




The Power of the Love of Jesus Christ

As Pastor and Coworker it is both with a sense of sadness and rejoicing that I have accepted the resignation of Sister Rose from our Pastoral Leadership Team. be a “prayerful” community, nourished and inspired through our celebrations of the sacraments. We are called to **Community**—to be a “gathered” and “gathering” community by the grace of God’s Holy Spirit. The more these characteristics are clearly evident in a person, a family, a community, the more certain we can be that we are experiencing and proclaiming the Reign of God—here and now. I am sure that I am not alone in thinking that we have grown to know and love Sister Rose for her continuing effort to cultivate these four virtues and for her faithful commitment to her religious community and our Church. So now let her own words speak to your mind and heart, recalling memories of the past, gratitude now, and hope for the future.

In the Old Testament Book of Ecclesiastes we read that there is a time for everything. And so, this is the time for me to be leaving my position as Pastoral Associate and Parish Nurse at Holy Name of Jesus.

For almost 19 years (8 years at Our Lady of Good Counsel and 11 at Holy Name of Jesus), I have been blest to minister with and to so many of you. We have laughed, cried, worried, prayed, worked, played, and even sometimes didn't even agree. But we kept on moving along trying do His work in North County here at Holy Name and even beyond. Because of my age (75), I knew it was time to “slow down” a bit, but was not sure what that would look like.

Early in June and again in mid-July, I was offered a positon at The Sarah Community. The position entails Mission Outreach and Spirituality. The Sarah Community is a continuum of care facility, meaning it encompasses independent living, assisted living, rehabilitation and skilling nursing. When offered the position, it felt like it was a wonderful fit and after praying and consulting with my superiors, I knew that I wanted to accept it.

My plan, at this time, is to continue worshipping at Holy Name of Jesus. I hope to be a “parishioner” in every sense of the word as my time and new position allows me.

I will be here until after the Health Fair on October 5th. I did have a vacation planned right after that, and will still continue with those plans. My nephew from England will come to visit toward the end of October and so I will start my new positon on November 1st. My heart is filled with gratitude for having come to know all of you. I am so blest for the richness of your lives.

TETANUS.....A MUST

Fall is just around the corner and many folks are outdoors working in their yards and gardens as the season is changing.

Tetanus is a disease caused by a bacterial infection which makes a toxin which causes sever muscle spasms. It, also called “lockjaw”, causes muscle spasms in your jaw and makes it hard to open your mouth. It can also make it difficult to swallow or breathe.

The tetanus bacteria are usually found in dirt and soil. The tetanus bacteria can enter the body through a wound or cut.

The disease is relatively rare. Usually a person should be immunized or have a booster every 10 years.

If you have a dirty wound or cut, get a tetanus vaccine as soon as possible if it has been 5 or more years since your last shot.

Tetanus symptoms occur slowly and progress over time which may range from days to months. In most cases, symptoms appear with 14 days. Remember tetanus is preventable! So check when your last tetanus vaccine was and make sure you are up-to-date with this vaccine and enjoy working and playing in the dirt this autumn.
