Reporting on Our Parish Consolidation**GROWING TOGETHER AS A PARISH****IN HIS MARCH 7th LETTER TO FATHER TIM HENDERSON**, Archbishop

Carlson announced the closing of Our Lady of the Rosary Parish. He also offered the possibility of continuing to use the church for worship, presuming this could strengthen Holy Name of Jesus Parish as an evangelizing community of faith and service in this part of North County.

Today I'd like to begin reporting on the progress our parish leaders have made toward fulfilling **The Archbishop's Expectations**. These decisions and actions will enable us to plan more effectively for the consolidation of our parishes and to evaluate more carefully the need and value of a second worship site.

That the Parish Councils of both parishes begin to meet for the purpose of the pastoral planning that would enable an effective parish consolidation.

Holy Name of Jesus Parish will now encompass about 37 square miles south of the Missouri River to the St. Louis City limits — Spanish Lake, Bellefontaine Neighbors, Jennings, as well as smaller communities and neighborhoods.

Our Councils' first meeting focused on a weekend Mass schedule to best serve Catholics across this entire region. Issues of convenience, accessibility, affordability, and sufficient attendance for ministries and active participation were discussed. We gave careful attention to the personal and emotional challenges that change may well bring for every member of our new parish. Attention was also given to the call to be good stewards of parish resources. The consensus decision of all present was to schedule the 5:00pm Saturday and 8:00am Sunday Masses at the church on Ashbrook Drive and the 10:30am Sunday Mass at the second worship site on Bellefontaine Road.

This second worship site will be used for the Christ Light of the Nations school Mass, and could be used for funerals and weddings. Other uses and the weekday Mass schedule are still under consideration.

Our Councils have formed working groups to identify parishioners needing or assisting with pastoral care as well as to further develop our parish ministries, organizations, and activities. ***More about all this next week.***

That the Parish Finance Committees meet to finalize a comprehensive budget and a practical method for tracking the ongoing financial commitment of parishioners from Our Lady of the Rosary Parish for the use of their church as a second parish worship site.

A budget of \$122,000 has been finalized, including supplies, maintenance, and utilities as well as Archdiocesan assessments and 25% of the compensation and benefits of the Pastor and Director of Music. There are no significant capital improvements at this site in the foreseeable future.

Projected revenues to meet these expenses will depend on how many current members of Our Lady of the Rosary Parish choose to become members of Holy Name of Jesus Parish. A recent survey of those attending weekend Masses indicated these revenues could be generated by those intending to become members and those willing to give it a try. Using our current envelope system we will be able to track the financial commitment for a second worship site.

That a competent volunteer be found who would be responsible for the administration and maintenance required for the operation and use of the church as a second parish worship site.

Father Tim has recruited several persons to serve as onsite coordinators. He has informed them of their responsibilities and is now helping them learn more about their duties. Coordinating their work with our Parish Office and other parish ministries still needs to be worked out. ***More about this next week.***

**THE COURAGE TO LOVE**

This weekend thru April 30th / May 1st parish volunteers will be available in the Community Center before and after Mass to receive your gift or pledge in support of the Annual Catholic Appeal. I am grateful to **Bruce & Ginny Saak** for serving as **Coordinators** of the Appeal, and to the volunteers assisting them for the Appeal's success.

Our parish and our school benefit greatly from the Appeal—\$550,000 over the past 2 years alone. Our goal this year is \$54,953. We can do this, especially if you choose to increase your support by pledging your gift over several months or the entire year. We also have a **goal of 36 new donors**—members who have never participated in the Appeal, or who have not made a gift or pledge in the past 2 years.

Welcome to our parish this weekend **Mr. Paul Masek, the REAP Team Director with the Catholic Youth Apostolate.** Paul will speak at all our Masses about how the Appeal benefits this ministry of our Church, including the schools and youth ministry of our parish and Deanery.

The Appeal is an **effective form of revenue sharing among parishes**, insuring the social outreach, charitable, and educational ministries of the Catholic Church across the 11 counties of our Archdiocese.

GOOD VS. BAD CARBOHYDRATES

Carbs are an important part of your diet, but that doesn't mean we are free to load up on cakes and cookies to get your daily amount. We will try to explain the difference between good and bad carbs.

Carbs, are our body's primary energy source, and they're a crucial part of any healthy diet. Carbs should never be avoided, but it is important to understand that not all carbs are alike.

They can be either simple(bad) or complex (good) based on their chemical makeup and what your body does with them.

BAD carbs are composed of simple-to-digest, basic sugars with little real value for your body.

Fruits and vegetables are actually bad carbs -although they are drastically different from other foods in the category, like cookies and cakes.

Simple carbs to limit in your diet include: Soda, candy,,artificial,syrups,,sugar,,white rice,white bread, and white pasta, potatoes, pastries and desserts.

GOOD carbs are considered "good" because it takes our body long to break them down.

Picking good carbs over bad carbs is a matter of making some simple substitutions. Brown rice instead of white, whole wheat past instead of plain white.

The bottom line, be sensible about the carbs that are chosen. Focus on healthy whole grains, fruits and veggies.




