



#### With The EYES of Faith

Today's Gospel reminds us the when we have family and friends in for dinner, a big part of the **gathering** is the exchange of happenings in each other's lives. The children are asked about how school is going, the person looking for work is asked about job prospects, the hosts are asked how dinner is coming along.

This kind of "paying attention" to persons with their concerns and needs, their joys and successes is the "better part". As Catholic Christians we have long believed that to be present to others is to be undividedly present to the Christ who is within them.

Together with our Parish Pastoral Council I have made the commitment that there will be a Catholic presence and a vibrant parish at this location for the long term future. Our faith has brought us together here for **one purpose** – *Friendship in Christ!* This is St. Paul's vision of the Church, the People of God. We are and will continue to achieve this vision – for ourselves and for those we are called to serve –

- by enjoying one another's company,
- by striving to bring the best out of each other, and
- by committing ourselves to a common good outside of ourselves.

Every parish member who commits themselves to this vision, who says "Yes" to living like this "with the eyes of faith" is an encouragement to me and for all who gather here in the name of Jesus.

I thank God every day for each of you and for your continuing commitment to the life and welfare of our parish. When you give of yourself you encourage others to do the same. Your commitment also attracts the support of those who live in our community and many others who want us to be here.

Achieving our parish purpose also requires good judgment about all our parish resources. Earlier this spring I announced here and again need everyone to know that we are working to achieve a balanced budget. We have seriously begun to address the fact that since 2007 our **average annual deficit** has been \$442,500.

For the fiscal year just begun (July 1<sup>st</sup>) we have planned to cover 50% of our parish expenses using ordinary parish income with the remaining amount (\$421,676) coming from our savings. We will achieve this goal by –

**Managing Parish Expenses** – For the second year we have lowered our parish investment (subsidy) for our school – this year by \$55,588 (22.3%). And, overall have lowered parish expenses by \$119,117 (12.3%).

**Increasing Sunday Revenues** – This year we have planned for an increase in Sunday revenues of \$30,000 over the next 12 months. To achieve this and avoid budget reductions later this year, I encourage your increased financial support for the purpose and works of our parish. May your gratitude to God for the blessings of your life always be the first measure for your giving in support of our parish.

**Promoting Planned Giving Opportunities** – Our parish has been richly blessed by those who have remembered us in their wills and estate planning. Such gifts support our faith and the works of the Church across generations.

**Exploring and Developing Partnerships** – We are now just beginning the work of finding other Catholic organizations or non-profit service agencies who share our mission and may want to join us at this location.

# Life's Simple 7..... #2—Managing Blood Pressure

Managing your blood pressure is key to keeping your heart healthy. Understanding your blood pressure may be the most important thing you can do for your heart and overall health. According to professors of cardiology, high blood pressure is the single risk factor for heart disease, stroke and other cardiovascular disease. About one in three US adults has high blood pressure, often referred to as the "silent killer." About 90% of Americans will develop it over their lifetime. That's why AHA considers controlling high blood pressure as on of 'Life's Simple 7"s.

Where do we begin? Educate your-self! Blood pressure readings measure the force pushing outwards on the walls of your blood vessels as they carry blood and oxygen to your organs, called systolic pressure (upper number), and the force created as the heart rests between beats, or diastolic pressure (lower number). If that pressure is often high, the artery walls can become stressed over time and develop weak spots or scarring that can lead to increased plaque build-up and increased risk of blood clots.

It is important that your blood pressure be considered normal or in the healthy range. If you are not sure what those ranges are, please visit Sister Rose or myself on blood pressure weekend to learn about healthy ranges. Blood pressure can rise as you age, so even if you have never had high blood pressure and you are over the age of 70, you should have your blood pressure checked occasionally to keep track of any changes that may occur.

I will write more on blood pressure next article. Our next blood pressure check is Aug. 10th and 11th, mark your calendar.
