



Celebrating the Joy of Being a Catholic Christian**A Leap of Faith**

FROM A VERY EARLY AGE MOST OF US have been tempted by, and maybe even have mastered, the practices of “*getting back, getting even, getting ahead*”. In today’s Gospel the disciples of Jesus are clearly heading in this direction. Their negative attitude toward Samaritans is as strong and quick as any of their contemporaries. And yet, once again St. Luke imagines Jesus delighting in testing their limits.

His journey to Jerusalem is a combination of basic training and road to glory. He wants them to launch themselves - closely with and after him - on a “leap of faith” not unlike children at play. Fallings and failings are an essential ingredient of a maturing vocation. He knows that testing their limits and picking themselves up again and again with the resolve to succeed will bring them joy, exhaustion, and a sure sense of the day well spent. Luke also reminds us that to be a disciple

is to experience myself as **religiously decisive**. I must choose to follow Jesus Christ. I **choose** to be a Christian, rather than simply continuing to attend the church of my parents or friends. I **commit** myself as a member of a Christian community to providing a trusting and trustworthy environment where others can “play” out their vocation over the course of a lifetime. St. Luke challenges us not to allow cultural and historical differences to divide us. There are many ways to serve God, to love Jesus, to be a Christian.

**DON'T BUG ME1111**

Don't let bugs keep your mind off work, relaxation, play or anything else for that matter.

Avoid areas where insects nest or congregate, such as garbage cans, stagnant pools of water or near uncovered foods.

Don't use scented soaps, perfumes or hair sprays.

Dress in lightweight long pants and a long-sleeved shirt. Avoid bright colors and flowery prints because they attract insects.

Use an insect repellent that contains DEET. Caution: Use a product with no more than 10 percent DEET on children.

If you get bitten, don't aggravate the bite by scratching. Use a cold compress and apply anti-itch cream such as hydrocortisone, an antihistamine such as Benedryl or a local anesthetic such as benzocaine.

If you get bitten, and the bite appears to get bigger, be infected, etc., do not delay in going to the ER or contacting your doctor. Some bites can become very serious and cause a systemic infection that could cause terrible outcomes. It is better to be safe than sorry.

Take care and have a good summer....be sure to drink plenty of fluids...water is usually the drink of choice. Use common sense and do not stay out in the heat for extended lengths of time.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The pilgrim experience of going by foot to Santiago de Compostella, the shrine of St. James, reaches its high point a month from now at the feast of the Apostle. By now, tens of thousands of pilgrims are already on the road. Typically, they cover twelve to twenty miles a day through rough territory. The difficult journey and the often primitive lodging facilities are made bearable by the joy of the pilgrims, their songs and prayers. When their journey is documented properly, they receive the scallop shell, a reminder not only of James the fisherman, but also his call to fish for human beings and to baptize the nations. In the Middle Ages, those who wore this badge on their hats were granted lodging and hospitality wherever they went. Next to the palm, the sign of a Jerusalem pilgrim, the scallop shell was most highly prized.

In the Middle Ages, some people so enjoyed the pilgrim road, although it was filled with discomfort and danger, that they spent most of their lives on the road. Today, some people take up the route for exercise, but are drawn gradually into the spirituality of the journey. As you make your summer travels, always fold in an element of pilgrimage: a long walk through beautiful countryside, a visit to a church, a prayer of gratitude for your journey through life's hills and valleys.


