning restored?" The widowed mother's life! She lost her son, lost everything of value in her world. To have her son restored by Jesus is to have been given a new lease on meaningful life. Take some time today to consider who and what may

give meaning to your life. Thank God for those who "visited" you in your time of loss. Who are the people you know whose suffering or struggle makes it hard for them to have a meaningful life? How might you or we as a parish help to bring about their restoration? When we do, however we can, it's always an "awesome" ("fearful") thing that easily and clearly proclaims that "God is with us"!

FOOD SAFETY

I know there were very few of you affected by the power outage from the tornado on Friday. I'm sure you were affected in some Way, but losing you power was not one of them.

Prolonged power outages bring on serious concerns about food. When food spoils, there is a higher risk for food borne illness. Salmonella is the most common food borne organism present in spoiled food, bur E. Coli can also be present, especially when ground beef is involved.

The most important thing to know when there is a power outage is to keep your refrigerator and freezer door closed. If the doors stay sealed, your food can stay cold up to 4 hours. If your freezer is full and stays sealed, it can stay for 48 hours (24 hours if half full.

A general rule of thumb, when it comes to throwing out food: throw out any perishable that has been stored above 40 degrees F for more than 2 hours, no matter their appearance or odor (never taste). Words to live by: *When in doubt, throw it out!!*

Watch out for neighbors and loved ones during periods of bad weather.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Today we return to using the green vestments of Ordinary Time on Sundays. Changing colors give a sense of the progress of faith through the seasons of life. For centuries, the number of colors and the reasons underlying them were left to local custom.

Over time, we settled on six colors to express the character of a day or season: white, red, green, violet, black, and rose. Black is seldom seen these days, replaced by white or violet. Rose, really a dusty pink shade, appears at most twice a year. What does the color green suggest to you? Green is new growth, olives, evergreens, glistening emeralds, ripening pears, and fields at high summer. It suggests renewal, healing, fertility, peace, and harmony. In medieval Europe, green was the favorite color for brides! Did you know that drivers of green cars are the least likely to be stopped for speeding? Is it because of their own feelings of harmony and well being, or because law enforcement officers are filled with serenity when they see a green car whiz by? Take out a paint chart today and marvel at the many hues and names of green.

The Church figured it out centuries ago: color really matters.

Support Our Parish by Making a Planned Gift This Year Use Your IRA to Make a Gift & Save Taxes

IF YOU'RE OVER THE AGE OF 701/2, tax laws now allow you to make charitable gifts through your traditional or Roth IRA, through the end of 2013. Gifts must be made by the IRA custodian directly to the charity and may not exceed \$100,000.

Although no charitable deduction is allowed, you can avoid the tax you would otherwise pay on required distributions. Giving from your IRA, rather than from others assets, may be especially appropriate if you use the standard deduction rather than itemizing your deductions. It might also be a good choice if you don't need all of your required minimum distribution or you wouldn't be able to deduct all of your charitable contributions because of deduction limitations. Here are some opportunities for giving to support our parish that this legislation now makes possible.

Increase Your Annual Giving IRA funds are heavily taxed whenever you draw them out, at rates as high as 35%. You can divert the tax collector's "take" from your IRA to Holy Name of Jesus Parish..

For example, suppose you're in a 25% tax bracket and normally give \$1,000 each year in support of our parish. Instead of writing a check each week or month or once a year, you could instruct your IRA trustee to send us \$1,333 from your account, the tax would have been \$333 in a 25% bracket. That \$333 now can be used to assist parish ministries and programs - all paid for by the IRS.

Annual Distribution Gifts Under these rules, IRA gifts will count toward mandatory annual distributions required of individuals over the age of 701/2. That means IRA gifts can reduce your taxes for 2013.

For example, Charlie must withdraw at least \$20,000 from his IRA this year, even though he doesn't need the money for living expenses.

Charlie can now direct that the \$20,000 be paid to Holy Name of Jesus Parish from his IRA prior to taking any distribution and reduce his federal taxes by \$5,600 in his 28% tax bracket.

Major Gifts If you are intending to make a planned major gift to our parish after you die, you may want to consider making such a gift during your lifetime and enjoying the benefit it will have for our parish now.

Bernice planned to leave a gift of \$25,000 to our parish in her will. Now she can direct that gift be made from her IRA this year.

CALL TO PRAYER

FOR LIFE, MARRIAGE AND RELIGIOUS LIBERTY



In this Year of Faith, the Catholic Bishops of the United States have called for a nationwide effort to advance a movement for Life, Marriage, and Religious Liberty through prayer, penance, and sacrifice.

Catholics across the nation are being encouraged to pray for rebuilding a culture favorable to life and marriage and for increased protections of religious liberty.

Time of unprecedented challenges

This call to prayer is prompted by unprecedented challenges to the Church and the nation, particularly the HHS Mandate and current trends in government and culture toward redefining marriage.

The goal of this call to prayer is twofold: (1) to increase awareness of these challenges and (2) to build spiritual stamina and fortitude among the faithful so that we can be effective and joyful witnesses of faith, hope, and charity and agents of the New Evangelization.

Need for

spiritual stamina
