





#### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The prayers surrounding baptism often speak of being "clothed in Christ," and clothes are an important consideration. In ancient times, adults were probably baptized without any clothes at all, and old texts survive asking people to leave fancy garb and jewelry behind as they enter the font. Baptism was typically in a private place, the community waited elsewhere, and the casting off of clothing was hardly a public moment, nor was it embarrassing in ancient cultures where privacy was largely unknown.

Nonetheless, what was left behind on one side of the font was replaced on the other as a white robe was wrapped around the newly baptized. It was a robe of honor, a dazzling sign of a new beginning for a society that valued clothing as a sign of personal identity. For the newly baptized, a whole week in white garments was the rule, through the second Sunday of Easter, called "Sunday *in Albis*," because of all the folks wearing their baptismal robes.


- St. Norbert is hosting a Parish Mission during CSW with the theme "Renew Our Hearts." They will focus on their school and parish together as a community of faith.
- Christ, Light of the Nations will be making 1,000 sandwiches as a school community for St. Vincent de Paul Parish to hand out to the homeless, and a volunteer from the outreach program will speak to students about their ministry.
- St. Rose Philippine Duchesne students are participating in a hockey puck "shootout" during gym class this month, raising funds for the St. Louis Blues 14 Fund to promote health and wellness of youth in the St. Louis community.
- Blessed Teresa of Calcutta will be hosting special guests during a "Dining with Dads" luncheon and participating in acts of charity on "Outreach Day."
- St. Ferdinand will begin an ongoing student ambassadors program where students will be making announcements and handing out bulletins to parishioners at weekend masses.



#### Alive in Christ **Scholarships**

The Alive in Christ Scholarship Program for 2014-15 will also launch during Catholic Schools

Week. This Archdiocesan-wide program offers scholarships of \$1,000-\$2,000 based on financial need to students entering a Catholic elementary school in the Archdiocese in Kindergarten - 4th grade, as well as to those students currently enrolled in a Catholic school whose families qualify. The scholarships are awarded on a first-come, first-served basis, with applications being accepted beginning January 27, 2014. Funding for the scholarships is from an assessment paid into the fund by every parish of the Archdiocese. #### **EXPLORE YOUR PARISH SCHOOL AT** THE OPEN HOUSE ON JANUARY 26

Your parish elementary school, along with the seven other schools in the Northeast Deanery, is kicking off the celebration of Catholic Schools Week with an Open House on Sunday, January 26, 2014. Each school location will be open during the hours of 1:00 and 3:00 p.m. (check with your school for exact times). Stop by for a tour, meet teachers and staff, learn about the curriculum and programs that your school offers,.

At the Open House, you will have a chance to meet with educators who view their teaching service in Catholic schools as a ministry as well as a profession. These teachers continue their work together, outside of their individual schools, in Professional Learning Teams (PLTs). They gather monthly throughout the school year, by grade level in lower grades and by subject area in the upper grades. This year's focus has been a book study of education standards, and using protocols for fine tuning lesson plans to improve student learning. Most recently, the PLTs met at St. Rose Philippine Duchesne on January 10th.

### Feast of the Presentation of the Lords—Blessing of Candles:

On the weekend of February 2 the Church celebrates the Feast of the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple, also called Candlemas. This feast comes 40 days after Christmas and recalls the event when, while being presented in the temple, a man named Simeon call Him "A light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel."

This feast is a festival of light, and the liturgy begins with a blessing of candles. Candles are a sign of God's presence to us, not only in church but at home as well. Candles in the home can be used at our dinner table, when communion is brought to the sick, special family celebration, anytime we gather in the home for prayer. We invite parishioner to bring candles to church when you come to Mass on Feb. 1-2. There will be a table set up in the back of church, place them on the table to be blessed and then after Mass, take them home for use in the home.
