We're On A Mission From God—Human Development

HUMAN DEVELOPMENT IS ANY ACTIVITY that a person or community engages in for the sake of personal growth (mind, heart, body, and soul)—one's own or that of others. Since God calls us to grow and to be an instrument of others growing, it is always **a work of evangelization**.

Pope Francis urges us to be realistic about this without losing our joy, our courage, or our hope.

With this mission in mind our Finance Committee has recommended to me a parish budget for next year that continues to focus on parish vibrancy while moving us toward a balanced budget by July 2018.

We project ending the current fiscal year with 56.1% of our expenses being covered by ordinary revenues—6.1% higher than expected.

We anticipate for the coming fiscal year that our total income will be 1.7% lower (\$7,752) than this year and our total expenses 6.7% lower (\$5,440). While we have lowered our total personnel costs by \$27,716 (10.2%), we have also seen some increase in benefits and program expenses.

The approved budget for the coming year is still a deficit budget with a goal of covering **60%** of all expenses out of ordinary revenues. In order to achieve this goal we will need to work toward **some combination of the following outcomes:**

Increase Anticipated Revenues

(\$449,560) by \$35,922
(A \$9,346 weekly collection)

And / Or

Decrease Anticipated Expenses

(\$809,137) by \$69,137

Your continuing commitment to an increase in Sunday giving has made an important difference, as is your on-going participation in Sunday Mass and our parish life and activities.

Confirmation is complicated, at least in its history. It arose in response to real problems deeply felt, not the least of which was the desire of the bishop to minister to all who were baptized. But it also has to do with the early crisis of how to deal with persons baptized by congregations that had broken bonds with the greater church: heretics. People reasoned that no matter how wrong-headed the minister might be, Christ would always work in the waters of baptism. No matter what, God would sweep aside all human obstacles to claim the new life in the water. They were not so sure about the ability of someone who had broken with the church to confer the Spirit.

By the fifth century, already-baptized persons coming into the church were anointed with chrism but not rebaptized. This anointing with *Myron* or chrism was seen as an act of reconciliation by the church, and a seal upon the commitments vowed by the newcomer. Today, we preserve this ancient practice by never “rebaptizing” Christians who have been baptized in water in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We affirm the candidates’ baptismal dignity, and we celebrate confirmation at their first reception of the Eucharist.

SUN-PROOF YOUR SKIN

Over 80% of skin cancers could be avoided by protecting oneself from the sun's rays. That's why health experts say to stay out of the sun between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m., when harmful UV rays are strongest. Problem is, on a fine summer day, that's hard advice to follow. So here's how to protect your skin no matte what:

- WEAR protective, tightly woven clothing, still one of the best ways to block rays and protect you skin.
- ADD a wide-brimmed hat, with a brim at least 4 inches wide.
- SHIELD your eyes by wearing sunglasses with UV protective lenses.
- USE a broad-spectrum sunscreen that protects against UVA and UVB rays and has a SBF of 15 or greater-even on cloudy days.
- APPLY EARLY. It takes at least 20 minutes for the sunscreen's active ingredients to penetrate the skin to protect it.
- POUR IT ON the recommended amount (an ounce, or about a palmful), is recommended.
- KEEP IT UP. Sunscreens need to be reapplied every 2 hours for maximum protection in the midday sun.






