

LENTEN OBSERVANCE AND RESOURCES—ARCHDIOCESE OF ST. LOUIS

The Blessing of Ashes should take place within the celebration of the Mass or a scheduled service consisting of at least an appointed Scripture reading and a brief homily stressing the meaning of the ashes as a symbol of penance and self-denial. Please refer to the *Book of Blessing* for additional information that will be of assistance to you in this matter.

In the case of genuine pastoral necessity, Archbishop Carlson has given permission for lay ministers (for example, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion) to assist the priest and deacon in the distribution of the blessed ashes.

The Blessing of the Ashes is reserved to the priest or deacon, and priests and deacons should participate in the distribution of the ashes, whenever possible. They are the primary ministers of the ritual.

ARCHDIOCESAN LENTEN REGULATIONS

“For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him.”

(John 3:16-17)

The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics, so that we too might have Eternal life. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

Ash Wednesday (Wednesday February 14, 2018) and Good Friday (March 30, 2018) are days of **abstinence** for all Catholics **over the age of 14**. On these two days, **fast**, as well as **abstinence**, is also obligatory for those **from the ages of 18-59**. Abstinence means refraining from meat. Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.

All Fridays in Lent are days of **abstinence** from meat. Here again Catholics will not hold themselves lightly excused, but if there is a serious health problem, this obligation would not apply.

We should strive to make all days of Lent a time of prayer and penance. Following are several resources that can aid in finding different forms of prayer an

Lent is a Season of reflection, penance, fasting, and service. May the Lord strengthen you as you continue to share this message with your parishioners. Be assured of my prayers for both you and the people in your parish throughout this Lenten Season.

LITURGY MEETING OF 1-23-18:

Ash Wednesday/Lent: This is 2-14-18 this year. School Mass will be at 8:00 am at the Chapel presided over by Father Ray. Parish Masses will be at 9:00 am and 7:00 pm at the Parish Church presided over by Father Mike. Stations of the Cross will be offered every Friday during Lent at 7:00 pm. We have no RCIA candidates this year. The cycle B readings will be used exclusively during Lent.

Lenten Reconciliation Service: The exact date must be confirmed with Father Mike. He had suggested a Sunday afternoon. The committee suggested either 3-4-18 or 3-11-18.

Holy Week: Palm Sunday masses will be the weekend of 3-24-18 and 3-25-18. We will discuss more regarding Holy Week liturgies at the next meeting.

Liturgical Procedures: Deacon George gave everyone a handout regarding the proper cleansing of the cups and ciboriums used at mass. This information was also provided to all Eucharistic ministers. It details what the priest/deacon should be doing, and what the ministers are allowed to do.

Regarding any ministries, Deacon George pointed out that people should do what they are comfortable doing. Don't be discouraged by physical limitations (steps for example). We can work around those issues.

Servers: Our biggest problem is that we do not have enough servers. It was mentioned to ask the students at Christ Light if any of them would be interested in joining the servers group. Perhaps our lack of volunteers for serving, reading, or being a Eucharistic minister is that people are waiting to be asked.

Adult Education Sessions: Deacon George is considering offering a 3-part study on the sacrament of reconciliation. This is still under consideration, but possible dates would be 2-18-18, 3-6-18, and 3-13-18.

We discussed the possibility of implementing a monthly question and answer session. Deacon George will need to address this issue with Father Mike and Deacon Matt.

Deacon George is also considering showing the movie Joshua. It concerns Jesus coming back in modern times. Anyone interested would then have opportunities to reflect on and discuss this movie at later discussion gatherings.


Transportation: Is anyone responsible for arranging rides to mass for those who do not drive? This is something we will need to ask Father Mike about.

Breaking Bread Books: There are apparently a couple boxes of the Breaking Bread books that were never distributed at the Chapel. Sister Mary asked if the students could use these. Everyone agreed that it is a waste to simply have them sitting in boxes. Certainly the students may use them.

Next Meeting: The next meeting will be on 2-27-18.


