




OVER THE PAST TWO YEARS we have given more attention to—

- encouraging active Catholics to again appreciate the gift of their faith,
- **reminding parish members** to invite those who have left the Church or simply drifted away to take another look at practicing their faith,
- offering the community of our faith to those who have no Church.

Hospitality in words and actions—especially at Mass and parish events—is the single most important factor for the success of these efforts. In addition, good celebrations of the Liturgy, effective preaching, and parish members reaching out to their neighbors are necessary elements for growth and a strong sense of belonging. Our commitment in these areas must be consistent and for the long haul of years to come.

The practice of attending Sunday Mass among our parish members is one way for us to measure the success of our efforts. In October—over three consecutive weekends—we found that our parish had on average **372 people attending weekend Masses here**, a **7.5% decrease** from last October (402) - roughly **22.1%** of our total number of members (1682) from 997 registered households. During this period actual Mass attendance ranged from a high of **147 persons to a low of 102**, with each particular Mass averaging 133 (5:00pm), 109 (8:00am), and 130 (10:30am).

May the commitment and devotion of our members always be our best source of encouragement for continuing to participate in the celebration of Mass with our community. May we also support and encourage one another to be attentive to our personal attitudes and practices regarding our need to be a hospitable and welcoming community—with each other and especially with anyone who may be a stranger to us.



Encouraging Full & Active Participation in the Celebration of Mass Enhancing Our Worship Space

Last spring our parish Liturgy Committee began a review and discussion of the work we did two years ago concerning the possible renovation needs of our church.

If we are to remain a vibrant parish, we must do all that we can to insure that our parish members can actively participate in the celebration of the sacraments.

Our parish has always been called to be a Eucharistic community. This week several improvements to our worship space will be implemented designed to enhance our worship space and our celebrations of the Mass. The **Tabernacle** is being moved from the black marble ledge against the wall to the current Altar of Sacrifice. A new **Altar of Sacrifice** will be placed at the mid-level area between the Ambo (Pulpit) and the Presider's Chair. While the Liturgy Committee considers a more suitable alternative, we will now use the altar upon which the Pieta statue has been placed in the back of church.

Moving the altar is a good first step to achieving increased accessibility—especially for our liturgical ministers—and bringing the community closer to the mystery of the Eucharist. These changes will take place this week in preparation for our celebration of the solemn feast of Christ the King.

NOT WATCHING FOR THE SECOND COMING

As we near the end of the Church year, the scriptures become more urgent. Both the prophet Malachi and Jesus in the Gospel according to Luke offer graphic pictures of a terrible future. But we are missing the message if we use these passages to speculate about when the world will end. The troubles predicted have already occurred, and then some. In the last century alone we have seen devastation beyond anything the ancient prophets could have imagined.

We weren't given these passages to strike fear in our hearts, but faith. The sun of justice will rise, Malachi assures us, for those who are faithful. And Jesus promises, "By your perseverance you will secure your lives." But it is Paul who brings the message down to earth. The Thessalonians were so sure that the end of the world was upon them, some of them had stopped working! Paul states his case clearly: "If anyone was unwilling to work, neither should that one eat." We are not called to worry about how things will end, but to live today faithfully.

CEI and Catholic Teaching. The Children's Education Initiative (CEI) will provide up to \$72 million in scholarships for nonpublic school children. The U.S. Catholic Bishops strongly support giving parents choices in their children's education: "Parents—the first and most important educators have a fundamental right to choose the education best suited to the needs of their children, including public, private, and religious schools. Government, through such means as tax credits and publicly funded scholarships, should help provide resources for parents, especially those of modest means, to exercise this basic right without discrimination." (Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship, 2012) Please join with the Missouri Bishops in seeking passage of CEI. THOSE EXTRA POUNDS

Did you know that for every extra pound of body fat you carry, your heart needs to pump blood through an extra mile's worth of blood vessels; an immense burden on your heart? For instance, if you are 10 pounds overweight, there are 10 extra miles of blood vessels you are carrying around.

Obesity also increases your likelihood of developing diabetes, and high blood pressure, all of which put you at a greater risk for heart attacks and strokes.

Obesity also makes it more difficult to remain active. The more sedentary your life styles, the greater your risk for heart disease. Fortunately, by reducing your weight to normal levels, you can also reduce your risk of developing these disorders. Incorporate a healthy, balanced eating plan with a regular exercise program. Exercise for 20-30 minutes at least 3-5 times per week and you will notice a big difference. Getting up to change channels on the TV, walking the steps, sweeping, etc, etc, etc, are just some simple ways to increase your activity. TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

We are faced with strong and disturbing readings today that hold a certain fascination, since they seem at first glance to be blueprints for future inevitable wars and hardship. A fundamentalist interpretation focuses on this aspect. Yet we hear them at our Sunday celebration of the Eucharist, which infuses them with hope and optimism. Rather than dreading the future, today's liturgy assures us that God is with us in all of life's inevitable trials, and that we have a role in shaping the outcome of human history. Occasionally, some Christians have attempted to decode these readings for an exact measure of the world's end, but they have thus far been disappointed.

"Nothing lasts forever" is a lyric from a Broadway show. Stars fall from the sky, leaves wither and fall, mountains wash into the sea, human projects and governments totter and collapse with great regularity. Today's liturgy opposes this idea as incomplete, reminding us that Christ has made a permanent change in human history, and that life in him is life forever. Rather than inviting us to throw in the towel, today's liturgy strengthens us for acts of goodness and grace in our families, communities, and world.
