**Missionaries to the Nations: Our St. Louis Priests  
who serve in Bolivia**

On Sunday, August 2nd, the collection will be taken for the support of the Latin America Apostolate of the Archdiocese of Saint Louis. This collection supports the presence of our 4 Saint Louis Priest Missionaries in Bolivia. Bolivia continues to suffer from a severe shortage of native Priest. In St. Louis we have roughly 1 Priest for each 2,000 Catholics. In Bolivia, the ration is 1 Priest for each 20,000 Catholics. Our Priest Missionaries are helping to train native Priests in Bolivia. In addition, they proclaim the Gospel, celebrate the sacraments, and offer pastoral care to their parishioners. Due to great poverty in Bolivia, many people are living in conditions we can barely imagine—without access to clean water or sanitation or food.
