



The Real Power of Staying in Touch

EXPECTATON IS A STRONG MOTIVATOR. When we expect guests for dinner, we buy groceries and clean the house. When we expect a promotion, we work harder and may even plan for success. Expectation generates action, action leads to success, success brings rejoicing.

Today's Gospel shepherd and woman expect to find the lost sheep and coin, or would never have wasted their time searching. Their diligent action brings them to rejoice and celebrate. We don't know if the father expected his younger son to return, but when he did he springs into action.

When our expectations are limited by anger, resentment, or fear, we close off possibilities for success, restored relationships, celebration. When our expectations are high because we are hopeful, diligent, and welcoming, we open up possibilities for success, acceptance, deep satisfaction. We choose new life. The extravagant mercy and goodness of our Father shapes our expectations and enables us to choose life over death.

Brief Reminders and Notices

THROUGHOUT THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER each year we take time to reflect on the meaning and practice of stewardship in our parish. Stewardship is a way of living rooted in faith. Stewardship is grounded in **three basic principles**.

Everything we have is a gift from God. We can take credit for nothing. Everything we have and are is the result of some gift from God who will not be outdone in generosity.

We need to take time to be grateful for what we have. Society teaches us to want more rather than to appreciate what we already have. God provides what we need.

The more we are grateful, the more we see that **God has given us enough of everything we need and something to share**. Our ever increasing gratitude to God always leads to generosity that on our part that may be hard to limit or measure.

Pray for each other this month that for the sake Christ's mission in our parish our faith will be evident in our stewardship of time, talent, and treasure.

WELCOMING PEOPLE helps them to know that God cares! We are now in <u>the last two weeks</u> of building **Evangelization Teams** in our parish. We are looking to have 20-21 teams (3 persons per team) who will give about 15 hours of service total over the next 12 months.

The one and only **purpose** of these teams is **to focus on showing <u>hospitality</u> to those who visit our parish or receive parish services**. We want to welcome the neighbors of our community as well as visiting friends and fellow parishioners who receive services from our food pantry and overnight shelter or who attend our fish frys or Sunday hospitality. Anyone's positive experience or feeling leaving here knowing they've been warmly received is a great encouragement for them to come back, to get to know more about us, even to get involved in the life and work of our parish.

Each team will make only 4 "visits" over the course of an entire year. We now have 6 people interested in getting more information about becoming a team. I encourage everyone to think about becoming a team member.

It's simply a matter of being interested in people and spending some time with them. Check out the information in today's bulletin and return the interest form as soon as possible. There will be an information meeting in early October and we'll begin visits shortly after this meeting.

J MUSIC J at HOLY NAME OF JESUS

There are opportunities for every parishioner at Holy Name of Jesus to praise God in song. First and foremost is Congregational Singing. Our parish does this exceptionally well whether led by our choirs and instrumentalists, our Youth Group, or organists and cantors. Some parishioners choose to devote more time and energy into music ministry out of a love for singing to our Lord or at the encouragement of others. If you have been gifted with the ability to match pitches (prerequisite for all Choirs) or someone has suggested that you sing well, here is a nudge. Consider singing with one of the following Choirs. There is a wide variety of voice types and amounts of time commitment involved. The time spent in rehearsal is enjoyable and rewarding. At least one is suited for you, really.

Holy Name of Jesus Choir – sings one Mass each weekend (with few exceptions), some Holy Days and some holidays. Rehearsals are Wednesdays at 7:00 pm. Open to high school age and up.*

5th Sunday Choir – sings one Mass on a weekend when a 5th Sunday occurs. There are typically 4 one hour rehearsals on varying dates during that particular month. Open to all parishioners who wish to sing in a Choir but find it **impossible** to commit to the twice weekly schedule of the Holy Name of Jesus Choir.*

Holy Name of Jesus and Our Lady of the Rosary Children's Choir – sings about one Mass each month (except in Summer) alternating between the two parishes. Rehearsals are Tuesdays at 5:30 pm. Open to children in 4th thru 8th grades.*

*These Choirs provide musical leadership and congregational support. They often enhance liturgies with harmony and liturgically or seasonally appropriate anthems.

New Life (Funeral) Choir – sings for Funerals and Memorial Masses usually with two or three days notice. This Choir demonstrates the corporal works of mercy in their ministry to grieving families and are a representation of the Parish's prayers and support. There are no rehearsals. Open to all.

Please considering using your talent for and love of singing in one of these Choirs. You will be happy you did - and happily welcomed! Also, if you know someone who sings well, encourage them to join, or better yet, join together!

Each year our school chooses a theme to carry us through the year. This year our theme is: *We Can Make a Difference*. Throughout the year the faculty and students will focus on their own relationship with Christ through personal prayer, journaling, prayer services and Liturgy. Awareness of how we are making a difference or how others are making a difference in our lives will flow from our prayer.

We used the story of the little girl saving the star fish, that were laying on the beach by throwing them back into the ocean, with the students at an opening day prayer service. Randy Budd, our music teacher and Cheyenne Davidson, one of our seventh graders acted out the story for us. Just as the little girl stated that "she might not be able to save all the star fish but she could save that one as she tossed it back into the ocean, so we committed this year to making a difference individually and as a school community in the lives of others. Each year our students receive a prayer journal and this year we will spend a few minutes each reflecting in our journals about how we are making a difference in other people's lives or how someone else has made a difference in ours.

We will also be carrying out the theme each week at our school prayer service on Thursday mornings. Each homeroom takes a turn in planning and leading this prayer. At this prayer each week, the homeroom will choose one person to hi-light who has made a difference. Last week, Mrs. Dafflitto, named Pope Francis as someone who is making a difference in our lives. We then will display the person's picture on our theme bulletin board in the hallway.

In a special way each week, we remember how much you, our parish families make a difference in our lives. Thank you for all you do for us.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Although New Year's Day has been fixed firmly on January 1 for several hundred years, Labor Day has the feel of a great dividing line between leisure and routine. The pace of life has since picked up, and new schedules and commitments crowd us. In the background is God's call to consider the third commandment, still life-giving and binding, to make holy the Lord's Day by worship and rest. Jews see the Sabbath, Saturday, not so much as a day of worship, but as a day of rest, a day of renewing friendship with God by delighting in the beauty of creation and the joy of family and friends. It is a day for contemplating the wonder of God's creation, but not disturbing it.

For Christians in the first three centuries, the Lord's Day, Sunday, was not for rest, but worship. It was a regular work day. People met before dawn, and after Eucharist hurried off to daily routines. Today we come to Mass, but many hurry off to essential work, not a day of rest. The Lord's Day is not the Sabbath, but we can enhance Sunday's ability to transform us if we consider embracing some Sabbath values: having a family meal, going for a walk in a beautiful place, making room in our lives to open ourselves more fully to holiness of life in Christ.
