I help make it what it is.


It will be **friendly**, if I am. Its pews will be **filled**, if I help fill them. It will do **great work**, if I work.

The Connection People Count On

DURING THE 2nd VATICAN COUNCIL bishops from around the world asked the question, “*What constitutes the Church in the modern world?*” The Council stated that the “constitution” upon which the Church was founded is **Jesus Christ**. They also chose the title “**Light of the Nations**” for Christ to remind all who are baptized of mission of Christ—and the Church—in the world today. We are called to be the light.

They taught that every human being needs to know that they are called by God to be holy—in a relationship with God where a person knows their own goodness and the goodness of others. Such knowledge fuels our desire to be the light. Further, they said that the “first step” of this mission was and always

will be that we pay attention to “*the signs of the times*”. Like Jesus every member of the Church in the world today must “notice” peoples’ joy and hope, their grief and pain. And, once noticed, we must celebrate and show compassion in the name of Jesus Christ.

Think of it this way. There are many people praying everyday for the fulfillment of their dreams and their needs—sometimes great, sometimes small, but always real. It is the plan

and purpose of God that our parish may be—and at times most certainly is—the fulfillment of the desires and expectations of the people we are called to serve. The Council bishops again believed that Jesus Christ and the Church are the “connection” that can be counted on for the fulfillment of what all peoples are waiting for. Anna and Simeon of today’s Gospel saw it! Can we?





Super Bowl and....
Human Trafficking.

As SSND's we are focusing on bringing awareness to a related issue that overshadows the sports event—human sex trafficking.

There is an 80% increase in trafficking to the area where the Super Bowl is being played. In 2010, in Miami, an estimated 10,000 prostitutes were brought to the city. In 2011, there were 133 underage prostitution (some as young as 5)arrests in Dallas.

Our Sisters in New Jersey have been part of a group working to bring awareness to the issue. Hotel and motel managers have been educated on how to spot trafficking activity and what to do.

It is our hope and prayer that Super Bowl XLVIII will be a Big Win in our nation's efforts to end Human Trafficking.

Please join in our endeavor by praying this prayer...maybe even at your Super Bowl Party!!

WHAT IS HAPPINESS?

Happiness as we conceive it dates back to the Enlightenment movement of the 18th century, the time frame of the U.S. Declaration of Independence, which states that we have the right to "life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness." Happiness isn't about always smiling, nor about maintaining a sunny façade when the chips are down. Psychologists differentiate between transitory happiness, such as the pleasure of a great hot fudge sundae, and enduring happiness.

Various techniques have been used to measure happiness; but most involve questionnaires. These questionnaires often measure happiness by assessing subjective well-being. There are physiological changes that occur when people are happy. These changes occur in the brain. People can also be "born happy." Researchers have found a genetic influence when it comes to being happy.

What makes us happy? Researchers have examined several possible factors with some surprising results.

Age: People become happier with age!

Religiousness & Spirituality: A Pew survey found that people who attend religious services weekly or more often are happier than those who attend less often.

Money: The link between money and happiness is complicated.

Marriage: Married people tend to be happier.

Strategies for happiness include, connecting socially, keep a positive attitude, be grateful and tend to your body!

Feast of the Presentation of the Lords—Blessing of Candles:

On the weekend of February 2 the Church celebrates the Feast of the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple, also called Candlemas. This feast comes 40 days after Christmas and recalls the event when, while being presented in the temple, a man named Simeon call Him “A light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel.”

This feast is a festival of light, and the liturgy begins with a blessing of candles. Candles are a sign of God’s presence to us, not only in church but at home as well. Candles in the home can be used at our dinner table, when communion is brought to the sick, special family celebration, anytime we gather in the home for prayer. We invite parishioner to bring candles to church when you come to Mass on Feb. 1-2. There will be a table set up in the back of church, place them on the table to be blessed and then after Mass, take them home for use in the home.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

By Candlemas, forty days after Christmas, February 2, the season of Christ's coming has depleted our candle supply. Soon, the parish will order a new paschal candle from a catalogue or candler, or in some communities, wax will be collected to be melted and molded. Last year's paschal candle shows the wear and tear of summer heat, or many funerals or baptisms.

Paschal candles have been around since at least the fourth century, when Constantine's biographer Eusebius reported that the night of the sacred vigil was "transformed into the brilliancy of day, by lighting throughout the city pillars of wax, while burning lamps in every place so that the splendor of this night was brighter than the brightest daylight."

Light was a precious commodity in the ancient world, and this lavish use of precious beeswax was a sign of the Christian's call to bear Christ's light into the world's darkness. In a pre-electric age, a whole city aglow from the paschal flame must have been a glorious sight, and a reminder to every baptized Christian of our vocation to "be the light of the world."
