


A Stranger To No One

When I visit with families at the time of the death of a loved one it is not uncommon that they remember a parent or relative, a neighbor, co-worker, or friend as someone who “never knew a stranger”. Often I’ve thought there couldn’t be a finer tribute that a person might receive than this. So often as well the details of the person’s life being remembered actually map out how he or she went about this work of expanding the boundaries of love.

St. Paul today introduces us to the idea that the Christian life is one of continual growth in the love that creates such an inclusive community. And he reminds us that in doing so we have a foretaste of eternal life. St. Luke quite vividly portrays as well the important work and the potential outcomes of the rich and the poor simply noticing each other—much less learning how and being willing to interact. The consequences of not doing so pretty clear for all of us.

OUR “CATHOLIC” COMMITMENT Every effort on our part to expand the boundaries of love fulfills our Christian calling to be “catholic”—that is, more and more “universal” in our love for all others—any time, any where. I thank God today for an evidence of this kind of love in the reported summary of the success of the Annual Catholic Appeal again this year in our parish. The consolidated results of the Appeal were reported in *The St. Louis Review* last week. Today’s bulletin summarizes these results for both Holy Name of Jesus and Our Lady of the Rosary parishes now in the process of becoming one parish community of faith.

By design this annual Appeal in our Archdiocese strives to address a wide range of pastoral, social, educational, and charitable needs that no one parish alone would ever be able to manage. But together our effort are always more powerful and promising. Any kind of consolidated effort will often bring about a stronger commitment. As a parish I believe that the generosity of our members is an evidence of our present commitment and hope for the future.

As I have noted here before the ACA is an **annual campaign** helping parishes, families, and individuals with immediate needs. The *Beyond Sunday* campaign now underway in our parish is an **extraordinary campaign** designed to support our parish community and to ensure affordable, quality Catholic school across the Archdiocese. I ask for your prayers, I encourage you to discuss, and I invite your continuing generosity that we can sustain our ordinary parish and annual giving, and be successful in achieving these extraordinary goals for the future.

For months we have been on the campaign trail, listening and reading the messages of all those hoping to become the president of the U.S. We soon learned the challenges we must face in the upcoming November elections.

The divisions and crises are very evident, and we are called and sent to address them with audacity and hope.

The burning of fossil fuels for energy has caused pollution of the air, raised sea levels, brought on the extinction of many of God's creatures, and threatened the lives and livelihoods of many people. Our lifestyles have led to destruction rather than the sustaining of life. Policy change is vital to our future. Let us look for moral and political leadership committed to:

- Transitioning from fossil fuel dependency to renewable energy sources;
- Honoring the emissions-reduction commitments the U.S. made at the U.N. Conference on Climate Change.


