The Church is the People of God

Honestly we might say that knowing and understanding that we are the “People of God” is sort of a “recovered memory”—something we had forgotten and needed to remember. This has happened in our lifetimes in the work of the 2nd Vatican Council and among Catholics ever since the 1960s.

This past year it happened as we took time once again to assess our viability as a parish, to be sure of our strengths (assets) and weaknesses (deficits), and to consider ways of organizing our parish for the work of Christ in our community. All this is what it means to be “the visible sign of saving unity”.

This **work of remembering** who we are and why we are here involves several **clearly defined values** that are becoming more **common place** in our Church and **typical** in the life and work of many parishes.

THE PEOPLE OF OUR PARISH

Parish leaders commit themselves to keeping all parish members informed about and engaged in the life of our parish — including their responsibility to ...



DETERMINE OUR VIABILITY

Parish leaders and members regularly assess themselves as a faith community in the areas of worship, service, evangelization, and administration in order to ...



DECIDE OUR PARISH MODEL

Parish leaders choose the best way to organize the life of the parish and to utilize parish resources.

Archbishop Carlson relies on parishes to cultivate these values and to fulfill these responsibilities. In doing so they support him as he decides how best to use the priests of our Archdiocese and they insure for themselves the satisfaction that comes with knowing the life and purpose of their parish.

Coming Changes in Parish Life

As you may already know—or will soon learn—during the past year the leaders and members of Our Lady of the Rosary Parish have been seriously discussing their future. They have carefully managed their finances and parish life as their membership has declined. They have also used the recent Parish Planning Initiative to assess their viability. Their oversight of their resources and their care for the work of the Church has led them to request that the Archbishop consider their closing and merging with our parish. Before deciding he asked if they want to consider becoming a “mission church” of our parish.

They are now considering this option and responding to the Archbishop. Expect a decision in February or March. Next week, I’ll talk more about the idea of a “mission church” as well as the opportunities for the Church in this area.

The Constant Good of Carrying on the Conversation

My best teachers on the meaning and practice of “**fidelity**” defined it as “**staying with the conversation**”. As most of us know when we do it generally always takes us someplace good—even surprising.

As you read this report—and those yet to come—I ask you to speak with anyone of these parish members about your questions and concerns, your thoughts and feelings, and the fruit of your reflection and prayer.

Since October 2014 I have made it a priority to keep them as fully informed about the viability of our parish and actively engaged in planning for the future of our parish.

We want and need all parish members to be informed and engaged in the conversation. Pick one or two of these parish leaders whom you may know and keep the conversation going!

HOW SCARED SHOULD WE BE ABOUT ZIKA?

Every time there is a major infectious disease outbreak that scares us, government leaders, the public and the news media demand explanations, guidance and predictions, and often express indignation that not enough was done to prevent it.

Today everyone is asking about Zika: How did this crisis happen, and what do we need to do to make it go away?

Zika is here to stay; it will be part of life for many years to come. Even if we make vector control efforts a major initiative, it will only reduce, but not eliminate, the risk of Zika. What we need next, urgently, is a vaccine.

Until then,, we need to be aware of symptoms, diagnosis and treatment.

Symptoms:

Only 1 in 5 become ill

Fever, rash, joint pain or red eye are common

Symptoms last for several days to a week

Severe disease requiring hospitalization is uncommon

Death is rare

Diagnosis:

Disease spread through mosquitoes

Healthcare provider if you develop symptoms

Tell your provider when and where you have traveled.

Blood tests may be in order.

Treatment:

No vaccine or medications available

Get plenty of rest

Drink fluids to prevent dehydration

Take medicine such as Tylenol

Sacramental Anointing of the Sick

The Anointing of the Sick is the Sacrament through which Christ draws near to those who are sick to comfort them, give them confidence, forgiveness, and to strengthen them mentally, spiritually and emotionally in the face of illness. In celebrating the Sacrament of the Sick, the Church also prays for healing to the Lord who knows what we need and heals broken spirits.

The Sacrament powerfully demonstrates Jesus' presence among us as our Healer and Comforter. It is by anointing and the prayers of the Church that all those who are ill, facing surgery or enter into a state of declining health, can experience Jesus, the Divine Physician. Because of the special nature of the Sacrament, it may be received as often as needed. At Holy Name of Jesus we celebrate this Sacrament of Healing twice a month, after Mass on the First Saturday of the month and after the 8:00 AM Mass on the Third Sunday of the month. **Twice a year, we celebrate this sacrament during Mass. Our Next celebration of the Anointing of the Sick during Mass will be on February 21st at the 8:00 AM Eucharistic celebration.** We invite all those in need of God healing to join us on the 21st as our faith community pray with you and for you in this time of need.


