


## **We Are a Mission Parish ... With a Mission**

Several times this year I've been asked, "How big is our parish?" Somewhat understandably, my response often has drawn an expression of surprise.

"We have 66,000 parish members. Of this number 1,720 are registered parishioners." Some were curious about our geographic size. "We serve multiple local communities in a 34-square mile service area." Even not knowing these numbers many already understand the challenge of our mission: "More than 26% of our parish members have a poverty level income."

This simple question – "How big is our parish?" – is my opportunity to explain something most of us were not taught well enough growing up as Catholics. Theologically, and in the canon law of our Church, "**parish membership**" is defined as the entire population living within the geographic area of a parish's boundaries. The members who are baptized Catholic have both a mission to strengthen and support each other and a mission to reach out and evangelize every person living in the communities where they live. We are called to be "good news" for each other and for everyone of our parish members.

If this seems overwhelming, consider this. Within the first 70 years following the death and resurrection of Jesus, an estimated 1 million Christians lived in the Roman empire (all territories around and beyond the Mediterranean Sea). We are here today because 0.6 % of a total 181 million population continued to actively live out the teaching and ministry of Jesus. Currently the baptized members of our parish represent 2.6 % of our total parish population.




***Every year these 90 days of the Lenten-Easter season call us to both personal and communal conversion. I trust that each of us individually has by now taken up the Ash Wednesday invitation to "Repent, and believe the Good News!"***

As we continue the work of reviewing and strengthening our parish viability, I also invite everyone to participate in the communal work of conversion now underway. In today's bulletin you'll find several ways you can participate. I wholeheartedly encourage you to do so. As you do, prayerfully consider one of our Church's most recent statements below on what a parish should be. Our very existence here today as a parish is a testament to the life, work, and faith of the early Church as well as generations of Catholics before us.

## **A Vision for All Parishes in the United States**

Shortly before coming to St. Louis in January 1999, St. John Paul II as Pope wrote about the Church in America. He said, "*The parish is a privileged place where the faithful concretely experience the Church.*" In addition, he wrote that "*The parish needs to be constantly renewed on the basis of the principle that 'the parish must continue to be above all a Eucharistic community'.* This principle implies that parishes are called to be:

- *welcoming and fraternal,*
- *places of Christian initiation, of education, and celebration of the faith,*
- *open to the full range of charisms, services, and ministries,*
- *organized in a communal and responsible way,*
- *capable of utilizing existing movements of the apostolate,*
- *attentive to the cultural diversity of the people,*
- *open to pastoral projects which go beyond the individual parish, and*
- *alert to the world in which they live."*

## Holy Name of Jesus Parish Viability Survey

### Called To Be One - In The Name of Jesus

#### Reflecting On and Evaluating Our Experience

Last year Archbishop Carlson requested that we evaluate and inform him as to whether his hopes and expectations for the closing of Our Lady of the Rosary Parish and consolidation with Holy Name of Jesus Parish - including the use of the church as a second parish worship site - were being achieved.

He expressed his expectations in a March 2016 letter to Fr. Tim Henderson. His hopes - in the form of the following questions - are the basis for our reflection and evaluation for the sake of planning for the coming year.

- Has the consolidation promoted sufficient **participation** of parish members and their **financial support** for a **united vibrant parish community** that would carry forward the mission of Jesus Christ and the Catholic Church in the territory of Holy Name of Jesus Parish?
- To what extent have **representative parish leaders** come forward from the Our Lady of the Rosary community to **promote and sustain the commitment** of their members to the newly expanded parish community?
- Are there **sufficient volunteers** to assist Father Henning with his administrative responsibilities as Pastor for the maintenance, operation, and ongoing capital improvement needs of a second worship site?

#### Activities Now Underway or Coming Up

The work of reflecting on these questions, evaluating our parish viability, and reporting our recommendations to the Archbishop is now underway.

**Interviews With Key Parish Leaders and Volunteers** - Pastoral Council members are now talking with 23 individuals identified by our Pastoral Leadership Team concerning their experience over the past 12 months.

**Parish Viability Surveys** - Through our bulletin every parishioner will have the opportunity to honestly reflect on their commitment and experience of parish life over the past 8 months.

**Town Hall Meeting** - Parishioners are invited to attend this meeting on Sunday, **March 26<sup>th</sup>, 1:00 – 2:30pm** in the **Parish Community Center**. To the extent possible interview and survey results will be reported. Concerns and hopes for the future will also be shared and discussed.

**Assembly of Parish Leaders** - Sometime in April parish leaders will meet to discuss the outcomes of these activities and formulate recommendations for Father Mike. He will then inform Archbishop Carlson of our plans for the future and request our Finance Committee and Pastoral Council begin to prepare our budget for the coming year with these considerations in mind.

**Tear Out & Return Your Survey** - Everyone has **7 days** to complete this survey. You can return it in the Collection Basket (this week or next weekend); by dropping off at the Parish Office; or by mail.
