



Constructive Conversation

THE COMMUNITY OF JOHN, THE EVANGELIST, gives us the story today of a woman seeking water who finds salvation. A dramatic change brought about by an encounter with a tired, thirsty man who turns out to be far more than what he appears to be. It is Jesus who initiates the encounter, but the woman's willingness to pursue the conversation is crucial to the encounter's outcome. Her openness to seeking the truth opens her to receive the gift of Jesus' real presence and be changed in the process.

For all of us the gift of salvation a redeemed life or a new depth of relationship with others—is born of the willingness to learn how to have constructive conversations with each other. Families, friends, communities, and nations are blessed when they are able and willing to do so. Knowing this, we can proclaim with the woman at the well that Jesus is the Savior of the world.

The Lenten/Easter season might be a good time to ask the question, "With whom ought I/we be having better or more constructive conversations?" As you take up this exercise ask

yourself, How would you imagine the conversation going? How would you want to write the script? What should be talked about? What new attitudes will I need to have in order to get to a new place in the relationship? Even to experience the real presence of Christ, the promise of God's love?

OFTEN PARISH LEADERS are called to be "conversation starters" or the ones who have been commissioned to "keep the conversation going". In today's bulletin you will find detailed information about our parish pastoral priorities and the work of our **Parish Pastoral Council** to achieve these priorities. We're also announcing the membership of our new **School Board** and their leadership role in the evangelizing mission of our parish.

I encourage you to give your attention to the work of all parish leaders. Pray for them and support them in everyway you are able and willing to do so. As we continue the conversation with each other and within the community we are here to serve, we will experience—as disciples and even as strangers to each other—new life in Christ and the urge to pass it on to others!

Striving to Insure the Presence of the Church in North County Parish Pastoral Council Activity

Over the past few months our Council has identified three major pastoral priorities for our parish for the next few years. These priorities and goals they've identified for themselves are listed below. You are encouraged to review them today.

If you have **an interest** in knowing more about any one of these goals, or if you have **an expertise** you'd like to share toward our achieving these goals, please contact Father Mike (314-868-2310) or Greg Warnusz (314-867-5018). If you are **asked by a Council member to assist** in some of this work, please make every effort to share your time and talent. Our Council is committed to the vibrancy of our parish and the work of the Church in the communities we serve.

Pastoral Priorities & Goals for Holy Name of Jesus Parish

Priority #1—Increasing parish MEMBERSHIP

- 1. To recruit, train, and organize a telephone committee of 25-30 persons to contact 80%-100% of our registered parish households by December 31st, 2014 in order to acknowledge active members, to encourage inactive members, and to gather information concerning needs and census data
- 2. To introduce and discuss the Associate Membership initiative with 90%-100% of our parish leadership groups, key ministries, and organizations in order to enroll 10-12 new Associate Members by September 1st, 2014
- 3. To recruit, train, and organize 3-6 Evangelization Teams (3 persons per team) by September 1st, 2014, to create a welcoming atmosphere at social and outreach activities for parish members and non-members
- 4. To establish a "Millennials" Ministry by identifying young adults (20-35 year olds) living in our parish (at home/on their own) and by hold focus groups with them to understand the challenges they face and to gather information that may guide the organization of ministry to and with this age group

Priority #2—Organizing the **STEWARDSHIP** of parish resources

- 5. (In conjunction with the Parish Finance Committee) To achieve a balanced parish budget over the next 6 years (FY13—FY19) at a rate of 6% 12% progress per year
- 6. To recruit and organize a Stewardship "Core Team" of 4-5 persons to be responsible for stewardship education in our parish and for involving 20%-30% of our registered parish members in ministries, organizations, and activities of our parish by June 30th, 2015
- 7. To identify 2-3 parish leaders to assist Fr. Mike to collaborate with the Archdiocesan Office of Stewardship and the Annual Catholic Appeal in discerning/defining our eligibility for a grant from the Archdiocesan Ensuring Parish Viability Endowment by the August 31st, 2014 application deadline

Priority #3—Establishing **PARTNERSHIPS** that enable parish outreach

- 8. To identify, describe, and prioritize 3-5 human development needs within our parish community and solicit 1-2 potential partners by June 30th, 2014, with whom we will begin to discuss how we might form an alliance for addressing these needs
- 9. (In conjunction with the School Board) To recruit and organize an 8-10 member team to write and recommend to our School Board a new 3 year strategic plan for Christ Light of the Nations School by October 1st, 2014



Fr. Mike and Fr. Tom are happy to announce the appointment of the new School Board for our parish school. The Board begins their orientation and service of leadership this week. We encourage you to keep them and their work on behalf of our school and parishes in your prayers.

They are committed to using their faith in God and leadership abilities to renew and inspire the Christ Light of the Nations School and parish communities so that each person achieves their fullest potential and witnesses to the God's love in Christ.

Their on-going responsibilities are—

To establish and oversee strategic planning and policy development in order to enhance and communicate the affordability, accessibility, and Catholic identity of our school

To foster and maximize stakeholder involvement and ownership of our school so that everyone's talent and experience contributes to the education/formation of our children, their families, and our community

To guide and challenge the faith development of our school community for the sake of our school's evangelizing mission

PLEASE NOTE THE NEW GUIDELINE FOR THE DAILY MASS SCHEDULE

In response to some questions raised concerning multiple weekday Masses, the following new guideline will be in place beginning Wednesday, March 26 2014.

When we come together to worship and the pews are even a little more full it serves to make our worship at Mass more reflective of a Parish Family. When an appropriate instance to have Mass on a weekday arises outside of the regular schedule there is an importance that supersedes having multiple Masses; grieving families being supported, organizations being strengthened, a more enlivened awareness and bonding of fellow parishioners.

Coupled with that, the norm is; a priest would say one Mass per day, two Masses being the exception, and three, although doable, is draining. With these things in mind, when there is a special Mass scheduled Monday through Friday such as a funeral or Day of Prayer, that Mass will become the Parish Mass for the day. This will be in place of the 6:30 am and/or the 8:00 am Mass that would normally take place that morning. This includes civic holidays when funerals are allowed. The schedule will be reflected through the bulletin in the Mass Intentions column. In addition, funerals that are scheduled between weekends will be announced at daily Mass. The first occurrence concerning the guideline will be on Wednesday, March 26 2014 at the 11:30 am Mass for the Women's Day of Reflection. As noted on the fliers for this Day of Reflection, all are welcome and encouraged to attend.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Especially during the Lent and Easter seasons, we are very conscious of the communal nature of baptism. We stand witness to the baptism of adults at the Easter Vigil in many parishes, and countless parishes celebrate festive baptisms for infants. The rule for celebrating baptism is that it be only once a day in any parish church, a sign of the Church's desire that baptism be the work of the gathered community. "Private baptism" is therefore a misnomer, since all baptisms, even emergency baptisms for infants in danger of death, are a public act of entrance in to the Body of Christ, the Church.

In an emergency, and providing the parents desire it, anyone can baptize by pouring water and saying, "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." But then afterward the Church is encouraged to supply what is missing: the gathered assembly to proclaim and hear God's word, the promises, the naming, the anointings, the clothing with a white garment, the candle, the Lord's Prayer, and the solemn blessing of the parents at the altar. Wonderfully, this ritual often provides the opportunity for great rejoicing at the recovery of an infant who had been in danger.
