



Our Calling to Worship



IN THE SPRING OF 2013 our Parish Liturgy

Committee began a review and discussion of the work we completed two years ago concerning the possible renovation needs of our worship space. The original plan proposed extensive work within the church and between the church and Community Center buildings. Though we chose not to begin these projects, our Liturgy Committee has continued to work on achieving some of the values that were identified during the planning process. One of the characteristics of

a vibrant parish is that they strive to insure that all parish members can actively participate in the celebration of the sacraments.

Last spring the Committee made several recommendations that focused on making our worship space more accessible for those who attend Mass here and for those who function as liturgical ministers for our celebrations of the Eucharist. At that time I accepted their recommendations and we began to make some of the changes last November. We also had already located altar furnishings from another church and began to develop a plan for financing their restoration for

Purposes for our Church Renovation Committee Commissioned in 2008 by our Parish Pastoral Council

for use in our church. Today I am very happy to announce that a donor has come forward who is willing to pay for the entire cost of the restoration and installation of more permanent furnishings for worship in our church. Quite possibly by Easter we will have a new **Altar of Sacrifice** and a new **Baptismal Font** as well as a new **Lectern** and pedestal for the **Pieta**. In preparation for these changes 14 pews will be removed from the back of church creating space for the Baptismal Font near the main entrance of the church (its traditional location) and more room for the gathering of family and friends when those who have died are waked in our church. All of these items have previously been used for worship by the Good Shepherd and Blessed Teresa of Calcutta parish communities. Join me today in thanking God for the generosity of our parish members, so often evident and in so many ways.

As our 2014 Parish Stewardship Renewal Appeal draws to a close I am again most grateful to all of our parish members who thus far have recommitted themselves to some level of financial support for our parish and the mission of Christ in our community. To date 164 families or individuals have responded that

they are able to make a modest and sustained increase in their financial support for our parish. This renewed commitment represents a combined weekly increase of \$1,134. The average per family/individual increase in weekly offerings is \$6.91. What a blessing for our parish members and mission.

I know that some households are still prayerfully considering what level of parish support will be realistic for them. Remember, every small weekly offering or an occasional gift—given out of gratitude to God—makes an important difference.

It is never too late! If you have not already done so, please use the **special stewardship envelope you received in the mail** to indicate your new level of giving and to make your offering, then return to your regular packet of envelopes.

In early May our Parish Finance Committee will report back to you on the actual increase we have seen in the **regular financial support** of our parish members.

As you may recall this year we have set **the goal** of covering **50%** of our expenses out of our **ordinary parish revenues**. We are hoping to achieve this goal through a combination of reduced spending and increased revenues. Our goal in the coming fiscal year will be **60%** of expenses. Our hope is to balance our parish budget over the next 5 years and to reduce the rate of spending from our parish savings.

OUT IN THE DRIVING RAIN?

When Spring makes it's appearance (and it will) the rains that come with it can be a real pain. Traffic backs up, visibility is poor and others drivers can blind you with a wave of water on your windshield. Here are some tips to help you stay safe:

LEAVE EARLY. Face it, traffic is bound to tie up. Give yourself at least 15 minutes extra to get to your destination.

BE PREPARED. Even the lightest rain shower can make the road surface slick as the water mixes with oil and rubber dust. Make sure your tires are properly inflated and have good tread.

DRIVE SLOWLY. Driving fast on wet roads can cause you to skid or hydroplane. To avoid these, slow down when roads are wet. TIP: If you hydroplane, ease off the gas until you can feel the road again. If you skid, ease your foot off the gas and steer in the direction of the skid. This will bring the rear of your car back in line with the front. WATCH FOR STANDING WATER: Stay in middle lanes-water tends to pool in the outside lanes. If you must pass through water, make sure it's not too deep or you may seriously damage your car. If you determine that it's safe to go on, proceed slowly to avoid making large waves in the water. After you pass through the water, test brakes by lightly tapping on them.

MAINTAIN DISTANCE. Add extra space between you and the vehicle in front. A car needs two to three times more stopping distance on wet pavement, so allow extra distance between care. It's harder to stop on wet pavement, and the spray from other vehicles can cause visibility problems.
