



SAMARITANS AND JEWS HAD EVERY REASON in the world to keep their distance from each other. Cultural and religious differences divided their worlds. Histories of hurts and bad blood easily and often boiled to the surface. Yet, Jesus' open mindedness and ease of being with all people—though a scandal for his fellow Jews—must have been a tremendously inviting experience for anyone who was marginalized because of their poverty, position in life, or place of birth.

The first act of faith for the Samaritan of today's Gospel was simply being open to Jesus when he needed healing and hope. His second act of faith was to thank God for the miracle—the "wonderful" thing—that happened in his life because of Jesus.

Essentially the openness on the part of both Jesus and the Samaritan—an openness to a new relationship, a new attitude and way of relating to each other gives us a good glimpse of the salvation promised and possibly for every person, for people of all times and places.



ON THE RECOMMENDATION of our

Pastoral Council our parish has become a Covenant Church of North County Churches Uniting for Racial Harmony and Justice. This organization is an initiative of people of faith who envision north St. Louis County as a vibrantly diverse area, where residents, schools, and businesses can flourish in an environment of dignity, justice, and racial harmony. The churches of this Covenant envision a new relationship among the residents and neighborhoods of North County. This Covenant hinges on our

openness to each other and to new ways of being and working together for healing and hope in our community. Such openness, rooted in faith has done and will continue to do "wonderful" things. And, will increase our need to give thanks to God.

The real strength of this Covenant lies with the prayer and action of individual church members to make it a reality. This past weekend 157 members of our parish signed the Covenant Agreement that establishes our members as an NCCU member church. Throughout the month of October this Agreement will be displayed in church. I encourage everyone to continue to prayerfully consider our commitment, and to add your name to the signature pages you will find in the front of church near the Baptismal font.



GET MOVING!!!

You'll Feel Better And Your Health Depends On It

By exercising for as little as 30 minutes a day you can reduce your risk of heart disease. In fact, studies show that every hour of walking, you may increase your life expectancy by two hours. The time to get moving is now! Start with a small goal and commit to it regularly. It won't be long before you're enjoying the benefits of an active life. There are several things to think about when you are deciding to **get motivated** for a healthier life:

• The Price of Inactivity....As adult and child-hood obesity levels rise, so does the impact on our nation's health. Some things to think about.....68% of all adults are obese or overweight, people are less active due to technology and better transportation, sedentary jobs have increased 83% since 1950, physically active jobs now make up only about 25% of our workforce, our average work week is longer and extra weight costs us physically and financially.

The consequences and problems from our overweight society are sobering! However, we can all make changes. Moving just 30 minutes a day can change your life for the better. Here are some tips on just how to do that.

American Heart Association Recommendations for Physical Activity in Adults.

 At least 30 minutes of moderate-intensity aerobic activity at least 5 days per week for a total of 150 minutes.

OR....

At least 25 minutes of vigorous aerobic activity at least 3 days per week for a total of 75 minutes: or a combination of the two.

AND...

 Moderate to high intensity muscle – strengthening activity at least 2 or more days per week for additional health benefits.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Christian liturgy has always contained an opportunity to make a choice for sharing. From the beginning. Christians pooled their resources. especially for the care of widows and orphans, at the weekly Eucharist. Over the years, the collection became detached from the liturgy and baskets or plates would be passed through the community while the Mass was going on at the altar, or contributions would be collected at the doors. In Milan's Ambrosian Rite, these gifts have always brought to the altar by lay people in procession. In German countries, the ancient custom was for the entire assembly to process with their gifts—first the men. then the women, then the priests and deacons—to offer their gifts at the altar. The old ceremony of canonization included a curious vestige of this procession: people would present the pope with two loaves of bread, two barrels of wine and water, five candles, and three cages containing pigeons or turtledoves!
