

if I am a generous giver. It will bring other people into its **community**, if I invite and bring them.


It will be a parish of **loyalty and love**, of **fearlessness** and faith,

**Celebrating the Practice of Faith  
Using Your Brain ... For A Change**

**MATTHEW'S JESUS** did not come to change the society he live in, but to live in such a way—and teach others how to live—that society would not tear itself apart from within.

In the time of Jesus, relationships were primarily based on the proper and honorable way in which people ought to treat each other. Dishonorable behaviors required retaliation. In his "**honor based**" **society**, the purpose of the "ten" commandments was to minimize feuding and the potential annihilation of the People of God. So, Jesus challenges his followers to be better at the commandments than the Pharisees. In today's Gospel, Jesus reinterprets the commandments and offers his followers an honorable way out of retaliating and feuding that might lead to death. Jesus reshaped his society to a more humane form.

The United States is an "**economics based**" **society**. The values of individualism and materialism are held—more or less—in tension with spiritual values and the common good. When this tension is not set just right our society also needs a more humane form. Last November Pope Francis offered a challenge in the spirit of today's Gospel when he said,

*"I beg the Lord to grant us more politicians who are genuinely disturbed by the state of society, the people, the lives of the poor! It is vital that government leaders and financial leaders take heed and broaden their horizons, working to ensure that all citizens have dignified work, education, and health care."*

Often leaders will not work for a more humane society until they know that the minds, hearts, and will of the people want it. We might ask ourselves what "commandments" do we need to pay more attention to if we truly want to reshape our society and move our political leaders to act?

**Convenience and Security**—



2014 Parish Stewardship Renewal Initiative**

**OUR 2014 PARISH STEWARDSHIP RENEWAL APPEAL** is being very well received by the people of our Parish. Again I am most grateful to those who are helping to make this Appeal successful and to all for your support. Of the 190 Intention Cards returned on Commitment Weekend to date **127 families or individuals** (66.8%) have responded that they are able to make **a modest and sustained increase in their financial support for our parish**. Those responding represent a combined weekly increase of **\$ 965.25**. The average per family/individual increase in weekly offerings is **\$ 7.60**.

We are a worshipping community. Our service is a ministry to people, from birth to death, in the name of Jesus Christ. The “*we*” is all of us. We are a family. We are the Body of Christ, the Church. We rely and depend on each other to step forward and use our God-given skills and talents in a fruitful way.

During this past week those who have not yet responded to ***Our Parish Stewardship Renewal*** received a follow-up reminder letter about the importance of their participation and support for our parish. This mailing also contained a **Special Envelope**. Each family or individual should use this Special Envelope to **indicate your new level of giving** and to **make your first offering** of parish support at this new level. Put this Special Envelope in the basket when the Offertory collection is taken up at Mass. This way we will know your commitment and better be able to plan for the future. In the following weeks return to using your regular Offertory envelopes from the monthly packet that you receive by mail.

# THE GIFT OF LIFE

## BLOOD FACTS

- On any given day, an average of 38,000 units of red blood cells are needed for hospital patients in the United States.
- One in 10 people entering the hospital needs blood.
- Approximately **38%** of the population is eligible to donate blood, of those eligible, only a small percentage actually give blood.
- In the United States, someone needs a blood transfusion about every 2 seconds.
- The average adult body contains 10-12 pints of blood.
- There is no substitute for human blood, it cannot be manufactured.**
- Almost everyone will know someone who needs blood.
- Blood is often needed for traumas, heart surgeries, joint-replacement surgeries, organ transplants, premature babies, leukemia and cancer treatments and so much more.

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### Q. What medicines would prevent someone from donating?

**A.** In most cases, it is the condition for which the person is taking medicine that causes him or her to be unable to give blood, not the medications. Usually, if the condition is under control the day of the donation, the person is eligible to donate. This includes medicines for high blood pressure and diabetes.

### Q. What age do I have to be to donate blood?

**A.** Donors must be at least 17 years old. In Arkansas, Illinois, Kansas, Missouri, and Tennessee, 16 year olds may donate with a completed Parental Consent Form. **There is no upper age limit on donating.**





**TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**

In a few weeks' time, at the Chrism Mass of the diocese, fresh sacramental oils will be blessed and chrism consecrated for use in every parish. Olive oil is the main ingredient of chrism, but olive oil with some exotic additives that change its character and purpose. Rich balsam and perfumes separate chrism from the pantry. Food no longer, neither is this oil for grooming or toning muscles. It has a breathtaking aroma that is both alluring and enduring.

The prayer of consecration is a good meditation for the coming Lenten season since it focuses us on the goal of our journey, linking it with the olive bearing dove at the end of Noah's stormy voyage of forty days. The dove signaled the birth of a new world, a society reborn from the wreckage of the old, drowned world of sin. At the end of our Lenten journey, the oil of chrism will be poured down in abundance on the brows of catechumens and infants, as well as on those to be confirmed or ordained. Lent puts us in touch with the hard edges of life in need of salvation, and the chrism of Easter joy redeems and restores.
