## Celebrating the Presence of the Catholic Church in North County

### Come to the Table of Plenty

**TODAY'S GOSPEL AFFIRMS** something especially important about Jesus' pastoral manner. Namely, that it was his custom to reach out to those whom the righteous discounted as unworthy of God or salvation. The great feast given by God is for all those who would let themselves be gathered. "**Community**" is one of the four essential characteristics of a parish—that we work hard at "**gathering ourselves**" and at "**extending the invitation**" to all others around us. For almost 10 years we have been striving to do this that we might remain a strong presence in the local communities we serve.

We are now called to review the 2005 plan that reorganized our parish and Deanery for the sake of "*the needs of the Church in our time and place*". Hopefully we will again do so with the "*generous obedience of Christ who does the will of the Father in all things*" and with the same hope that "*will bring new life and growth to the Church*".

As we begin three **Briefing Sessions for Parish Leaders** will be held on *Budget Trends & Capital Improvements* (October 26th), our new *School Strategic Plan* (November 23rd), and *Parish Ministry & Staff Positions* (December 28th). These sessions are meant to **communicate information** about parish finances and ministry, the needs of the future, and strategies we need to develop to remain a vibrant parish. Parish leaders, especially our Pastoral Council, need this information and need to talk with each other as we continue to implement our parish vision and pastoral priorities.

In addition to these Briefing Sessions we will also participate in the proposed planning initiative described below. This effort will survey and address the pastoral ministry and sacramental needs of all parishes in our Archdiocese based on the **projected future number of priests and deacons** available for service in our parishes. At present across the Archdiocese there are not enough priests to fully staff all of the parishes we now have. And, during the coming 10 years it is probable that our Northeast County Deanery will have 3 to 5 fewer priests available for service.

## ARCHDIOCESAN PARISH PLANNING INITIATIVE

### (Phase 1) FALL 2014

Archbishop Carlson begins a parish planning initiative with the priests and deacons of the Archdiocese to determine how the projected future number of priests can best serve the people in each of the 10 deaneries of our Archdiocese. This phase will survey how our parishes are now organized and how ministry is provided for in each parish.

### (Phase 3) SPRING 2015

Parish surveys will be developed and used in every deanery proposing new models for parish leadership and gathering more information for planning purposes.

### WINTER 2015 (Phase 2)

Working closely with one priest from each deanery (the Dean) the Archbishop will evaluate and present for discussion among the priests and deacons the survey results. Appropriate and realistic models for parish leadership will be identified and discussed.

### SUMMER 2015 (Phase 4)

Parish surveys will be analyzed and results shared. Based on surveys a concrete pastoral plan for each deanery will be developed and a timeline for implementation determined. The general principles for the pastoral plan for parishes will be shared publicly.

## HEARING LOSS

If you take your ears for granted, listen up: hearing loss is the third most common health problem in the United States. **It is also on the rise.** When hearing goes, it affects life and relationships.

Age, illness and genetics are some conditions that can contribute to hearing loss. But over several generations, modern life has added a host of ear-damaging elements to the list. This includes medications and numerous sources of loud, continuous noise.

Advanced **age** is the most common cause of hearing loss. One out of 3 people age 65-74 have some level of hearing loss, that incidence becomes 1 out of 2 in people over 75 years old. **Noise** wears down hearing when it is loud and continuous. Certain **medications** can impair hearing and/or balance. More than 200 medications can have hearing loss as a side-effect; some medications are more toxic than others. Certain **illnesses**, such as heart disease, high blood pressure, and diabetes put ears at risk. These illnesses can cause decreased blood supply to the inner ear, causing hearing loss. And **trauma** to the skull can cause sudden hearing loss.

Whatever the cause of hearing loss is, there is help! There are places to go to help with hearing loss. The first thing to do is to acknowledge that your hearing is not as sharp as it used to be.

CENTER FOR HEARING & SPEECH has a program for those that live in the following zip codes: 63106, 63107, 63112, 63113, 63115, & 63147. If you live and can show proof you live in any of these zip codes, or you are a patient at any Grace Hill Health Center, you could qualify for a free hearing aid. You will only pay \$30 for the hearing test. You will pay nothing for the hearing aid. You must be scheduled for your hearing test by December 31, 2014 in order to qualify for this program. The number to call is 314-968-4710. There is a half sheet yellow paper in the vestibule with all the information, please share with family and friends if they live in the above zip codes.
