WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE CATHOLIC IN NORTH COUNTY?

About a year ago Archbishop Carlson addressed this question by speaking of the value and importance of our Church's "**ministry of presence**". In the Acts of the Apostles, St. Luke reveals that after the resurrection of Jesus the apostles publicly continued doing "*signs and wonders ... among the people*". In response, "*none of the others (disciples) dared to join them, but the people esteemed them*", and "*great numbers of men and women were added to them*". These early communities of faith remind us that their ministry of presence was fundamentally about first **imitating** the courage, compassion, and creativity of Jesus and them **worshipping** Jesus.

BEGINNING THIS WEEK THESE PARISH LEADERS from our parish will begin to meet with leaders from Our Lady of the Rosary Parish. Together we will be working out the details of the transition of their parish community into Holy Name of Jesus Parish and of the utilization of their parish church as a second worship site for our newly enlarged parish community. The outcomes of these meetings and of all future meetings will be published in both parish bulletins. Our Lady of the Rosary Parish will close on June 30th. They are planning their closing Mass for Sunday, June 26th. During this Easter Season let us all continue to pray for the grace and guidance of the Holy Spirit.

Throughout our history as a Church, every time we needed to re-organize, the challenge of the changes involved tested the faith of believers. Doubts about God being with us and unsureness about where change would lead us easily and often crept into their minds and hearts. Especially during the coming months and year ahead of us, open, honest, and positive communication about the needs of our members and the purpose of the Catholic Church in this part of North County will help to insure stronger faith and a sure sense of mission.

In the weeks ahead of us do not hesitate to let our parish leaders know what you think and feel, what you hope for or find yourself most concerned about. Talk with them about the progress they are making. No question or comment, no insight or idea, is ever too insignificant or unimportant to be talked about or further explored. In fact, as most of us know only too well, things often only get worse when we don't talk about them. Communication strengthens commitment. Based on the work Father Tim is doing with his parish leaders and on the suggestions we have made to them for these meetings, here are some of the highlights of the discussions beginning this week.

STAYING HYDRATED

Why is it so important to stay hydrated?

Our bodies depend on water to survive. Every cell, tissue, and organ in our bodies needs water/fluid balance to work correctly. Water is needed for good health.

Water makes up more than half of our body weight. We lose water each day when we go to the bathroom, sweat and even when we breathe. We lose more water even faster when the weather is really hot, we are physically active or we have a fever. If we don't replace the water we lose, we become dehydrated.

Symptoms of dehydration include sleepiness or fatigue, headache, confusion, dizziness or a lightheaded feeling, falls, dry mouth, or extreme thirst.

Don't wait until symptoms of dehydration are noticed to take action. Actively preventing dehydration by drinking plenty of water is the best way to start. Drinks like fruit and vegetable juices, milk, and herbal teas, contribute to the amount of water that can be gotten each day.

Purchasing water can be expensive and creates plastic bottle waste. Keep a reusable bottle of water handing during the day. Refill it from the tap as the bottle empties. Adding a slice of lemon or lime to the water makes it taste better as well.

There are different recommendations for daily water intake. Most people have been told to drink six to eight, eight-ounce glasses of water each day, which is a reasonable goal.




