



I WAS ONCE ASKED TO GIVE A TALK on God's plan for the future of the Church. It was a frightening and humbling request. I spent days trying to find out who had turned in my name to the planning committee. I began to wonder, "*If I say 'Yes' to this, just what would I say?*" My first thoughts on this—and I now think my best—came from the Prophet Isaiah (49:6) as he spoke about this same thing to the People of God: "***I will make you a light to the nations, that my salvation may reach to the ends of the Earth.***" Later, in Matthew's Sermon on the Mount (5:14) Jesus will also address the disciples about this and proclaim, "***You are the light of the world.***"

There is a growing tradition on the national holiday honoring the birth and life of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. that we **do something on behalf of justice**, that we take some action for the greater wholeness (holiness) and salvation (healing) of our community, country, and world.

Recently our parish made a public commitment to work with other churches and congregations for unity and harmony in our community. Over 150 of our parish members signed The Covenant commitment below. Monday would be a good day for us all to again reflect on this Covenant as well as to pray for energy, patience, understanding, and steadfast love as we put it into practice.









WINTER WOES

Winter is here! We already have snow storms, and those with children, 4-5 snow days. And Winter is not even half over. With winter comes the usual complaints and comments, "It's too cold...," "I hate all this slush and slop..."

"The kids are driving me ...," just to state a few. Winter doesn't have to be so much doom and gloom. Especially if we are safe in the ice and snow to avoid winter falls.

- Before it freezes, cover surfaces around your home with de-icer, rock salt, sand, or kitty litter. Carry a small bag in your car or pocket to sprinkle on patches of ice when you find them.
- Look out for broken paving or cracked sidewalks. If a surface looks slippery, try to walk on the grass.
- Wear proper-fitting boots or shoes with wide, low heels and rubber soles, not smooth leather.
- Snow and ice cleats that fit over your boots and shoes will grip the ice and give you the most traction. Make sure they are easy to put on and take off before purchasing a pair.
- Carry a flashlight. It will make it easier for you to see and make you more visible to passing drivers.
- Walk flat footed, not on your toes, lengthen your stride and give yourself extra time.

If you find someone who has fallen outdoors and can't get back on their feet, call 911. Don't try to move them. Keep them as warm as possible and stay with them until help arrives.

If you are someone who insists on shoveling your own drive, here are a few tips to help keep you safe. 1. Wear layers and make sure you are warm enough. 2. Do not wait until the end of a snowfall to begin shoveling, heavy snow is harder to shovel and wears us out quicker. 3. Shovel at intervals, make 2-3 paths across the drive and then take a 10 minute break. It may take longer, but it is safer and not so exhausting. 4. Finish up with a hot cup of tea or cocoa, or a bowl of hearty chicken soup.

Winter is not all doom and gloom. Many wonderful, family traditions are begun in the winter, with the holidays. Snow days bring cheer and laughter from children and maybe a bonus phone call from grandchildren bored with being at home. Game nights are initiated because there are no outdoor sports to be played. But most of all, because our **Savior** is born, and this in itself is why winter is so wonderful.

May God's love shine upon each and everyone of you this Christmas season, and may He guide us this New Year to be even more generous and charitable.



TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The symbols and actions of baptism evolved around the experience of adults dying to old patterns of life and rising from the waters of baptism as new creations. As for newborn babies, at first it was desired to wait until the following Easter, when they could be baptized, anointed with chrism, and given a taste of the Eucharist in association with adults. The Church was always willing to baptize adults in emergency situations outside the Easter timetable, and in time, since infancy itself was a life-threatening situation, the baptism of babies became commonplace. As with the "emergency" adult baptisms, it was required that parents bring the child, as soon as health was recovered, to the bishop for the full menu of sacraments.

The very real fear of death for infants thus created a situation in which the three sacraments drifted apart from each other, and away from their original, adult celebration at Easter. Today, at last, we know a great deal about how our practices evolved. This knowledge is reshaping how we celebrate Easter, how we receive adult faith, and how we structure the faith journey of children.
