When called upon by the Vatican to preach the Gospel in foreign lands, they eagerly responded. This spirit brought them to mission in 27 countries, especially among the poor in Angola, Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Haiti, India, Madagascar, Myanmar, and the Philippines. With our cooperation and support, the Missionaries of LaSalette can continue to provide spiritual and financial assistance in these mission countries as they bring God’s reconciling message to the poor.

The Missionary Cooperation Plan is an initiative of the Society of the Propagation of the Faith in St. Louis. Civility & the Year of Mercy

Catholic Sensibility and American Politics

Is there such a thing as a **"Catholic sensibility"** about life and how it is to be lived? Certainly, our Catholic faith keeps us deeply tied to the rhythm of the seasons. The liturgical seasons and the seasons of the year go together in a natural progression. This, coupled with Catholics strong sense of family and place, offer a witness to our culture that there are things more important than money, careers, and possessions.

In the political realm, Catholics have many different views on issues, but there seems to be a **general habit of mind** that values **moderation, common sense and compassion**. These habits of mind don't make Catholics timid. Rather, their **advocacy** on behalf of the unborn and less fortunate tends to involve not so much condemnation but mercy and pleas for help. It is a kind of **political engagement** we need more of, if we want to bring the "Good News" of Christ into our political debates.

In the game of political debates it's common for a politician to attack an opponent's character rather than address the issue at hand. This isn't a proper form of debate, but rather a resort to a common logical fallacy - the **"ad hominem"** ("at the man") fallacy.

The next time you are watching a political debate, see if you can identify the **"ad hominem"** fallacy. As a Catholic what question would you ask that could refocus the conversation toward a more useful outcome than attacking the other person's character?



WATER: Reason to Drink More

No doubt about it; water is critical. In fact it makes up more than 2//3rds of our body weight. We have all heard that a diet high in fiber helps keep our systems “regular” however; a new study has found that keeping hydrated may be more important. Water keeps our bodies running. It helps regulate the body temperature, keeps joints cushioned, protects our spinal cord and other sensitive tissue and get rid of waste through sweating, etc. Here are a few more reasons to stay hydrated.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Last week's "Treasure" no doubt raised an eyebrow or two with the image of the deacons scurrying through the streets of Rome, or perhaps galloping on horseback, with fragments of eucharistic bread from the bishop's liturgy. These would be dropped into the chalice at outlying celebrations, presided over by presbyters, to express unity with the bishop, and perhaps also to remind the presbyters that they were not free agents. The Council of Laodicea forbade the custom of the *fermentum* in the year 348. Generally, one of the rules of interpreting law is that people don't make laws about things that aren't happening. So, by mid-fourth century, we have an important clue that what had once been a Roman custom had become widespread.

Interestingly, when the Church of England (and its related bodies) went through a liturgical renewal in the mid-nineteenth century, they reclaimed this custom from the mists of history. Today, it is the custom in some Anglican dioceses for a fragment of the host from the bishop's Holy Week liturgy (what we call the Chrism Mass) to be carried to every parish. On "Maundy Thursday" (our Holy Thursday), the fragment is dropped into the chalice to signify the parish's communion with the bishop. This modern revival of the *fermentum* is different from the "co-mingling" action we are used to, in which a fragment of the consecrated bread is dropped into the chalice just before Communion.
