



**Celebrating Our Calling to be a Community of Hope
Graceful Encounters**

WELCOME TO ALL WHO ARE JOINING US for the celebration of Easter and to all who are parish members as we most surely give thanks to God for Jesus, the Christ—our reason for hope. This past week and for the coming seven weeks we have and will continue to immerse ourselves in the passionate love of God for us revealed in the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Hopefully Lent has given us the opportunity to remember and renew our faith, to re-connect with God in a personal way.

The real joy and excitement of the Easter Season—as our Scriptures reveal and remind us—is that the personal experience of faith fueled the communal commitment to continue work of Jesus—to love the world to death!

This is the time of year when Catholics must continue to ask themselves this question: *Are we hopeful people?* Two questions might be helpful as you explore your own hopefulness and look for evidence of hope in our parish community: *Are we (am I) tempted to believe that we've been wasting our lives? How sure are we (am I) that the good we do, God will finish, bring to completion?*

Today and for the weeks to come, pay attention to the “**enthusiastic**” people presented to us in the New Testament readings for Mass. The word itself means “**to be possessed by God**”, in other words, these are people “**under the influence**” of God. You will notice that they are unrestrained. They hurry to tell their friends and family, and even complete strangers, about the difference God has made in their life. They also demonstrate how God works through them for the good of others. Good news must be shared. Hope cannot be contained.

Happy Easter! And do spend some time during the Easter Season listing and giving thanks for each and every one of your “**enthusiasms**”. These may well be your own most graceful close encounters with God, the source of your hope and the means by which God intends our parish to be the fulfillment of the promise of new life for many others.



NEXT SUNDAY WE WILL CELEBRATE during the 10:30am Mass in our church the **First Communion** of children from our parish and Our Lady of the Rosary Parish. This will be a joint celebration of Sunday Mass with members of both parishes coming together for this most important moment in the life of our children. There will be no 10:30am Mass next week at Our Lady of the Rosary Parish. Their parishioners and all in our parish are encouraged to attend this Mass in our church next weekend. The experience of our joint Parish Mission last year enriched the spirit of community and faith that we share with each other. As we continue to look for ways of coming together we can be sure that the vitality of our faith and the presence of the Church in our communities will be strong and hopeful. Please do all that you can to encourage and welcome all to the celebration.


