



Catholic Schools Learn. Serve. Lead. Succeed.

In April 2017 Archbishop Carlson accepted these recommendations of the Archdiocesan Board of Catholic Education:

- ◆ St. Ferdinand, St. Norbert, and St. Rose Philippine Duchesne parish schools will **establish a formal partnership** for the 2018-2019 school year.
- ◆ The parish schools of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Blessed Teresa of Calcutta, and Holy Name of Jesus (Christ Light of the Nations) will **continue strategic planning for the future**.
- ◆ The **position of Director of North County Schools was created** to focus on planning and cooperation among the Catholic elementary schools of the Deanery.
- ◆ A **\$100,000 Beyond Sunday grant will be shared by the elementary schools of the Deanery** to enhance the quality of their educational and religious education programs.

In September the **North County Deanery** expanded from 10 to 17 parishes and 3 schools joined the **Federation of Catholic Schools in North County** - the organization of parishes working together for the strength of Catholic elementary schools since 2010.

Summary of Statement on Christ Light of the Nations School

We Are Called to Share the Joy of the Gospel

In November Father Mike and Sister Mary met with Archdiocesan leaders to review and reconfirm the partnership that has been in place for the past 12 years between Christ Light of the Nations School and the Archdiocesan Catholic Education Office.

Our parish remains committed to the school's current strategic plan, including financial and pastoral support for the 2018-2019 school year. Our parish leaders are also committed to the **parish pastoral priorities** that affect the mission and operation of our school. In particular, to **organizing the stewardship of parish resources** and to **establishing partnerships that enable parish outreach to the community we are here to serve**. While our school is not the only apostolic work of the parish, our collaboration with the Catholic Education Office is one of the parish's most productive and effective partnerships since being established in 2005.

Through the Catholic Education Office the Archdiocese is committed to the future of our parish Catholic school and to the mission of Catholic education in our community. As we continue to build a strong network of Catholic schools in the North County Deanery, the Education Office will partner with our parish in reviewing and revising the strategic plan for Christ Light of the Nations School.

The past 12 years have challenged us to re-envision the importance of our school and the opportunity we have through our school to fulfill the evangelizing mission of our parish and our Church. I am deeply grateful for the work of so many who have so faithfully and generously committed themselves to the life and work of our school. May the Spirit of Christ continue to enlighten and enliven our hope for the future.

Christ Light of the Nations School: 2017-2018

SCHOOL COMMUNITY

Our school's Pre-K through 8th Grade program now serves 164 students (121 families) of whom 23% (39) are Catholic and 77% (125) are Non-Catholic. Twenty-eight (28) students are children of Catholic families registered in our parish. In addition, our school's ethnic diversity includes African American (133), Caucasian (25), Hispanic (3), and Bi-Racial (3) students. These students and their families are served by 26 faculty and staff - 4 administrators, 19 in teaching and formation, and 3 in special services (speech and language therapy, counseling, and social work).

FUNDING - TUITION, SCHOLARSHIPS & GRANTS

This year tuition revenues are expected to account for \$698,593. Tuition varies for families of 1 to 3+ students, ranging from \$4,690 - \$6,179 for parishioners and from \$5,641 - \$7,464 for non-parishioners. The actual cost per student this year is \$9,524. Also, 124 students (76%) are receiving \$183,339 Scholarship assistance, primarily from *Beyond Sunday* and *Alive in Christ* - funds collected from all parishes of the Archdiocese. Finally, we have received grants from the Annual Catholic Appeal (\$530,000) and the Archdiocesan Emergency Fund (\$30,000).



President's State of the School Report

In September 2017, Sister Karl Mary Winkelmann gave the following report to Trinity parents as well as to the pastors and principles of the Deanery on the life and welfare of Trinity Catholic High School.

SCHOOL COMMUNITY - For the 2017-2018 school year 338 students (303 families) are enrolled representing a 21% increase (31 students) over the past two years - the 2nd largest high school enrollment increase in the Archdiocese. Thanks to the support of Archbishop Carlson, the Jack Taylor Family, and the Roman Catholic Foundation we believe these enrollment trends will continue to grow. Trinity proudly supports and serves a diverse school community of students who are African American (59%), Caucasian (31%), of non-Catholic faith traditions (54%), and of students challenged by learning needs ((27%). Students come from Catholic elementary schools (62%), Christian/Private schools (7%), and Public Schools (31%). There are 43 people on the Administrative/Professional/Support staff; and a Student/Staff Ratio of 9:1.

TUITION & SCHOLARSHIPS - For the current school year the actual cost of educating each student amounts to \$12,500, with every student receiving financial assistance ranging from \$500 to \$4,000. Every student pays tuition which includes the cost of textbooks: \$9,580 (Catholic) and \$10,155 (Non-Catholic). There are no discounts for families with 2 or more students.

CURRICULUM - Comprehensive and college preparatory with multi-tiered instruction designed to meet a wide range of student abilities, interests, and career goals. The curriculum challenges students of all abilities, and prepares them for post-secondary education.

COLLEGE CREDIT - 58 hours offered through partnership with St. Louis University, university of Missouri-St. Louis, and Missouri Baptist University.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENT - Among the highest in the St. Louis area: 31 credits, 10 of which are obtained through dynamic, elective courses.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE - ACT scores average 24 and 28 for honor students. Also, 2017 State Champions in WYSE Computer Science and in WYSE Engineering Graphics, and 3rd place in State at WYSE Math Contest. For the past 14 years students have qualified for the WYSE State competitions; were twice the Boeing Engineering State Champions; in 2012 were St. Louis University BEAM State Champions; and in 2015 & 2016 State & Grand Champions at the Missouri Technology & Engineering Challenge.

ATHLETIC LEGACY - Over the years students who have attended Mercy, Aquinas, and Rosary High Schools as well as Trinity during the past 14 years have achieved 37 District Titles and 8 State Finals in the competitive sports programs offered for students.
