RISING TO THE CHALLENGE

Late last week Archbishop Carlson informed me that with one modification he has accepted my recommendations concerning the future use of the Chapel of Our Lady as a worship site for our parish and school. He also affirmed and will pray for our continuing efforts to form a unified and viable parish.

Today's bulletin generally summarizes the work we began last February to review our parish viability and our use of the Chapel. For many reasons and in a number of ways this has been a challenge for many of us. I am grateful for the work and support of our parish leaders in this process. May the Spirit of Christ, our healing and our hope, continue to enliven us all for the work of the Church that has been entrusted to our parish. Therefore, with the support of the Archbishop:

We will continue to use the Chapel as a worship site for our parish through the **Feast of the Holy Family** (December 30th/31st), and will then begin celebrating all weekend Masses at our parish church on the **Feast of the Epiphany** (January 6th/7th). We will continue to use the Chapel for our school through

May 2018, working out a final decision after the continuing work on the reorganization of Catholic schools in our Deanery has been completed.

Again I thank our parish leaders for their work on this review and for their support. I thank our parishioners who participated in it. I ask everyone for your continuing prayers for me.

I've told the story before of my niece Kaitlyn's track and field achievements. When I asked her for the secret behind her high jumping ability, she told me. Everyday at practice, before the end of our workout, I would always raise the bar one inch higher. *"Some days I clear it. No sweat! Others, I'm weighed down by the temptation to think it can't be done."* It may now be time once again to raise the bar.

For the early Church, Jesus' two great commandments were the new measure of the height of the bar we are striving to achieve - the Reign of God here and now. Knowing we belong to Jesus Christ and resisting the temptation to say it can't be done, may the Spirit help us to become all the more the sacrament of the love of God - here and now!


A Parable of Hopeful Bystanders

In some sense, we are always facing the end of the world. But Christians face crises with optimism. They don't just hope that things will turn out all right. They have complete trust in the truth of God's plan and the role humans have to play in it.

In Houston, as the flood waters rose, an elderly man was trapped inside his truck as the deluge threatened to sweep it away. A group of bystanders saw him, only minutes from drowning, but found they had no rope with which to free him. Instead of despairing, they did what they could with what they had - linking arms to form a human chain, risking their lives and using their collective strength to pull a stranger to safety. Hurricane Harvey was a national tragedy, but in its wake, in these moments of heroism, it offers us a modern parable.

Every day presents us with a collective opportunity to use our gifts - which do not belong to us - to reveal the Reign of God, one scene at a time.

PARISH VIABILITY & CHAPEL REVIEW

This review focused on Archbishop Carlson’s expressed hope that the closing and consolidation of Our Lady of the Rosary Parish would “promote a united vibrant parish carrying forward the mission of the Catholic Church”. We considered the characteristics of parish “vitality” and “stability” from our 2015 parish assessment process as well as the specific conditions for the continuing use of the church as a parish worship site.

ASSESSMENT SURVEYS & INTERVIEWS

Parish Pastoral Council members interviewed 23 key parish leaders and volunteers, and 80 written surveys on parish viability were returned from parish leaders and parishioners. These interviews and surveys revealed that the consolidation was for some but not for other bringing about a more vibrant, unified parish.

TOWN HALL MEETING

Parishioners (60 – 70) gathered to share their recent experience of parish life; to make parish leaders aware of their commitment to sustaining parish viability and the work of the Church in our community; and to express their hopes and concerns for the future. This was a positive meeting, though greater attention could have been given to preparation and sharing information later published in the bulletin as well as to eliciting the questions and concerns later expressed by some in attendance.

ASSEMBLY OF PARISH LEADERS

Parish leaders (14 of 23) gathered for 3 hours for the purpose of discussing what is and what is not working concerning parish viability and the continuing use of the Chapel as a parish worship site. They also began discussion of areas of commitment needing our attention and effort to develop goals and action steps.

Based on the results of interviews and surveys as well as their experience of the town hall meeting, our parish leaders developed this statement:

“Holy Name of Jesus will remain viable as a parish with a full-time pastor for the next 10 years, if we continue to develop and sustain a focus on stewardship and mission. In light of this we will consolidate our worship site to the parish church on Ashbrook Drive.”

After a difficult and honest attempt to reach consensus proved unsuccessful, parish leaders supported Father Mike deciding the issue with 8 of 14 indicating that they could support the statement above.

CONSULTATIONS & RECOMMENDATIONS

During the spring and summer, Father Mike met with our Pastoral Leadership Team and our Finance Committee, affirming his commitment to parish viability and to the mission of our parish in North County. Before finalizing his report to the Archbishop, he discussed with them and refined these proposed recommendations:

I recommend continuing to use the Chapel for Sunday Mass through November 26th, 2017, the Feast of Christ the King.

I recommend continuing to use the Chapel for School Liturgies through June 1st, 2018.

The report was reviewed by parish leaders, then sent to the Archbishop and made available to parishioners. The report concludes with a request for commitment and support from the Archbishop, from parish leaders, and from our parishioners.

Over the course of the summer Father Mike also met twice with Archbishop Carlson who requested more information and some clarifications for meetings with his advisors. Father Mike provided a second report more specifically focused on parish finances and planning for the future of our parish.

After consultation with his advisors Archbishop Carlson informed Father Mike on October 27th of his decision, with encouragement for our parish life and welfare.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

What is the name of the pope’s cathedral? If you said the Vatican, or St. Peter’s, you were off by a few miles, since the answer is the Basilica of St. John, the Lateran, the “Mother Church” of all the churches of the world and the cathedral of the Diocese of Rome. It takes its name from the Lateran family, the Trumps of their day, who somehow ran afoul of the Emperor Nero. He seized all their property, including their vast Roman palace and estate. We don’t know how Plautius displeased Nero so badly, but eventually all the Lateran property came to Constantine, the first Christian emperor, through his wife, Fausta. Early in the fourth century, when Christianity was at last legalized, Constantine gave the property to the church. Soon the great meeting halls were expanded and adapted.

Over the centuries, the church building has been sacked by armies, ruined by fire, torn down, and rebuilt. The oldest and most unchanged part of the Lateran is a vast, separate baptistery with steps leading down to a huge green basalt pool. Imagine what a triumphal moment the dedication of this public church building was for a community that had worshiped in secret for so long! This Thursday’s feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica is really about the tradition of consecrating space for worship, and so by extension, a feast for your parish church building and, given the beautiful second reading, for its baptistery as well.




