



WHAT DRIVES US TO LOOK FOR SOMETHING? A treasured heirloom lost or an unfulfilled dream. Our boredom or dissatisfaction with the way things are now. A desire or passion for a possibility that motivates us to move forward. While objects and dreams, hopes and desires can certainly fuel our drive and determination, more than anything else other people most often inspire us. The insight of a best friend. The guidance of a trusted teacher. The unconditional love of a family member. Other people help us to discover our truest and best selves, to love ourselves. And that love is a much more unfailing source of energy than anything else.

Today's Gospel reminds us people were driven to the repentance and new understanding of themselves they found in John the Baptist. But, John himself needed to know who Jesus, the Christ, was! Is he the fulfillment of my heart's desire? Matthew here (and so often in his Gospel) reminds us in clear and concrete ways that Jesus is the healing and hope of all whose minds and hearts are open to listen and receive what they need and desire, what God has to offer.

Matthew also reminds us that each of us—and our community as a whole—have a **prophetic greatness** because we are baptized members of the Body of Christ, the Church. And it only takes **two things for us to be great prophets**. First, **stay close to God**. Be in a vital relationship of some kind with others who believe in Jesus Christ. And, second, **be close to the real life** lived by your family, friends, and neighbors—life on Earth as it really is! In this is our treasure as well as the fulfillment of the prayers of all who need God to be with them.

THE EVIDENCE OF THE WORKS OF CHRIST that John was looking for and found in Jesus are very clear in our community. As we now come to the end of the year and once again look to the future, please join me in giving thanks to God for all the ways in which our parish members contribute to the life and welfare of our parish as well as commit themselves to the good of the communities in which we live.

At present there are **54 different parish ministries, organizations, and activities** that provide our members with opportunities for enjoying themselves, for developing their interests and abilities, and for serving the needs of others. Take time today to thank God for the vitality of our parish and to renew your commitment to the presence and work of Christ among us. WINTERIZE YOUR SKIN

Cold winds, long, hot showers and dry indoor air can combine to make your skin dry and irritated in the winter. Here's how to keep it soft and supple:

- **BATHE or shower in lukewarm water, not hot.** Hot water removes natural oil from the skin.
- **LIMIT showers to 10 minutes.**
- **IF you do take a hot bath, add bath oils to your water.**
- **USE mild soaps.** Deodorant soaps can be more drying to the skin.
- **APPLY cream, ointment or lotion moisturizers to your skin immediately after a bath or shower while your skin is still wet.** This helps trap the water in the upper layers of the skin to make it less dry and itchy.
- **SHAVE using lotion or hair conditioner instead of shaving foam.**
- **PUT on hand cream to seal in moisture immediately after washing your hands.**
- **OUTDOORS, use sunscreen with SPF of 15 or greater, and a lip balm with SPF...snow reflects harmful UV sunlight.**



**Support Our Parish by Making a Planned Gift This Year
 Use Your IRA to Make a Gift & Save Taxes**

IF YOU'RE OVER THE AGE OF 70½, tax laws now allow you to make charitable gifts through your traditional or Roth IRA, through the end of 2013. Gifts must be made by the IRA custodian directly to the charity and may not exceed \$100,000.

Although no charitable deduction is allowed, **you can avoid the tax you would otherwise pay on required distributions**. Giving from your IRA, rather than from others assets, may be especially appropriate if you use the standard deduction rather than itemizing your deductions. It might also be a good choice if you don't need all of your required minimum distribution or you wouldn't be able to deduct all of your charitable contributions because of deduction limitations. Here are some **opportunities for giving to support our parish** that this legislation now makes possible.

Increase Your Annual Giving IRA funds are heavily taxed whenever you draw them out, at rates as high as 35%. You can divert the tax collector's "take" from your IRA to Holy Name of Jesus Parish..

For example, suppose you're in a 25% tax bracket and normally give \$1,000 each year in support of our parish. Instead of writing a check each week or month or once a year, you could instruct your IRA trustee to send us \$1,333 from your account, the tax would have been \$333 in a 25% bracket. That \$333 now can be used to assist parish ministries and programs - all paid for by the IRS.

Annual Distribution Gifts Under these rules, IRA gifts will count toward mandatory annual distributions required of individuals over the age of 70½. That means IRA gifts can reduce your taxes for 2013.

For example, Charlie must withdraw at least \$20,000 from his IRA this year, even though he doesn't need the money for living expenses.

Charlie can now direct that the \$20,000 be paid to Holy Name of Jesus Parish from his IRA prior to taking any distribution and reduce his federal taxes by \$5,600 in his 28% tax bracket.

Major Gifts If you are intending to make a planned major gift to our parish after you die, you may want to consider making such a gift during your lifetime and enjoying the benefit it will have for our parish now.

Bernice planned to leave a gift of \$25,000 to our parish in her will. Now she can direct that gift be made from her IRA this year.
