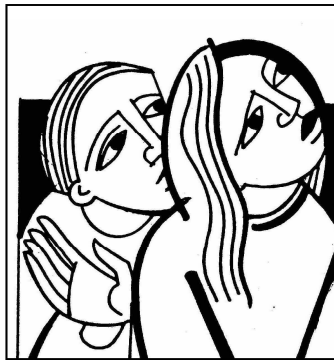

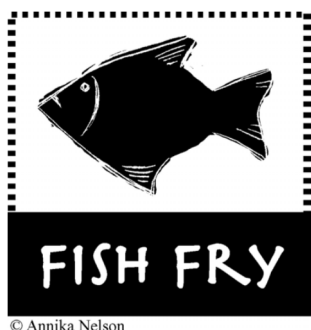

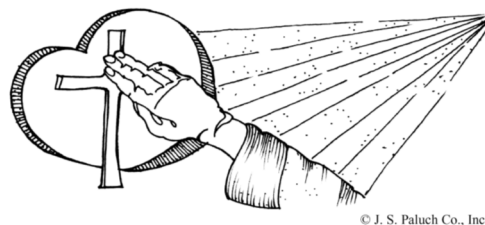

Anointing of the Sick:

"Is any among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of faith will save the sick man, and the Lord will raise him up; and if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven."

-James 5:14-15

Throughout his public ministry, Jesus healed the sick both physically and spiritually. The apostles continued this ministry and handed it on to their successors. For 2,000 years, the Church has continued Jesus' ministry of healing through the **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick**.

At Holy Name of Jesus we offer this sacrament on the First Saturday (following Mass) and the Third Sunday (following 10:30 AM Mass). Because of the communal nature of this Sacrament of Healing, we also celebrate the **Anointing of the Sick**, during Mass, twice a year. The next communal celebration will be **March 18 during 10:30 AM Mass**.

This Sacrament is a sacrament of healing and so is for anyone who has a chronic, serious illness, anyone preparing for surgery, or anyone suffering from the effects of advanced age.

We invite all in the parish who could receive benefit and grace from this sacrament to join us on March 18th as we pray with and for each other, asking God's healing, comfort and peace for all you receive the sacrament.

CONGRATULATIONS!

February Liturgy Committee Notes:

Palm Sunday: Set up for the Blessing of Palm: Judy Mantych on Saturday 3-24-18; Anne Schwanz on Sunday 3-25-18 for 8:00 am mass; and Deacon George on Sunday for 10:30 mass. The celebration will begin outside. Theresa McWilliams asked Deacon George to please remind the congregation to bring their "Breaking Bread" books outside as a couple of the songs to be used will be found in that book.

Triduum: The liturgy on Holy Thursday (3-29-18) will begin at 7:00 pm. Good Friday (3-30-18) services will begin at 7:00 pm. The Holy Saturday (3-31-18) liturgy will begin at 8:00 pm. Masses on Easter will be at 8:00 am and 10:30 am. We are currently seeking people to more actively participate in these liturgies by volunteering for some of the functions (oil bearers, foot washing, and Eucharistic ministers).

Karen Kulla ordered the flowers for Easter. They will be delivered on Holy Thursday. Deacon George will send a copy of the Passion for Palm Sunday and the Passion for Good Friday to Joan Aslin so that she can get copies to the readers. We could use a volunteer to prepare the fire pit on Holy Saturday.

Liturgical Calendar: Deacon George is in the process of preparing the calendar for the coming year. Most of the dates, times, and celebrations are in place. A few details will need to be added.

Adult Education: The communal penance service and the educational series on reconciliation tentatively scheduled for this Lenten season have been canceled. Deacon George is still planning to show the movie "Joshua" followed by other evenings to discuss the movie. This is tentatively scheduled for some time in May. The Q&A sessions are still being considered; nothing is definite yet.

Ministry Sign Up: Everyone agrees that we need more volunteers for various ministries. In conjunction with that, Deacon George is planning a "Formation for Eucharistic Ministers" in order to train new people and as a refresher for current ministers.

Theresa McWilliams reported that the parish leadership team considered having representatives from various ministries make a plea for help during the weekend masses. A personal invitation is probably the best way to encourage people to volunteer for various ministries, and doughnut Sunday is a good time to use this approach.

Next Meeting: The next meeting will be on 4-24-18.
