### I help make it what it is.


It will be **friendly**, if I am. Its pews will be **filled**, if I help fill them.

*Celebrating the Disarming Power of Christian Love*  
**Doing Something Unexpected**

**IN THE TIME AND PLACE OF JESUS** to speak of “*love*” and “*hate*” meant paying attention to **external actions** more than talk of human emotions. Within the culture of the early Church human beings were “**group oriented**”. Christian love demonstrated “**attachment to the group**” and hate described “**detachment from or indifference to the group**”, freeing one to form a new attachment or friendship with Jesus or family association with other believers.

*Unexpected and generous love gains and holds another person's attention long enough for the knowledge of their goodness and God's love to really sink in.*

Matthew's Jesus urges more inclusive behavior. In Jesus' group, there is no room for selective attachment or aloofness. For Christian believers – then and now – to “**be perfect**” – means **accepting everyone without discrimination**, changing enemies into friends, even family.

Now try to remember a time when you were not perfect, but then were **surprised by the unexpected love of someone**. For me, the night I wrecked our one and only family car. My father's first words were, “*Are you alright?*”, not “*I'm going to kill you!*”, as I feared.

As we grow in faith, our own demonstrations of love strive to be more unexpected and generous to the point of gaining and holding another person's attention long enough for the knowledge of their goodness and God's love to really sink in.

## NIGHT LEG CRAMPS WHAT CAUSES THEM

A muscle cramp is an involuntary, sustained tightening of one or more of your muscles. It can result in intense pain. Night leg cramps are contractions usually in the back of the lower leg. They often occur just as you're falling asleep or just as you're waking up. Common causes of night leg cramps include:

- Muscle overexertion
- Prolonged sitting
- Dehydration
- Diabetes
- Decreased potassium levels
- Certain medications
- Alcohol use

If you do have a leg cramp, you may be able to make it go away by:

- Walking on the affected leg
- Massaging the affected muscle
- Straightening your leg and flexing your foot toward your knee until you feel the calf muscles stretch.
- Applying a cold pack to the affected muscle
- Taking a hot bath.

To help prevent night leg cramps:

- Drink plenty of fluids during the day
- Stretch your leg muscles before bedtime.

If you have frequent and severe cramps at night, TALK TO YOUR DOCTOR.
