

I help make it what it is.


It will be **friendly**, if I am.


THERE IS NO VIRTUE IN SUFFERING! Rather, as much as we are able, we are called to relieve and eliminate suffering. God has blessed humanity and human societies with a wealth of knowledge and understanding, with scientific skills and technical abilities, with more news of our neighbor's need, and with an expanded sense of compassion. We are **gifted to engage suffering, to continue the redemptive work of Christ**—restoring all persons and parts of creation to their “original grace-fullness”.

As we begin Holy Week it may be helpful to remember that the earliest communities of Christian faith got started out of the experience of “coming to life”. This “**new life**” that redemptive work made possible **fueled their energies and abilities for continuing the work of redemption.**

Curiously only after the experience of “resurrection” did they think it would be important to write down and remember the stories of the passion and death of Jesus. Why? Most of our sufferings—as well as the sufferings of others—sooner or later we tend to forget. Most of the time this is a healthy and good thing. But, knowing they were **called to sustain the redemptive work of Christ, to stay engaged with sinful people and a yet imperfect world,** they wanted and needed “the mind of Christ” for a way of life envisioned their own passion and death.

Keep in mind as you hear the “**Passion Narratives**” proclaimed this week that they were **written by people who knew that the crucifixion was not an accident.** It was **on purpose!** Jesus was **not the victim** of the violence against him, he was **the reigning King** of a New Heaven and a New Earth.

With these earliest believers and with countless communities of faith ever since then, let us come together often this week to remember and celebrate the “**passionate love**” of God for us in Jesus. Why? So that we may continue to discover and strengthen such “**intentional love**” in our community. In some ways this is the only virtue in suffering—that great love always brings us and many others to New Life.



GIVE YOURSELF A TOUR OF THE CHURCH

TODAY. Get a close up look for yourself at our new Altar of Sacrifice, Baptismal Font, Lectern, and Shrine of the Pieta. Give yourself some time to experience each of the areas of our worship space intended to make our celebrations of the liturgy more accessible for our liturgical ministers and community.

In particular, we've created space for the baptismal font near the main entrance of the church (its traditional location) to remind us that we are called to be a welcoming and evangelizing community. This area will also now better accommodate the gathering of family and friends when those who have died are waked in our church. On behalf of our parish I am most grateful for the donor who funded the entire cost of the restoration and installation of these furnishings. Such generosity and every other form of stewardship insures the presence and work of our parish here for many years to come.

HEART DISEASE

Heart disease includes a number of problems affecting the heart and the blood vessels in the heart. Among all U.S. women who die each year, 1 in 4 dies of heart disease. African American and Hispanic American/Latina women tend to have more risk factors for heart disease than white women.

- Coronary artery disease (CAD) is the most common type of heart disease. With CAD, your arteries become hard and narrow, which can lead to chest pain and heart attack.
- Take steps to lower your risk of heart disease:
 - * Know your blood pressure
 - * Don't smoke. If you smoke, try to quit.
 - * Get tested for diabetes.
 - * Have your cholesterol and triglyceride levels tested. Your doctor may advise you to lower them.
 - * Maintain a healthy weight.
 - * Limit alcohol to no more than one drink a day.
 - * Find healthy ways to cope with stress.
- Heart disease often has no symptoms. But, chest or arm pain or discomfort can be a warning sign of a heart attack. Other signs include shortness of breath, dizziness, nausea, abnormal heartbeats, and feeling very tired.
- If you think you, or someone else may be having a heart attack, wait no more than a few minutes—5 at most—before calling 911.

Heart Healthy Tip

Get at least 7 hours sleep per night and if there is time in your day, sneak some naptime!
